Our division is the oldest of all the divisions of FDNY Retired, one of nine divisions located in Florida and one of twenty six divisions scattered across the United States. We welcome all FDNY retirees, of all ranks, retired volunteer firefighters from all other municipalities and non-firefighters to join us in friendship and brotherhood as members of our proud organization.

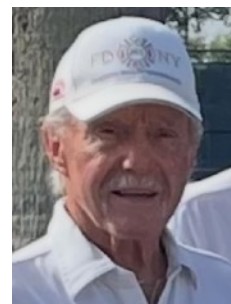

ENDING THE YEAR WITH THE RIGHT STUFF...GRADUATIONS AND PROMOTIONS!

On Thursday, December 18th, the FDNY Foundation joined the FDNY for a graduation ceremony at St. John's University in Queens, for 74 FDNY Paramedics who graduated from the Paramedic Basic program.

The FDNY Foundation congratulates all 74 paramedics on their graduation! This is a tremendous accomplishment for them and their families. We wish them continued success and thank them for their service and commitment to protecting the people and City of New York and proudly representing the FDNY.

"Today is the culmination of months of intense training, long hours of study and unwavering commitment. You have earned your place among the very best in emergency medical care," FDNY Commissioner Robert S. Tucker said. "Choosing to become an FDNY paramedic is choosing a life of service. You have committed yourself to answering the call at any hour, in any condition, at the most difficult moments in a person's life. You will meet New Yorkers on their worst day—and your calm, skill and professionalism will make all the difference. Your training has prepared you for the challenge, but it is your character, your empathy, your professionalism, and your teamwork that will define you."

The graduates trained for 11 months at the EMS Academy at Fort Totten, at hospitals on clinical internships, and in field rotations. Paramedics have extensive training in anatomy and physiology, biochemistry and pharmacology, as well as many critical lifesaving skills.



On Monday, December 22nd, the FDNY Foundation joined the FDNY for a promotion ceremony for 97 FDNY Officers at the College of Staten Island. These 97 members were promoted to the ranks of: Assistant Chief, Deputy Assistant Chief, Deputy Chief, Battalion Chief, Captain and Lieutenant.

"Promotions are great days in the FDNY," Acting FDNY Commissioner Mark Guerra said. "It's a big deal to be promoted in the FDNY. I want to thank you all for stepping up—taking on that new leadership role."

Chief of Department John Esposito said: "Promotion is a reflection of the hard work each of you have displayed throughout your careers. Many of you are already officers moving to the next rank. Whether you're a firefighter or an assistant chief, leadership is more than a rank or title. It's a responsibility you accept every time you start your tour. Our Department's legacy was built on the leaders before us. It's now your responsibility to carry that forward."

LATEST NYC ELECTIONS BRING CHANGE TO THE FDNY

New York City Mayor-elect Zohran Mamdani selected retired **FDNY EMS Chief Lillian Bonsignore** as the new Fire Commissioner, making her the second woman to hold the position, a choice that drew both praise for her extensive experience and criticism from figures like Elon Musk, to which Mamdani responded by emphasizing her crisis leadership and deep roots in emergency medical services.

The mayor-elect made the announcement on Tuesday at Fort Totten in Queens, home of the FDNY EMS Academy. "They deserve a leader who cares about their work because she did it herself, who understands every detail and will fight tirelessly to empower FDNY and make it the best firefighting force in the world," Mamdani said.

Bonsignore was appointed Chief of EMS Academy at Fort Totten in 2016, and served as Chief of Ems Operations from 2019 - 2020. Although she never served as a firefighter, she is confident that it won't matter.

"I know the job. I know what the firefighters need, and I know what the EMS needs," Bonsignore said.

During the interim days before the official swearing in of the new mayor, First Deputy Commissioner Mark Guerra was appointed to Fire Commissioner by Mayor Eric Adams. Commissioner Guerra will maintain that role until the new mayor takes office.

Bonsignore led EMS Operations during the COVID Pandemic. She is the first openly gay FDNY Fire Commissioner and only the second woman to lead the department. She is the first woman to achieve a 4-star rank in FDNY history.

More Changes coming to New York City...End of the Line for the MetroCard

It's almost time to say Goodbye to the NYC Metro Card! The NYC MetroCard is ending: the last day to buy or refill any MetroCard was December 31, 2025. The MTA is fully transitioning to the new OMNY contactless tap-to-pay system.

Here's what you should know if you are using the NYC transit system:

Current MetroCards may be used until their funds run out. You may also transfer balances to OMNY.

OMNY: This is a tap-to-pay system. Just tap your contactless credit/debit card, phone (Apple Pay, Google Pay) or buy a physical OMNY card (cost is \$1.00) from vending machines or retailers. Get used to tapping as the OMNY systems will become the only options for riders.

What people are saying: Folks all over are waxing nostalgic about the demise of the MetroCard. Many began collecting used cards for their advertising on the back. "I started to collect them after my younger son mentioned the advertisements. It had an ad for 1-800-Mattress," said collector Lev Radin, recalling the long ago-limited edition card for the defunct bedding company. Many sets of "Branded" MetroCards have been distributed over the decades including five that celebrated the New York Rangers 1994 Stanley Cup, a Modell's-sponsored version given to fans at Yankee Stadium in 1997 for the first subway series game, one from 2000 promoting the Mostly Mozart and Lincoln Center Festivals and a 2022 commemorative card that was available at four Brooklyn stations for The Notorious B.I.G.'s 50th birthday.

In a fitting send-off for the MetroCard, a curated exhibit about the card is on display at the NYC Transit Museum in Downtown Brooklyn. Curator, Jodi Shapiro (pictured below) states, "New Yorkers really don't like change, but they accept change and then they come to love change. I think MetroCard is a symbol of that, as the token was." The exhibit is called: **FAREWELL: MetroCard**



Times Square has a dazzling new ball for the New Year's Eve drop — and it's the biggest yet

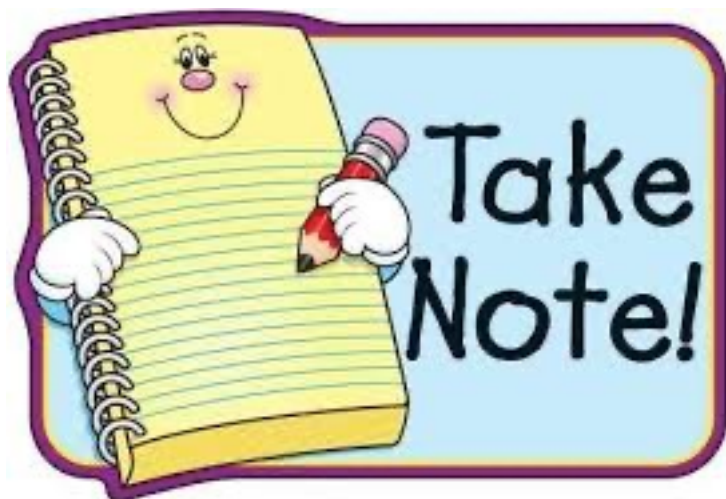
It's out with the old and in with the new in Times Square this year as the famous New Year's Eve ball drop rings in 2026 with a dazzling new ball — the largest in the history of an event that started in 1907.

The Constellation Ball, as it has been named, is the ninth ball to usher in the new year at the famous Midtown Manhattan intersection. It measures 12.5 feet in diameter and weighs just over 12,000 pounds. The ball features 5,280 circular Waterford crystals in three different sizes — 1.5-inch,



3-inch and 4-inch — as well as LED light pucks. The shape of the crystals is a departure from the triangular ones seen on previous balls since 1999.

2026 will mark the first time that the Times Square ball will drop twice! Once as usual on New Year's Eve, and the second drop will be on July 3, 2026. The occasion? Celebrating our country's 250th birthday! So, if you don't fancy standing out all night long in December, you have the chance to celebrate in the warmer weather this year! Happy New Year and Happy Birthday America!
