



CCEMCA BY Maintenance Thoughts

RV-electricity - "Time to check the water heater anode rod" by Mike Sokol



What's this anode thing?

Well, it's technically called a sacrificial anode because its job is to sacrifice itself to protect the metal parts of your RV (and home) electric water heater




from corrosion. It's a long metal rod made of aluminum or magnesium that extends into the interior of the tank.

This is needed because any two dissimilar metals in an electrolyte (even potable water) will act like a battery. And that small DC current is enough to start forming ions and leaching them away from your important metallic bits inside of your water heater. Without an anode your electrical water heater tank would fall apart in a few years.

What is the job of the anode?

It "takes one for the team," as it were. As you can see in the diagram, there's an anode (the sacrificial one) and the cathode (all the other metal



parts. The anode provides the source of ions rather than your metal tank. This diverts the corrosion effect away from your metal tank parts, and corrodes itself.

After several years (depending on how much it's

used) this sacrificial "anode" actually sacrifices itself and turns into a shadow of its former self.

How will I know it's time to be replaced?



You'll know it when you see it, since most of the anode will be eaten away. But most manufacturers recommend checking and replacing one

every three years.

However, they're cheap enough that if you take it apart this spring, I would simply replace it even if the element isn't too corroded. "An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure." Here's one that my son just pulled out of his residential water heater. Looks like a swarm of angry termites chomped on it...

Can I replace one myself?

Next, make sure you have the right tools. The same multi-tool socket that I recommended for changing your water heater's electric element will usually work on the anode as well, but check to be sure.

So, go ahead and start gathering your tools right now. Don't wait until the Friday before your Saturday camping trip to start on it. That's just asking for trouble...

Don't over-torque it!

Remember, the replacement anode should have a gasket or use Teflon tape, and it will have a recommended tightening torque. Don't overdo it, lest you break something expensive. And be sure to fill up with water and check for leaks BEFORE you pull out for your first trip. A leak is easy to fix in your driveway, but not so easy while camped far away from civilization.

OK, everyone. Remember that electricity is a useful and powerful force, so we all need to pay attention to safety precautions while using it.

Let's play safe out there....



Now that the weather is starting to warm, it's time for barbecue. Do you love barbecue? I certainly do. Having lived in California, Texas, and



These Carolina Pork Sliders with Sweet Coleslaw are my version of a Carolina-style barbecue sandwich. Using leftover pork roast, a vinegar-based barbecue sauce, and coleslaw, these are so quick and easy to make. You'll love them!



The pork roast on these sliders can be any recipe you like. My favorite pork recipe is my *Hawaiian Kalua Pork*. I know Hawaii and North Carolina are nowhere near each other, but the flavors complement each other. Plus my recipe for <u>Hawaiian Kalua Pork</u> includes only 3 ingredients and is cooked in a crockpot.

The coleslaw I serve on these sliders in my <u>Tri-Color Sweet Coleslaw</u>. It's another easy recipe that is full of fresh real food ingredients. The sweetness of the dressing and slaw goes really well



with the vinegar and spice in the barbecue sauce. They balance each other out and create a really delicious slider.

The sauce isn't your typical tomato sauced barbecue sauce. You'll find different versions of a vinegar based sauce all over the Carolinas. I like apple cider vinegar for mine and that's what you'll find in my recipe. My version's heat is mellower than some that I've had. My kids aren't too fond of really spicy food, so I tone it down for



them and then add additional cayenne or tabasco to my sandwich for a more authentic Carolina flavor.

All together, these ingredients make for one FANTASTIC Pork Slider. You'll love the combination of flavors in your mouth and wonder where this tasty treat has been all your life. You'll want to serve them for appetizers, snacks, and for your main meal. Enjoy!

INGREDIENTS

Sliders

- 1 pound shredded pork roast
- ♦ 2 cups <u>coleslaw</u>
- ♦ 12 dinner or Hawaiian style bread rolls
- ♦ 1 cup Vinegar Barbecue Sauce (recipe below)

Carolina Style BBQ Sauce

- ♦ 1 cup apple cider vinegar
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- ♦ 1/2 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- ♦ 1/4 teaspoon ground cayenne pepper
- ♦ 1/8 teaspoon ground black pepper
- ♦ 1/4 teaspoon salt

INSTRUCTIONS

Carolina Style BBQ Sauce

 Combine all the ingredients into a jar. Place the lid on top and shake sauce until the brown sugar has completely dissolved.

Sliders

- 1. Heat the shredded pork and place in a bowl.
- 2. Add half of the vinegar barbecue sauce and combine well.
- 3. Cut your rolls in half.
- 4. Top each with a handful of shredded pork and coleslaw.
- 5. You can add additional vinegar barbecue sauce if desired.
- 6. Top with the top of the bread and serve immediately.
