





Diesel Engine Runaway: Cause and Effect by Cristian Puscasu - Auto Trends Magazine Updated 9 November 2022



Diesel engine runaway is rare, to say the least. These days, the chances of such an event happening are low, as most of the contributing parts are electronic.

But first matters first: what exactly is "diesel engine runaway"? As defined, a diesel engine runaway, diesel runaway, or runaway diesel is a phenomenon where the diesel engine uses a fuel that enters the ignition chamber uncontrolled and igniting it without control. Notably, the said fuel does not need to be diesel - we are simply using a common term that can also be applied to gas engines.

Due to this issue, the engine can ignite said fuel as fast as the uncontrolled source can supply. And way faster than the engine ever should. Given you do not have control of said source, your accelerator will not stop the problem nor does removing the key from the ignition help (if all the accessories are driven by the engine).

Diesel Engine Runaway Reasons

This problem continues until one of the following conditions are met:

The fuel source is depleted

The engine stops due to heat and friction, basically welding it together

The engine fails mechanically due to a part breaking, such as a connecting rod

The engine runs out of air

You stall the engine

How does a runaway diesel happen precisely? Let us examine the ways. To begin, the fuel enters the ignition chamber without control. Keep in mind that diesel engines work differently than gas engines.

When you press the accelerator with a diesel, the engine doesn't open a throttle valve somewhere, it just sprays more fuel. By spraying more fuel in the ignition chamber, the ECU alters the air-fuel mixture, either for power or economy. While air is free-flowing through the engine, the fuel is not as it is controlled by the ECU.

Also, the fuel's ignition is not caused by a spark, like in a regular gas engine. The ignition happens due to a gas law. Without delving into details, high pressure and low volume increase the temperature. When the piston is at its top dead center, pres-

sure is maximum and volume is at its minimum. As such, there is a high temperature that ignites the fuel.

Beyond the Redline

Now you can comprehend the severity of the issue. If fuel also enters uncontrolled, then no components are controlled, so the engine can do whatever it wants. In this case, by spinning as fast as it wants, way beyond the redline.

This fuel can vary a bit but within reason. One possibility is that it is, in fact, regular diesel.

Let us assume that the fuel injectors are mechanical, and an electric fuel pump has a glitch, whatever the reason may be. Due to this, it can start outputting as much fuel as it can, and burning it all in the process, hence the runaway diesel.

Another more significant possibility is due to a broken seal or a broken turbocharger, causing oil to spray into the ignition chamber. The oil pump is not controlled by the accelerator, its job is to circulate oil to lubricate the engine.

Thus, it has an overall constant flow. In this case, oil enters the ignition chamber and starts this runaway diesel phenomenon.

Further, yet another possibility is that the air outside is contaminated due to a gas leak. Notably, the gas leak can create an acceptable combustible mixture that will surely ignite when it gets inside the engine.

Now, how do you stop a runaway diesel? Certainly, trying to stop one is quite a dangerous procedure.

Indeed, a diesel engine is designed to spin at a redline of approximately 4000 rpm. A runaway diesel can spin to 8000 rpm, which is double the redline.

As such, you are asking for a connecting rod to crack and the piston attached to said rod to burst through the valve cover. (Not a diesel, but the damage could be precisely the same). Certainly, you do not want to mess with such a matter, so your options are limited.

The safest bet is when your vehicle has a manual transmission, although you will surely ruin that transmission in the process.

On the other hand, attempting to stop the vehicle with an automatic transmission will not work.

Specifically, with a manual, you can stop the car. First, engage the parking brake. Second, shift into fifth or sixth gear. Third, disengage the clutch pedal so that the engine will stall.

Furthermore, If you are brave and know what you're doing, you can raise the hood and block the intake. You know where the air filter is located and that's in the air intake. For example, if you block the intake or plug it with a piece of wood or a bunch of cloth, then the engine will stall.

Also, you could unload a fire extinguisher into the intake. A fire extinguisher is based on CO₂, which doesn't burn. This represents another semi-safe option. Apart from that, there are not numerous ways to stop a runaway engine other than calling for firefighters and allowing the fuel to run out or the engine to

The Prevalence of the Problem

Are cars more prone to diesel engine runaway? Indirectly yes. This problem usually happens due to poor maintenance. Particularly, due to gas mixing with enough air for the engine to use it as an air-fuel mixture, all the instances assume that a part failed.

Semi-trucks are maintained rather well and the same can be said about trains. A maintained semi-truck or train will not develop such issues, to begin with.

Now, an older diesel engine from a truck or a car that was not particularly well taken care of can have these issues. Broken seals or an almost dead turbocharger are not uncommon, and neither are aged fuel pumps.

Moreover, there are plenty of car owners who "tune" their cars or trucks, making them produce more power. This also causes extra stress on the engine and represents another reason why it happens more often with cars. Lastly, an older tractor can surely have this diesel engine runaway problem emerges, although the number of aging models on the road is thankfully quite small.

How to Prevent Diesel Engine Runaway By AMOT Staff March 23, 2020

When working in a hazardous environment, diesel engine runaway is a dangerous condition that can have fatal consequences. Engine runaway occurs when a hydrocarbon vapor is ingested through the intake of a diesel engine and becomes its uncontrolled fuel source. When this happens, the speed of the engine is no longer controlled by the governor, causing it to speed out of control. If not stopped, the engine can suffer irreparable damage, or even worse, ignite the vapors and explode. Our blog about diesel engine runaway explains this condition in more detail.

How Do You Stop A Runaway Engine?

This video from AMOT's Ask the Expert series goes into detail about the only proven solution to stop a diesel engine once it has begun to runaway. When an engine begins to runaway, the most common reaction is to turn off the ignition key and shut off the engine. Unfortunately, this action will prove to be unsuccessful. The engine is now using vapors as it's fuel source and turning off the key will have no effect. The only viable option at this point is to cut off the air supply to the engine. Luckily, safety devices that cut off the air supply during a runaway situation do exist.

What Are These Safety Devices?

These safety devices are called air intake shut off valves and simply put, they cut off air entering through the intake in the event of a runaway situation. Since diesel engines operate by ingesting clean air through the intake, cutting off the air supply


shuts down the engine when removing the fuel supply isn't an option.

How do Air Shut Off Valves Work?

There are different systems available depending on your engine make and model, but all are designed around the same concept: once your engine enters into a runaway situation, the air intake shut off system will activate either automatically or manually and shut off the air entering through the intake. The systems are typically installed between the engine air filter and the intake manifold as shown below.

How to Prevent Diesel Engine Runaway

The ideal location to install an air intake shutoff valve, X, is post turbo after the intercooler, as close to the intake manifold as possible (Fig. 1). If possible, take the hose/pipe measurement here.



Does My Diesel Engine Need One?

Now that you know how an air shut off system operates, it is important to understand which diesel engines should have them installed. Diesel engines used in hazardous environments, like those found in upstream, midstream, and downstream operations, are all at risk for diesel engine runaway and should always be protected. This includes large equipment like fracturing blenders and coiled tubing units and smaller equipment like light towers and generators.

Don't Wait Until It is Too Late

Air intake shut off systems are the only proven, reliable method to stop a diesel engine once it has begun to run away. Don't wait until it's too late to protect your people and equipment from this preventable disaster.

Before You Blow Your Breaker!!!

Take a minute and see how many AMPS you could be using in your RV's 30 and or 50 AMP electrical system. It is surprising how fast the AMPS add up which causes your breaker/fuses or the resorts breaker to "TRIP". Knowing the AMPS of all the electrical appliances in your RV can help you manage electrical use and prevent the inconvenience of:

"My Electricity Went Out!!"

The following is a list of the typical appliances used and the average AMPS required to operate them:

Air Conditioner -15,000 BTU	12.5 amps	Hand Vacuum	2 amps
Refrigerator	2.7 amps	Electric Frying Pan	10 amps
Electric Water Heater – 8 gal	12.5 amps	Iron	10 amps
Microwave Oven	12.8 amps	Food Processor	6 amps
Electric Coffee Pot	9 amps	Crock Pot	1.5 amps
Toaster	10 amps	Heating Pad	.5 amps
Hair Dryer	10 amps	100 Watt Heater	10 amps
TV	2 amps		

In the morning – if you start your air conditioner and the hot water heater is on, then you start the coffee pot, make some toast, and watch the TV - you are drawing 55 amps with all of these appliances operating at maximum. If you also cook some bacon in the microwave at the same time, LOOK OUT!! Many RVs have a switch so you can run only the microwave or the water heater at the same time, but some RVs do not have this feature.

Most electrical products show how many watts or amps it takes to operate the appliance printed on the product itself or in the instruction. If it shows the watts, divide the watts by 120 (volts) and that gives you the amps. To get the watts, multiply the amps by 120 (volts).

It is worth your time to take inventory of the AMPS each of your electrical appliances uses. You can then manage your total usage at any one time and this will reduce the comment of "My Electricity Went Out!!"

Crockpot Flank Steak Fajitas

Based on the popularity of my other crock pot "real food" recipes I think you guys will love this one, too. These Slow Cooker Flank Steak Fajitas go great with homemade tortillas and your favorite toppings.

Slow cookers are great for entertaining because you can easily get all the work done in advance and have your house smelling amaz-

ing when guests arrive (we use this basic, inexpensive slow cooker). Who knew you could set-and-forget Mexican cuisine in the slow cooker so it's ready for dinner? See how this easy and delicious crockpot flank steak recipe comes together in our detailed recipe below. After all, slow cookers aren't just for soups, people!

Make Ahead Crockpot Flank Steak Fajitas

I just made these fajitas myself the other day and my daughters kept asking me "What smells so good??" They couldn't wait to dig in and if you make the tortillas in advance it will just take some grated cheese, sour cream, and cilantro (plus any other fixings you like on your fajitas), and your feast will be ready in no time.

How Long to Cook Flank Steak in a Slow Cooker

If you cook the flank steak on high for roughly 5-6 hours, you'll end up with perfectly tender, pull-apart flank steak that takes on the spices and sauce flavors perfectly! Just note that different brands of slow cookers may have different heating temperatures despite having the same setting. To avoid drying out your flank steak, be sure to check on it around hour 4 and 5 if at all possible! (For reference, we used the 6Qt Crockpot on "High" for this recipe.)

Your family's tastes may vary, but these are some of our favorite toppings to dress up these crockpot flank steak fajitas with!

Grated cheese, (try some Mexican Cotija!)

Fresh cilantro

Squeezed lime juice

Sour cream

Spinach

Sliced Avocado

Fresh Jalapenos (If you like more of a kick!)

Habanero peppers

Slow Cooker Flank Steak Fajitas Recipe

Instructions

- 1. Mix together the dry spices with a fork including the chili powder, cumin, coriander, salt and pepper.
- 2. Rub the spice mixture over all sides of the flank steak and place it in the bottom of the slow cooker. Sprinkle the soy sauce on top.
- 3. Top the flank steak with the diced jalapeno and minced garlic. Slice the bell peppers and onion and throw those on top of the steak as well.
- 4. Turn the slow cooker onto HIGH and cook for 5 6 hours or until the steak can easily be shredded with two forks.




