The Royal Coachmen of California are among the "old timers" of the coach owner organizations of the country.

They are pictured here at their organization meeting in October 1960. Two requirements of membership are that the coach be a "Flexible" conversion and that it is equipped with a CB radio. These families are from the Pomona Valley area of California.

In February of 1965 they formed the California Chapter FMCA





The California Chapter of FMCA

In 1960 a group of men in the Pomona Valley of California found that they were all buying used 1940's era Flxible busses from a dealer in Los Angeles. They each had the same idea of converting them for mobile camping homes. They shared ideas of how they would strip the interior to re-wire for battery powered lighting, 120v outlet plugs, insulation, maybe plumbing for a sink with faucet, wood veneer paneling, cabinets, bunk beds, tables and possibly the piping and holding tank for a toilet. A hot plate or Coleman stove was used for cooking and Coleman lanterns for lighting. If 120v plugins were available at a camp location, they could use a 120v light system. Ham radio or CB radio was also very desirable for communication. They acquired maintenance manuals and soon learned about how to do the repairs and up-keep for their coaches.

They decided to form a mobile camping club and in 1960 the "Royal Coachmen" family campers was formed. There were 10 families involved from the local area of Pomona, Ontario, Chino and Claremont. This local area of southern California gave access to the deserts, mountains and beaches for year around travel and camping.

By 1964 many were obtaining membership in a newly formed Family Motor Coach Association that had been formed in the east. This organization had a magazine with much needed information that suited their purpose. It was decided to hold a western region meeting of FMCA members and guests in February, 1965, at the Los Angeles County Fair Grounds in Pomona. Tom & Junia Duck, F257 of Ontario CA., received 44 reservations and 34 managed to arrive plus 2 without reservations and 5 commercial units. Besides Flxible units there were a Brill and other units in various stages of construction. The first meeting was held in the stripped out Brill of King & Georgia Kramer. Coffee and cookies were served by Georgia King and Betty Kandt as all sat on chairs, boxes or stood.

Paper work was filled out and the election of officers was held on Saturday. "California Chapter" was decided as the name and the newsletter would be called the "Spotlite". The first elected officers were;

The charter was approved by FMCA and California Chapter became the fourth chapter of FMCA and the first west of the Mississippi River. Many of those early members drove their busses to the early National Conventions. Tom Duck was elected as the fourth President of FMCA. Dr. Jim Holifield was chapter president in 1967 and 68 (still on the roster) and helped organize a chapter in Central California where he is still active there.

Bruce and Marry Johnston are charter members and are still on the roster. They stop by and visit at some of the rally's when they can but no longer drive their bus which is parked in the front drive at their house. Dave Brooks F# 332s the son of Irving and Winifred Brooks remembers those early days and how big the tool box had to be. Coveralls, hydjacks and large wood blocks were needed items. A spare transmission was often under one of the beds. He says two men could change out a transmission in 3 hours. Every one carried spare parts in those days and needed them. It is kind of hard to imagine doctors and other professional men in coveralls with grease under their finger-nails.

The California Chapter is still very active and carries a membership of over 200 coach families. Starting in 1976, the "Oktoberfest Rally" became one of the biggest annual events. It always draws a crowd of over 100 motorhome members, guests and volunteers from other local chapters. The "Biergarten" and hotdogs have been a hallmark along with the entertainment and live polka bands and dancing.

2015 will mark the 50th anniversary of the chapter and plans are already underway for a mega blow-out celebration



The California Chapter hosted a Thanksgiviing rally at the Del Mar fairgrounds as a precursor to the upcoming International convention...All women did everything and we had a ball...we had many big wheels from national attending to check things out...we impressed them highly...we had the first men only pot luck and prime rib dinner including doves and a dance band...

Im March 1979 The California Chapter solely hosted the convention...All by ourselves...we had a record of over 1000 coaches in attendance and it was a huge success..


I had a great ride as President and all of our rallies were well attended. Please feel free to use what I have sent...and of course I would like the "stuff" returned when you are through.


My term was un-eventful. We had confidente people in all positions so there was no problem that could not be easily handled.




Jody Davis President 1993 - 1994


Patricia Artimez President 1991 – 1992 Don Artimez President 1996 – 1997

The most important thing I've learned is that this Chapter is made up of wonderful people. This is where I have made life long friendships.




Robert 'Rick' Ricordati 2001-2003







BASICPARKING SIGNALS


Parking at a convention or rally can be a tricky undertaking with the number of families attending these popular events. The basic parking signals below are being furnished to assist you in arriving at your final parking space in a safe manner. Instructions listed below are for drivers, as well as for the parking team directing you to your parking location. It is hoped these uniform signals will allow for confusion-free parking at our events. SAFE AND HAPPY TRAVELING.

FOR THE DRIVER


These signals are usually given from the left rear of your coach. Never move the coach unless the parker is in plain view. When the parker needs to leave the preferred high-visibility left side of the coach to determine whether the other side is clearing, the STOP signal will be given. If at any time you do not understand the hand signal or additional directions are needed, wave your hand out the driver's window and signal the parker to approach for conversation.

FOR THE PARKING TEAM

The parker giving directions to the driver must possess a very good understanding of the degree of maneuverability of the coach and visualize an imaginary path of the rear wheels that lead to the desired parking spot without hitting anything. Be wary of low-hanging limbs, overhead wires, utility connections, and sharp corners on walkways or patios. Always be in the field of vision afforded by the driver's left side mirror that will permit observation of the rear of the coach. If you need to leave the high visibility left side of the coach, give the STOP signal to the driver.



Move rear of coach to the left, as seen in mirror.




Move rear of coach to the right, as seen in mirror.




Slowly (when parker is pumping palms down like patting a dog).
