Characteristics of a Good Candidate: Good interpersonal skills, relationship building and maintenance skills, flexible thinker, crisis intervention and de-escalation skills, therapy/counseling skills as supports to families, assessment and evaluation skills, and therapeutic persistence and engagement with families.

Job Description:

Conduct formal or informal screenings

Provide evidence based practices including TFCBT, PCIT, EMDR, or MAP therapy, which includes case management, to youth that experienced mental health challenges with inclusion of the family and other adults in the life of youth. These models will follow fidelity monitoring standards.

Provide crisis intervention supports and immediate response for high needs cases. Conduct risk assessment and immediate response using Psychological First Aid, A-TIP, or other interventions immediately following a crisis.

Provide consultation to adults in youth lives to increase the protective factors and social support network wrapping around the client. Provide consultation on the use of ALGEE from Youth Mental Health First Aid or other support protocols with adult volunteers, natural supports, education personnel, or professionals in the lives of youth.

Provide awareness and consultation for understanding what has happened to a child and family and how to support youth that have experienced adversity or trauma and their families. Specific targets are educators, families, and community partners including those in multiple sectors.

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Specifically target the community and system of care to be more trauma informed, sensitive and responsive to the target population and especially marginalized populations including cultural, racial, and ethnic minority groups.

Conduct community outreach, recruitment, and engagement of eligible clients and families.

Document and submit timely reporting of progress monitoring and outcome management for the project including time tracking of self and volunteers, intake assessment and evaluations, documentation of progress notes and progress monitoring within 48 hours, process objectives of activities of the project, and outcome objectives.
