The President's Message


By President Ben Edmondson Compatriots,

President Ben Edmondson went into the Officers Reports:

2nd Vice - President—Jim Robinette-- he is looking for the phone number and/or Email address for Bill Piston, Professor Emeritus of History at Missouri State University, so he might become one of the speakers at our upcoming OMC's meetings.

Treasurer Report—John Angst— the total funds we have as of this date consists of \$8,566.61 in our Arvest Bank checking account and \$9,303.92 in an interest-bearing, guaranteed fund at the Community Foundation of the Ozarks. The Program of the day:

The program was introduced by 1st Vice

President Lt. Colonel Cris Brayman who is in charge of the JROTC program at Branson High School. He introduced the Cadets: Cadet Paige McCarty, the Corps Commander, who is in charge of the entire Cadet Corps-there are about 80 Cadets at this time; the Past Corps Commander Sage Friend, who is also in the Honor Guard; Honor Guard Commander Gabriel Sanchez; Cadet; Irelyn Mosandl of the Honor Guard: and Honor Guard member Cadet Logan Fields.

Cadet Captain Gabriel Sanchez started the program. He is a Junior at Branson High School. This is his third year in the Branson JROTC Program. He spoke about the Honor Guard, or as the SAR calls this, the Color Guard. He is the

Honor Guard and serve their community. This is a very competitive team and tryouts are required. They are selected on their appearance, attitude, and performance. They train weekly or more. In the Fall the new Cadets are introduced to the concept of drill with basic movements and later to more difficult maneuvers. Once they have mastered maneuvers, various equipment is introduced including flags, rifles, and sabers. Then they can perform in programs in the community. They perform over 100 Honor Guards each year, sometimes doing up to 3 in one day. The Cadets perform in various events with those that excel doing events with Governor Mike Parsons, Branson Chamber of Commerce, Branson Chief of Police, Jeff Mathews, and with the SAR. He expressed their honor to present the colors with the SAR. He participated in the OMC Grave Marking ceremony in Marshfield, Missouri for Patriot Nathan Clifton and he was truly moved by that event with patriotism. Another SAR event that helps make them famous is their Veterans Day Assembly at Branson High School, the Black Flag Rendezvous, with musket firings from the SAR with more than 1500 persons attending. They presented their "Big Flag" with the help of persons who have families that have served. Another event was at the Branson Landing for the 4th of July celebration with the SAR and also Governor Parsons. He and all the Cadets are proud and honored to be able to participate with the OMC of SAR. He then introduced his **Cadet Commander Lieutenant Colonel Paige McCarty.**

Cadet Corps Commander Lieutenant Colonel Paige McCarty spoke about the Branson High School JROTC program as a whole and how it

runs. She presented slides to show the initiation of the new Cadets through their entire program. The Air Force JROTC program



represents Air Force Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps. It has been established by the US Congress to identify future Air Force Officers. The Branson Corps is a Cadet run system that does their education and mentoring these Cadets in their teams. Their Mission is to build systems of character who are dedicated to serving our community and our nation. She showed the organization chart of the leadership and teams, or flights, and their personnel. The Corps Commander is in charge of the Operation Officer as well as all of the Flight Commanders. She then went on to explain the daily life of the Cadets from classwork, dressing and uniforms, flying simulators, building models, and pilot training. This does assist those who continue to be able to acquire their pilot license and even apply for Air

Force scholarships to assist in being able to go to school to get their license. She, herself, was able to get one of these scholarships and did attend school where she did get her private pilot license. Lt. Colonel Cris Braymon has been instrumental in helping these Cadets to get these \$25,000 dollar scholarships and attend these schools. Cadets Friend and Cadet Sanchez will be attending this summer. Their teams include their Marksmanship Team which have been very competitive and very successful. They have their Honor Guard Team which has been very active. They have their Cyber Patriot Team which is in Cyber Security training and again is very competitive-a select team. They participate in their Community Events doing 35 to 40 events each year and partner with other groups including the SAR for these events, not including their Honor Guard events. They do more events than any other JROTC program in the country.

Questions were asked concerning flight schools, funding, and equipment. These Cadets are dedicated, well educated, and are becoming patriotic citizens of our country.

These Young Cadets were thanked for their program and presentations.

A motion to Adjourn was made, seconded, and passed unanimously.

Compatriot Gary Gift led the Recessional.

Chaplain Dan Philbrick gave the Benediction.

The Meeting ended at 10:00 AM
