



Tamahaac Club – House Rules

updated February 27th, 2024

1. Payment of House Charges

A member shall be responsible for all debt to the Club contracted by a member of his or her family or by any guest or visitor introduced by him or her or by a member of his or her family. Members shall be notified by the Club by the fifteenth day of each month of all their Club indebtedness. The Board of Governors shall have the power to suspend from Club privileges any Member whose account remains unpaid for a period of 90 days.

2. Privileges of Members' Families

The privileges of the Clubhouse and grounds shall be open to each Members' immediate family and each Member shall file with the Membership and Events Coordinator a list of the names of his or her family who attend Club events.

3. Resignations

Members may resign by resignation in writing, which shall be effective upon acceptance thereof by the Board of Governors.

In case of resignation, a Member shall remain liable for the payment of any fee or assessment, or other sum levied, or which became payable by him or her to the Club prior to acceptance of his or her resignation.

4. Visitors and Guests

A Member shall have the privilege of entertaining a guest or guests at the Clubhouse and grounds when accompanied by such Member. However, such guest or guests are eligible to attend the Clubhouse and/or grounds for Club events not more than once every 120 days and not more than three times per year. This restriction does not apply to private member events.

The General Manager and/or a Membership Committee Member have discretion over this policy to accommodate potential new members introduction to the club for the purposes of attracting new members.

Members must provide the names of their guests to the Membership and Events Coordinator at the time of booking for a Club event.

5. Prohibition of Improper Games, Sports and Conduct

The Board of Governors shall have the power to prohibit any games, sports or conduct which they may consider prejudicial to the good order and interest of the Club.

6. Gratuities

No member shall give any money or other gratuity to any employee of the Club or permit any guest or visitor introduced by him or her to do so, except to the General Manager for later distribution to Club employees.

7. Hours of Opening and Closing

The Club's offices are open 9:00 am to 5:00 pm Tuesday through Friday and 10:00 am to 3:00 pm on Saturday. The Club is available to all members during these hours. The Club is closed Sunday and Monday.

Outside events at the Club, and events for Members and their guests, require the approval of the General Manager if the event is to extend beyond 11:59 pm. On occasion, the Club is open on Sunday and Monday for outside events and events for Members and their guests at the discretion of the General Manager.

8. Dining Room

All meals should be arranged for 24 hours in advance. The Club is reserved each Wednesday and Friday nights for dinner, open to all Members and their guests, unless the Board of Governors determines the Club is to be unavailable to members on a Wednesday or Friday evening. Members bringing guests are required to notify the Club 24 hours in advance of the event.

9. Bedrooms

Requests to reserve bedrooms are to be made with the Membership and Events Coordinator. The number of days for which a room will be required must be specified at the time of the reservation request.

10. Private Personal Parties

Reservations for private personal parties shall be made with the Membership and Events Coordinator. As much notice as possible should be given in order that conflicting parties may be avoided.

11. Parties for Special Events or Special Groups

The President or the President's delegate are authorized to grant from time to time the privileges of the Club to a non-member for a special event.

Any written invitations to the event shall include on the face thereof, or have attached thereto, a card containing the words "By courtesy of the Governors – Tamahaac Club."

12. Damage to Club Property

Property of the Club, broken or damaged, must be paid for by the Member responsible, or the Member introducing the guest responsible.

13. Communications for Publication

No Member or guest shall date or address from the Club, any communication intended to appear in any newspaper, periodical or other publication, and the Club stationery or the address of the Club shall not be used for business communications.

The president or the President's delegate may make any public statement on behalf of the Club via the Press or social media.

A member or guest shall not post content on social media that is detrimental to the club.

14. Complaints

All complaints respecting the administration of the Club, and/or the employees must be stated by letter signed by the Member complaining, this letter to be address to the General Manager.

15. Alcoholic Beverages

Use and storage of liquor on Club property by Members and their guests as permitted by provincial law. Members are responsible for their guests' adherence to provincial liquor laws and house rules while on Club property.

16. Responsibility

The Club is not responsible for loss or damage to property or personal injury sustained by any Member or their guests.

17. Sports

Any group of Members who wish to conduct any form of sport or game which has the approval of the Board of Governors, may be permitted to form Committees and make rules for the operation and administration of same provided such sport, game or rules are not in conflict with the general by-laws and house rules of the Club.

18. Cell Phones

Members and guests shall place their cell phones in silent mode and refrain from using them in public Member areas.

19. Dress Code

Tamahaac Members are responsible for ensuring their guests are notified of, and adhere to, the dress code. It is suggested that invitations to guests from a function host include this dress code which is available in pdf format. We believe the dress code sets our Club apart and is an outward display of respect for each other and our traditions.

Rule of Thumb

Unless otherwise stated in the Social Events calendar, apparel for all events is jacket and tie for men and comparable dressy attire for women. For all events if in doubt dress up, not down.

Wednesday Nights - October to April: Jacket and Tie

Wednesday dinners are jacket and tie for men and comparable dressy attire for women unless otherwise stated in the social events calendar.

Wednesday Nights - May to September: Smart Casual

Jacket and tie are optional. Collared shirts (tucked in) and dress slacks are appropriate. Ladies to follow suit.

Pub Nights - October to April: Smart Casual

Jacket and tie are optional. Collared shirts (tucked in), sweaters, dress slacks, corduroy trousers and denim (not ripped, torn, frayed or bleached) are appropriate. Ladies to follow suit.

Al Fresco Fridays May to September: Summer Casual

Dress is relaxed. Sportswear (i.e. golf and tennis attire) is acceptable as is denim (not ripped, torn, frayed or bleached).

Children's Attire

The Club's dress code applies to children ages 12 and older. Younger children should dress conservatively.
