The Tamahaac is the most private of clubs but our world is open to those who want to remember, respect and celebrate our traditions.



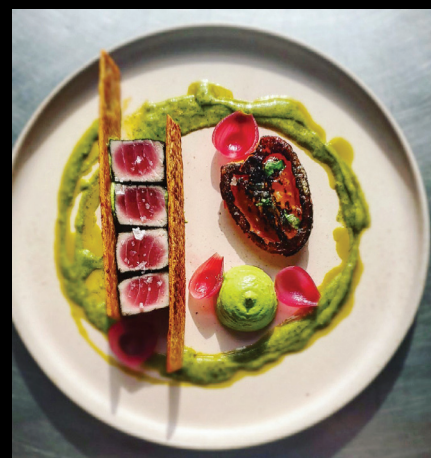
REDISCOVER CULTURE

*T*he grounds are open daily for your enjoyment. A favourite pastime for members is to visit Stephanie Falls on Tiffany Creek which runs through our property.

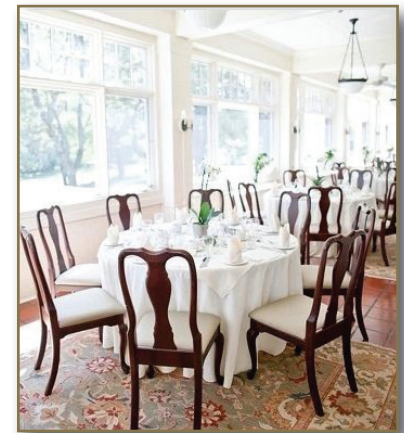




Dining

Reservations

If you prefer to reserve as part of a group, please let us know the names of those in your party. If you are coming alone, please consider the Club Table where you can join and easily mix with other new or long-time members.

Overnight Stays

Six bedrooms located on the third floor of our clubhouse can be booked for overnight stays. Keyless entry allows you to come and go as you please and a self-serve continental breakfast can be arranged upon request. The bedrooms are accompanied by two separate three-piece washrooms.

Tennis

Tennis is played throughout the summer on both an organized and casual basis. Tuesday evening is men's doubles; Wednesday morning is women's doubles; and Thursday evening is mixed doubles. The rest of the week is open to tennis and pickleball on a first come, first-served basis.

You don't need an invitation to participate even during our organized matches. Simply come by with your racquet and favourite libation. The club BBQ is always ready for personal use at your leisure.

Skeet

From October to May, three days a week, the club's skeet field is open for competition under the watchful eyes of our experienced captains. Wednesday morning is reserved for the Missing Mrs. section, Wednesday afternoons is open to mixed shooting as is Friday afternoon. Saturday morning is the Men's turn.

For safety reasons, new shooters must meet with the captains for a private orientation before venturing out. Please speak to the club Manager for more information.

Volunteers

Although we have an amazing full-time team of professionals working on your behalf, the club thrives on volunteer participation. Standing committees include grounds, garden, archives, house and membership advisory but we also form new committees to work on special projects from time to time. Our club Manager can put you in touch with committee chairs or notify you if volunteers are required.



New Membership Orientation

The best way to learn all you need to know about the club is to attend a new member orientation. You will receive formal introductions to members who run our various committees and sports section and a personal tour of the clubhouse and grounds.

Resources

When you join us, you receive our 100th anniversary history book, published in 2012 that contains photos and commentary on our origin story. The Tamahaac website includes a private member portal where you will find a membership directory, and notices of upcoming events. Event notices are also emailed weekly to those who wish to receive this form of communication.



Membership Categories and Dues

Membership in the Tamahaac Club is by invitation only. The Board of Governors is empowered to admit members in three categories:

- Associate Members
- Provisional Associate Members (those under the age of 40)
- Non-Resident Members (those residing more than 100 km from the Club)

There is a one-time initiation fee charged and dues are paid semi-annually (January and July). There is no minimum requirement to spend. Invoices are issued monthly for the cost of dinners and special events that you do attend. Initiation and dues include spousal memberships.





Proposing A Member

Members (in any category) may propose a friend for membership but must do so privately by contacting a member of the Board. This protocol is in place because our bylaws require a candidate to be unanimously approved by the Governors. If you do not have a friend or relative who is already a Tamahaac member, please speak to the Manager who will arrange an introduction to the membership chair or club president.

The Tamahaac is a not-for-profit organization. Members do not own an equity interest in the club.

Dress

We believe in dressing to suit the occasion as it sets our club apart and is an outward display of respect for each other and our traditions. We provide guidance on appropriate dress for each event. Please see the private member portal of our website for more information.
