Finally, he accepts large contributions from Political Action Committees.

Voted Yes on [H R 1616: National Computer Forensics Institute Authorization](#). In the name of combating cybercrime, this bill would further erode the distinction between local law enforcement and federal policing that has led to the increased of "murder by cop" of people of color.

Voted Yes on [H R 2028: Continuing Appropriations](#). This bill allowed Congress to continue reckless spending with a continuing resolution that would provide funding for federal government operations at the fiscal year 2016 level through April 28, 2017 at an annualized "discretionary" rate of \$1.07 trillion.

Voted Yes on [S 2943: National Defense Authorization Act \(NDAA\)](#). Among its many provisions, the massive bill creates a Global Engagement Center (an Orwellian "Ministry of Truth"). This new government propaganda center is authorized to "provide financial support" to (among others) "media content providers," including "local independent media who are best placed to refute foreign disinformation and manipulation in their own communities."

Voted No on [H R 4435: On Agreeing to the Amendment 17 to H R 4435](#). During consideration of the National Defense Authorization Act for fiscal 2015 (NDAA, H.R. 4435), Rep. Adam Schiff (D-Calif.) introduced an amendment to sunset the 2001 Authorization for the Use of Military Force 12 months after the enactment of the 2015 NDAA.

The incumbent supports more war and more debt.
