This option consists of holding a single beast on the short end of the arena for a period of thirty (30) seconds.

The competitor shall ride into the arena, face the cattle entry gate and signal for their beast to be let into the arena. The beast shall be controlled on the entry end of the arena for an enough time to demonstrate the horse's ability to "hold" the beast. If the beast does not immediately challenge the horse, the rider shall move in on the beast to demonstrate the horse's ability to drive the beast across and block the beast on the entry fence.

Note: Encouragement entry criteria is the same as Stockmans Challenge criteria.

# CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

## NOMINATIONS

Nominations will be capped (due to cattle availability). No nominations can be taken on the day.

## MEMBERSHIP & AFFILIATIONS

Membership is compulsory for all competitors in ASCA affiliated events. Competitors must be full financial members of ASCA before being eligible for points in any standings/premierships. ASCA Membership year runs: 1st October – 30th September.

## SCRATCHINGS/REFUNDS

Competitors can scratch/edit their own entries via their Nominate profile. This can be done up until the advertised nomination closing date for the event. You can also process your own refund until this time.

NOTE: A doctor's or vet certificate MUST BE supplied to receive a refund after the closing date AND must be emailed to [nominations@dwhdc.com.au](mailto:nominations@dwhdc.com.au) before the event starts.

**\*\* NO REFUNDS can be issued for scratchings after 7am Friday of the event\*\***

Should this event be postponed due to bad weather or any other reason acceptable to the committee, nominations already accepted will carry over.

## VOLUNTEER ROSTER

At the time of nominating, riders will need to select a job that they will do over the weekend. The job will be limited to a 1-2 hour shift. A job allocation list will be emailed out before the event and put up around the grounds during the competition. Please ensure you choose a job that you will be available to do.

If you are selected for a job & you can no longer do it, it is YOUR responsibility to find a replacement.

## FIRST AID & GROUNDS LEVIES

A First Aid Levy of \$8 per ride + a per event \$5 Grounds Fee will be charged when nominating.

## ATTIRE

As per the ASCA Rules & Regulations.

**HATS:** Australian style hat to be worn whilst competing.

**HELMETS:** Optional, although it is recommended, they be worn during the cattle work phase.

All riders under the age of 18 years are required to wear a riding helmet when mounted on a horse anywhere on the grounds at and ASCA affiliated event.

**SHIRT:** Long sleeve button up shirt with a collar, with the sleeves buttoned down. **TROUSERS:** Jeans or moleskins, no jodhpurs

**TIE:** Must be worn. Women may wear a tidy scarf to replace a tie.

**BOOTS:** Riding boots must be worn. Riding boots that enable the foot to come free of the stirrup iron and prevents the foot from sliding through the stirrup iron. Covered shoes should be worn whenever handling horses.

## STALLIONS

Are not to be ridden or handled by anyone under the age of 18 years at any time during a competition, either on the grounds or in the competition arena.

## GEAR

**NOT ALLOWED:** Tie downs or martingales of any description, nosebands or any other artificial device. **SADDLES:** ASCA have allowed the use of horned saddles in this small arena style event only.

**BITS:** In all phases a snaffle bit must be used. This must be free rolling, loose ring snaffle with a single joint (two- piece bit) with a smooth mouthpiece (a sweet iron may be used). Bits must be no thinner than 3/8" (9.5mm) measured against the cheek. It may have a gradual taper to the center but must be no thinner than 5/16" (8mm) measured 1" (25mm) from cheek. The ring may attach with a bar or through a hollow tube as long as the ring is always free rolling to prevent leverage. The ring must measure no more than 4" (100mm) in diameter. No twisted wire or sharp edges allowed. Loose ring bar bits are permitted.

**NOTE: A bit check may be completed on request of the gate marshal or any committee member.**

## DISPUTES COMMITTEE

Any disputes must be lodged within 2 hours of the completion of the class or incident.

A disputes officer will gather as much information as possible from the rule book, the complainant, and witnesses, or any other sources to make a decision.



## GENERAL RULES

- A two-phase competition comprising of Dry Work and Cattle Work.
- The event is open to all breeds of horses bred anywhere in the world.
- The event is open to all sexes.
- Horses and riders may compete in more than one division provided they are eligible.
- 1 horse 1 rider per class except for the Mini Class.
- It is the competitor's responsibility to have their information correct and to enter the correct/eligible class.
- It is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure their equipment is correct, in good repair, and is correctly fitted.
- At an event, the horse and rider status will be as per the beginning of the event.
- All nominations MUST be paid at the time of nominating.
- Competitors must adhere to the draw.

## ARENA CATTLE RULES

- One beast to be supplied for each competitor, with the judge able to reject a beast, or reward a re-run where the beast is deemed to be unsuitable. This is achieved via one sounding of the whistle/horn/whip.
- At any time during the work, if there is an instance where the judge feels that it is in the best interest of animal welfare and competitor safety, the judge can terminate a run by sounding the whistle or bell twice.
- A re-run will be awarded at the judge's discretion, where the run was terminated due to no fault of the competitor.
- A competitor may choose to continue to work their beast after the whistle is blown, after which no additional re-run can be awarded.
- The small arena wet work is scored out of a possible 100 points.
- Credit will be awarded for always maintaining control of the beast, with position, pace and control plus overall eye appeal contributing to the points awarded for each section. Points will be deducted for loss of control of beast, and excessive use of the arena fence.
- In the event of a beast bleeding, a rerun may be awarded where the judge believes the blood was not caused by the competitor.

## Boxing

Recommended for beginner riders and horses but can be used for all levels. This option consists of holding a single beast on the short end of the arena **for a period of thirty (30) seconds.**

The competitor shall ride into the arena, face the cattle entry gate and signal for their beast to be let into the arena. The beast shall be controlled on the entry end of the arena for an enough time to demonstrate the horse's ability to "hold" the beast. If the beast does not immediately challenge the horse, the rider shall move in on the beast to demonstrate the horse's ability to drive the beast across and block the beast on the entry fence.

### Boxing, Drive Down Fence to Opposite End of Arena

There are three (3) parts to this option:

- Boxing
- Setting up the beast and driving it down the fence to the opposite end of the arena
- Boxing at the opposite end of the arena.

Boxing: The rider shall ride into the arena, face the cattle entry gate and signal for their beast to be let into the arena. The beast shall be controlled on the entry end of the arena for enough time to demonstrate the horse's ability to hold the beast. If the beast does not immediately challenge the horse, the rider shall move in on the beast to demonstrate the horse's ability to drive and block the beast on the fence.

Drive down the fence: After the beast has been controlled on the entry end of the arena, the rider shall set the beast up for driving down the side of the arena. When coming out of the corner, the horse shall be close enough to the beast to demonstrate control with the beast against the fence. This distance and control should be maintained for approximately ½ to ¾ of the length of the arena. The rider will then stop and release the beast and move the horse to cut it out again.

Boxing at opposite end of the arena: The competitor will again control or "hold" the beast for the remainder of time at the end of the arena to demonstrate the horse's ability to control the beast.

**Ride to 50 seconds or a time designated by the committee**

# **CLASSES OF COMPETITION**

## ***5.6 Unrestricted Stockman's Challenge***

**This applies to CLASS 8. Unrestricted Challenge**

- Open to all horses and riders.
- This class will not impact the rider or horse classification except for the Encouragement class.

## ***5.7 Horse Restricted Stockman's Challenge***

This applies to:

**CLASS 9. Under 5 Challenge (horses 4 yrs & under) &**

**CLASS 10. Under 7 Challenge (horses aged 5 & 6 yrs)**

- Open to horses that are of an age nominated by the Committee. No restrictions for riders.
- This class will not impact rider or horse classification except for Encouragement (Foundation) Class.

## ***5.10 Rider Restricted Stockman's Challenge***

**This applies to CLASS 7. Intermediate Challenge**

- Restricted to riders who have never won a Derby, Classic, Novice or Open Challenge at an ASCA- affiliated event.
- This class will not impact the rider or horse classification except for the Encouragement (Foundation) class.
- Riders are no longer eligible for this class after winning 3 Advanced/Novice Challenges at a DWHDC Event or if a previous winner of a DWHDC Open Challenge in years 2025 or earlier.

## ***5.10A Rider Restricted Stockman's Challenge***

**This applies to CLASS 6. Foundation Challenge**

- Restricted to riders who have never won a Derby, Classic, Rookie, Novice, or Open Challenge at an ASCA affiliated event. This class will not impact the rider or horse classification except for the Encouragement (Foundation) class.
- A Rookie competitor who has won a DWHDC Classic Challenge or Open Challenge is no longer eligible to compete in this class.
- Restricted to competitors who have never received remuneration for training, working, or showing performance horses.
- Previous winners of DWHDC Rookie Challenges and Buckle Series in years 2025 or earlier are no longer eligible.
- Winners of a round in this class in 2026 remain eligible for Rookie Challenge events for the remainder of the calendar year.
- Rookie competitors that win a DWHDC Classic, Derby or Open Challenge in 2026 will become ineligible for any subsequent Rookie Challenges in the calendar year.

## 5.11 ENCOURAGEMENT CHALLENGE

### This applies to CLASS 13. Encouragement Challenge

1. The Encouragement Challenge is considered an adult class. It is restricted to:
  - a Riders who have never won any individual Challenge, Campdraft, Cutting, or Cow Horse event involving cattle work, regardless of affiliation.
  - b Horses that have never won any individual Challenge, Campdraft, Cutting, or Cow Horse event involving cattle work, regardless of affiliation.
  - c Juveniles in any discipline are eligible to enter this class, regardless of any wins in Juvenile, Junior, or similar youth events in ASCA or other associations.
  - d Riders or horses that have won a Team Penning, Ranch Riding, or Rodeo-style event are still eligible to compete in this class.
  - e Riders or Horses that have won an award within an event or groups of events are still eligible to compete in this class. Examples of these awards would be Hi Point, Highest score ASH, AQHA or breed society, accumulative points series awards that are awards within a single or group of events.
2. Juveniles will not be eligible to ride in this class:
  - a If they have won an adult rider or horse aged event that involves cattle work regardless of affiliation or discipline of that event. An example would be that a juvenile that has won an adult challenge, campdraft, cutting, or cow horse would not be able to enter, either as a juvenile or as they progress to the adult classes.
  - b A Juvenile rider may only compete on a horse that meets the definition in (1. b) above.

3. One encouragement win, and the horse and rider are no longer eligible.

Winners of any round of the DWHDC Encouragement Challenge in 2026 remain eligible for Encouragement Challenge events for the remainder of the 2026 series.

First, second and third place getters OVERALL in 2025 and previous years are not eligible for this class.

## 5.13 Youth Restricted Stockman's Challenge

This applies to

### CLASS 4. Junior Challenge &

- A Junior rider is 12 years & under.

### CLASS 5. Youth Challenge

- A Youth rider 13-16 years of age. Competitors that turn 17 years of age are no longer eligible. Committees may only use this class for riders under 17 years of age. No restriction for horses.

## 50 & Over Amateur Stockman's Challenge

### This applies to CLASS 11. 50 & Over Amateur Challenge

The DWHDC 50 & Over Amateur: riders must be of at least 50 years of age. Restricted to amateur riders (riders who ride as a hobby not a job – Encouragement & Foundation riders ONLY).

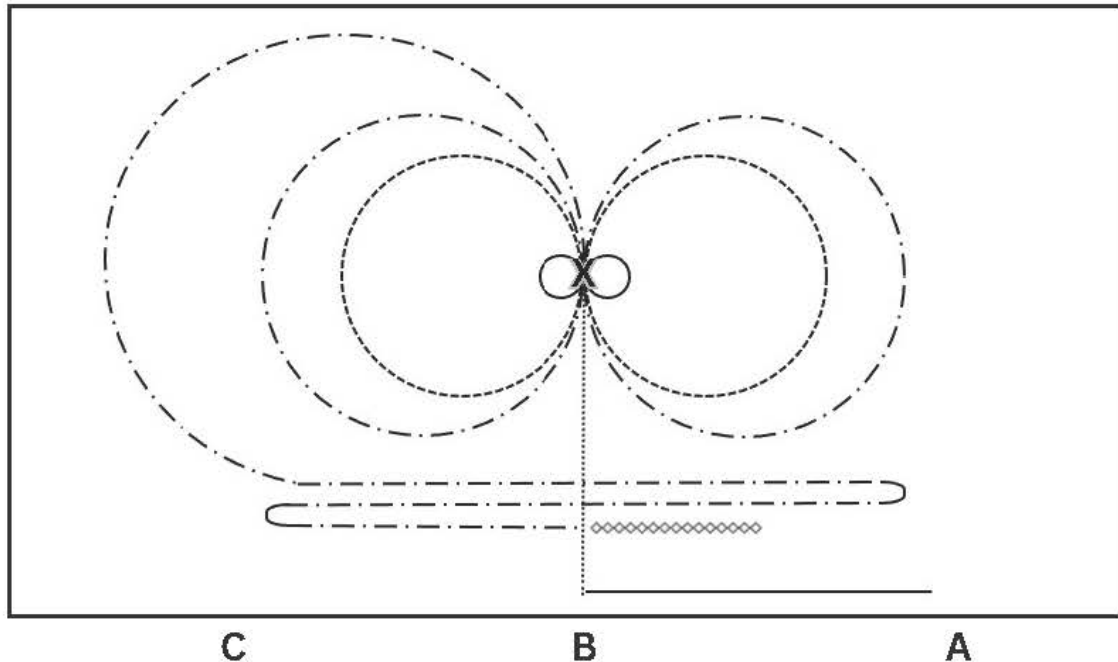
NOTE: Previous winners of a DWHDC 50 & Over Amateur Challenge in years 2025 or earlier are no longer eligible.

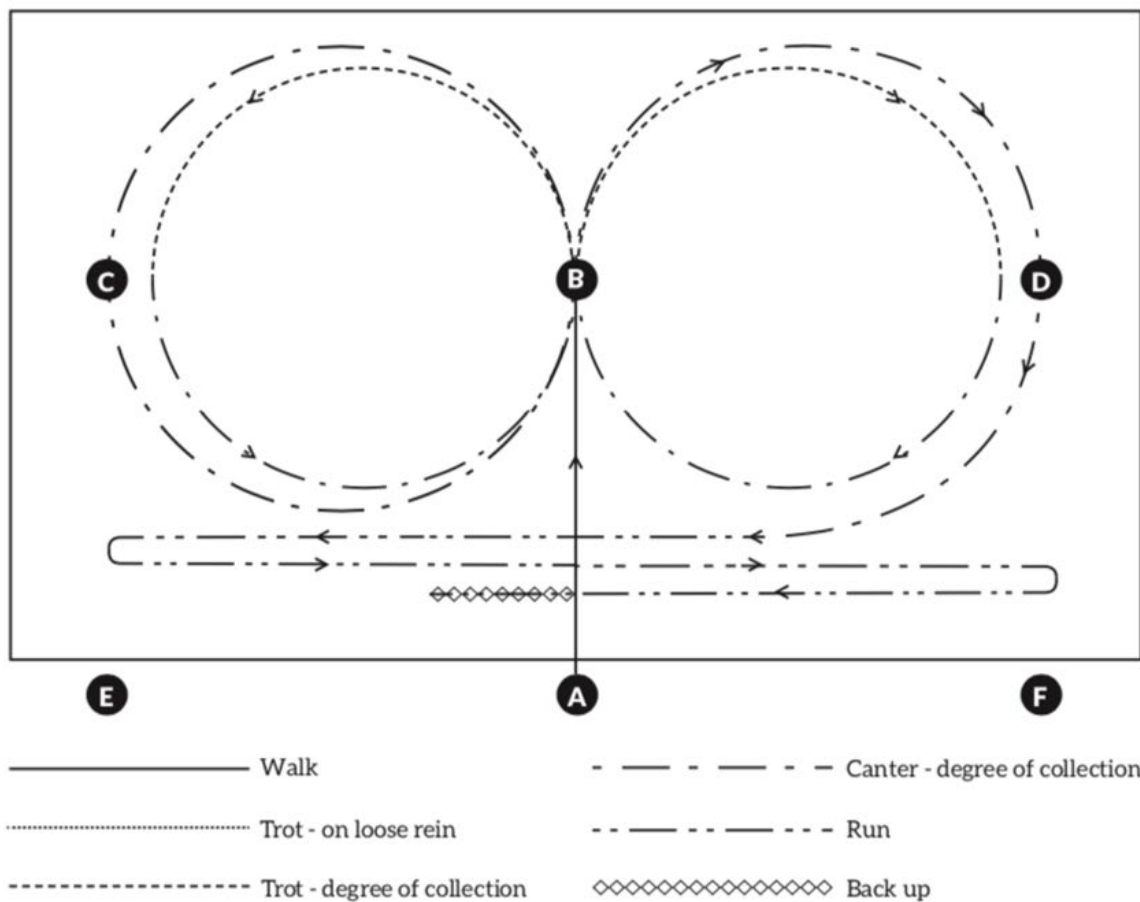
# Unrestricted / Intermediate / Foundation / Under 7

## ASCA PATTERN #12



- ① At A Acknowledge Judge. Working Walk to B cracking the whip on a loose rein. At B gather whip and continue at working walk to X. At X stop.
- ② 2 spins to the left
- ③ 2 spins to the right
- ④ Canter a small slow circle left, Canter large fast circle left
- ⑤ At X do a flying change
- ⑥ Canter a small slow circle right, Canter large fast circle right
- ⑦ At X flying change, canter large fast to the left, do not close circle
- ⑧ Run down to A and stop, and without hesitation, do a right rollback
- ⑨ Run down to C and stop, and without hesitation, do a left rollback
- ⑩ Run down past B and stop. Settle horse and back up at least 5 paces. Acknowledge Judge

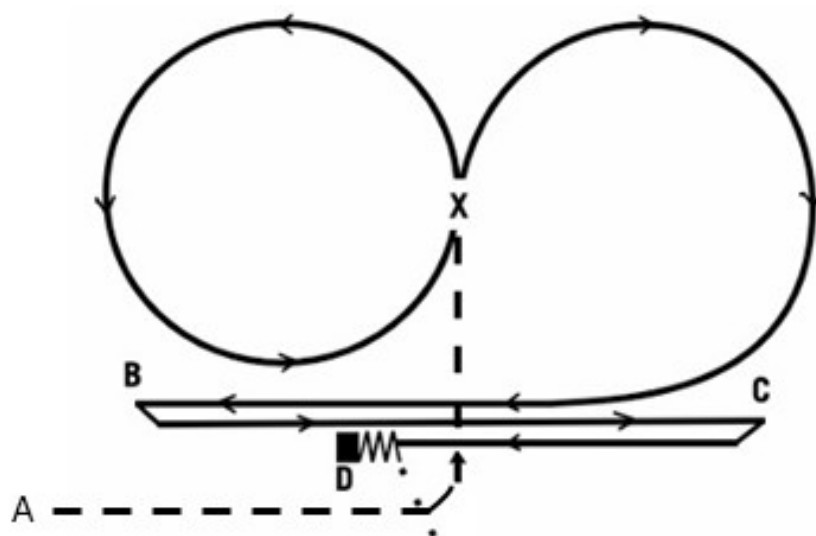
## Open & Under 18 Utility / Youth / Under 5 / Over 50 / Encouragement



<b>1</b>	Enter the arena, acknowledge Judge at <b>A</b> Proceed at working walk on loose rein cracking whip to centre and Stop.
<b>2</b>	At <b>B</b> , trot half a circle left to <b>C</b>
<b>3</b>	At <b>C</b> , canter half a circle to <b>B</b> .
<b>4</b>	At <b>B</b> , trot half a circle to <b>D</b> .
<b>5</b>	At <b>D</b> , canter half a circle to <b>B</b> .
<b>6</b>	At <b>B</b> change leads (simple or flying) and canter a slow circle to the left.
<b>7</b>	At <b>B</b> , change leads (simple or flying) and canter a fast circle halfway to <b>D</b> . At <b>D</b> Slow the canter then continue cantering straight on and run down to <b>E</b> .
<b>8</b>	At <b>E</b> , stop and rollback to the left, run down to <b>F</b> .
<b>9</b>	At <b>F</b> , stop and rollback to the right
<b>10</b>	Run down past <b>A</b> , stop and reverse a minimum of four paces.
<b>11</b>	Acknowledge Judge. Presentation of horse and rider, overall smoothness of pattern.

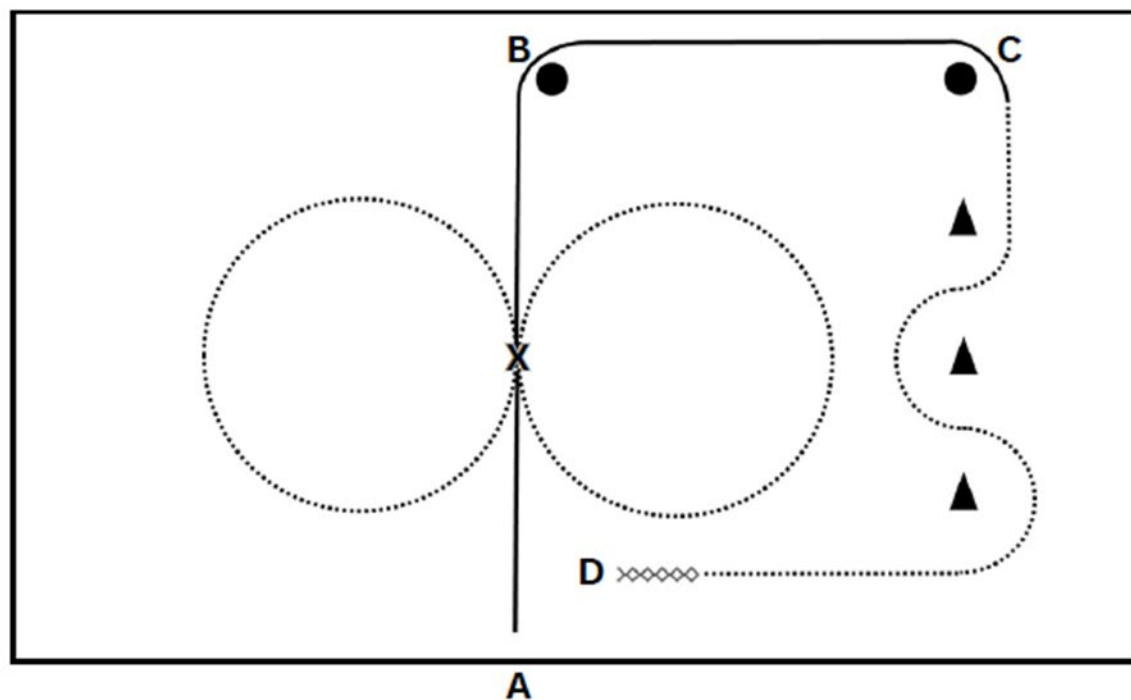

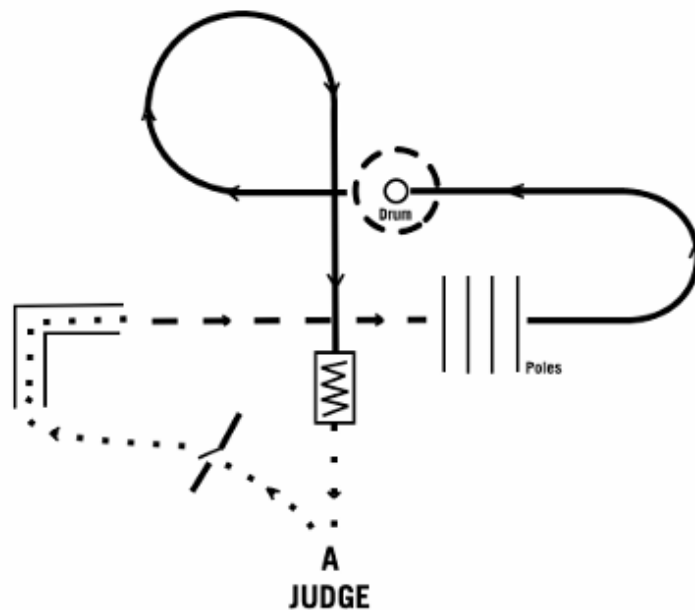
