#### Yalkut Mordechai: Notes from Rabbi Gross

#### Remembering Raoul Wallenberg

January 17 marks the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the disappearance of Raoul Wallenberg, arrested by the Red Army in the course of their 1945 capture of Budapest and taken away into the Soviet Union, never to be seen again.

The scion of a wealthy family in Stockholm, Wallenberg could have easily sat out World War II in comfort at home in neutral Sweden. But he was a bold and noble spirit (who while at university in Michigan had spent his vacations hitchhiking around America with his fellow students instead of buying the train tickets he could easily afford), and his style was strictly hands-on. So when the Nazi occupiers began organizing Hungarian Jewry for deportation to the death-camps in the Autumn of 1944, Wallenberg arranged to be assigned to the Swedish legation in Budapest as a representative of the Red Cross to go do something about it.



And do something he most certainly did. Every time the Germans carried out another *selektion*, the dapper Wallenberg strode onto the train platform in his most authoritative diplomatic demeanor to interfere with the Nazis' deportation order. He sternly informed the ranking SS officer present that



every individual loaded into the boxcars was in fact a Swedish citizen, under his personal protection, and insisted that the erstwhile deportees be off-loaded at once. Then he handed out mimeographed Swedish passports to all and sundry, and mobilized temporary housing for hundreds at a time until transportation could be arranged to get them out of Nazi-occupied Europe to a country of safety.

A disproportionate number of European Jewish survivors from the Hitler era are Hungarian, precisely because of the direct intervention of Raoul Wallenberg. Among them was the late Tom Lantos, my Congressman in California. As was his gracious wife Annette, who made it her personal campaign to educate people a generation after the

War about the moral heroism of an individual who— rather than standing quietly by and remaining uninvolved— stepped in and single-handedly saved tens of thousands of innocent people destined to be murdered.

Raoul Wallenberg remains the most notable and illustrious of the חסידי אומות העולם "righteous gentiles" who rescued our people from extermination in the Nazi era. And he still stands—long after the War, and long after Congress concurred with Rep. Lantos and named Wallenberg an Honorary Citizen of the United States— as a shining exemplar of personal involvement against injustice.

The campaign in the late 1970s to institutionalize January 17 as "Wallenberg Day" never took hold. Yet the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary this month of the heroic Swede's disappearance would be a good occasion for each of us pause mid-month to remember him... and to honor his memory by rededicating ourselves to the principle of both promoting and practicing justice, goodness, compassion, and kindness today.

May the year 2021 give each of us many opportunities to show both our dedication and our re-dedication.







Our policy at JCMI is to offer members the choice of recording Yahrtseit dates in accordance with the English or Hebrew calendars.

If members choose to remember loved ones on their Yahrtseit using the English date of death, the Yahrtseit will be observed each year on the Friday Evening of the week in which that English date occurs.

If the Hebrew date is chosen, the Hebrew date falls on a <u>different English date each year</u>. The Yahrtseit will be observed each year on the Friday evening of the week when that Hebrew date occurs.

Please inform the office as to which date you observe the Yahrtseit of your loved one so that it can be properly recorded in our records. I hope this clarified and eliminates confusion about our policy.


