Singing a New Song, and Others As Well

We recently enjoyed our first Cultural Series presentation of the year, an evening of melody with violinist Timothy Schwarz and pianist Daniel Weiser. The duo's performance, entitled "From *Klezmer* to Gershwin: The Roots of Jazz," traced the roots of much of today's popular music to the Yiddish theater of the late 19th century, and to the melodies and improvisational styles of the *klezmer* (Hebrew קָלְי וָמָ

"musical instruments") performance bands that enriched celebrations and special events in the Old Country long before that.

It has been said that music is the universal language, and there is no question that it is fundamental to the human spirit. (It may even

go back to the origins of the human family: some paleoanthropologists suggest that song preceded the invention of speech). We Jews are no exception: our national history began with music— the Song of the Sea, proclaimed by our jubilant ancestors a week after the Exodus to celebrate the completion of

their liberation from bondage. There are numerous melodies used for the Song of the Sea, but the words are still part of our synagogue liturgy to the present day:

מִי-כָמֹכָה בָּאֵלִם יְהוָה מִי כָּמֹכָה נָאְדָר בַּקּדָשׁ נוֹרָא תְהִלֹת עֹשֵׂה פֶּלָא Who could be like You, among the mighty, O Eternal One; Who could be like You, awesome in praise and working wonders?

Having burst into song on the shores of the Sea, we've been singing ever since. As Weiser and Schwarz demonstrated for us last month, the music which has always been a part of our synagogue worship experience informed the sensibilities of most of the popular music writers of the early and mid-20th century, who routinely incorporated *schule* melodies into their compositions. In fact Cole Porter— pretty much the only successful songwriter of the 1930s who <u>wasn't</u> Jewish—often remarked that he was handicapped in trying to keep up with Jerome Kern and Richard Rodgers and the Gershwins by virtue of not having grown up with the marvelous music of the synagogue.

We celebrate that legacy every year with Jewish Music Season, which runs from Shabbat *"Shirah"* (when the Torah portion includes the Song of the Sea in Exodus chapter 15) right through to Israel Independence Day in the Spring. Join us in worship on February 14, when our Cantorial Soloist Hari Jacobsen offers a melodic tribute in honor of the Season.

JCMI Schedule of Services February 2020 – Sh'vat/Adar, 5780

It is customary to light the Shabbat candles no later than 18 minutes before sundown on Friday (and on the eve of major once-a-year religious holidays). Shabbat candle-lighting time for Marco Island is listed be-low for each Friday night this month. We read the Five Books of the Torah once through each year, with a sequential installment assigned to each week in turn. The Torah and Haftarah passage for each week is listed on Saturday morning, for those who engage in ongoing study.



The Shabbat you excitedly have been anticipating for almost an entire year is almost upon us! No, no! It's not the High Holy Days. It's not Passover. It's not Sukkot or Shavuot. But, yes, and of course, it's Shabbat Shirah, the Sabbath of Song! Not that I'm partial to music – or songs, in particular – but it really is special. And, at the risk of stating the obvious, it falls on the erev Shabbat on February 7th and Shabbat day on February 8th. So, we're going to split the difference and celebrate it on Valentine's Day evening, February 14th.

It commemorates a particularly extraordinary moment. There we were on foot at the Sea of Reeds, matzah in hand, the Egyptian army at our tushes, water wings in place, - as well as high tide – when the sea parts. We safely make it across the sea. The Egyptian army is drowned. Moses breaks out into the famous "Song of the Sea"! What a moment to rejoice!

Perhaps that's why we bring it up every time we chant "Kiddush". Or additionally why "Mi Chamocha" is such a core moment in our worship service. Or additionally why Pesach is so celebrated. So, we praise God! We honor with fanfare! We eat (of course)!

But something is seriously missing. And if you make it to services on February 14th, we'll celebrate together, and I'll finish my point for you.

"The Wall That Heals" Visits Marco This Month

Through the agency of our own Carole Roberts, "The Wall that Heals," a ³/₄-scale replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in Washington, D.C., will be visiting Marco Island this month. You can visit "The Wall" and its associated educational center about the Vietnam War at Veterans Park from Thursday night, February 20, through Sun-day morning the 23rd.

Many neighbors will be coming to visit this moving shrine to those they lost in the war. Although of course our Island was just beginning to be developed, in the era of American involvement in Vietnam, the Memorial lists as combat casualties ten residents of neighboring Naples; two from Immokalee; and ten from Key West— not to mention well over two hundred from the Tampa Bay area, and an even larger number across the State in the "Gold Coast"



between Miami and Boca Raton. Moreover, we should be expecting (and prepared to greet and welcome) visitors coming from much farther afield than our end of Florida: its visit to Marco will be the only stop "The Wall That Heals" is making anywhere in the American southeast during its 25th annual tour.

Make it a point to visit Veterans Park that weekend; watch there for Rabbi Gross, who is joining our clergy community in being on hand to offer comfort to those moved by the exhibit; and be sure to welcome any Jewish visitors who may show up for Friday night services on February 21 to identify with (and possible seek solace from) our local branch of American Israelites.





To uncover the fate of the thousands being interred at a mysterious Nazi camp on the border of the Reich, a 39-year-old Polish resistance fighter, Witold Pilecki, volunteered for an audacious mission: assume a fake identity, get captured and sent to the camp, and then report back to the underground. Gathering information was not his only task. He was to execute an attack from inside. The name of the camp was Auschwitz. *The Volunteer*, the true story of a Polish resistance fighter, is an unflinching portrayal of survival, revenge and betrayal. **Jack Fairweather** has been a correspondent for *The Washington Post* and *The Daily Telegraph*, where he was the paper's Baghdad and Persian Gulf bureau chief. His reporting during the Iraq invasion won him the British Press Award (the British equivalent to the Pulitzer Prize).




Jack Hersch • Death March Escape



Death March Escape describes 18-year-old Dave Hersch's year in Mauthausen Concentration Camp, his two escapes, and his son Jack's thrilling journey to Mauthausen decades later. After a year slaving in Mauthausen's granite mine, Dave was put on a death march. Weighing 80 lbs. and suffering from several diseases, he found the strength to escape, but was quickly recaptured and sent back to Mauthausen. Put on another death march, he escaped again. As Jack retraces his father's footsteps, the places he slaved in and those he escaped, he learns much more about his father's remarkable survival, and also about himself.

Jack Hersch is a strategic advisor to investment institutions and corporate managements. He has guest-lectured in many business schools including MIT, USC and UC Berkeley.


