

Yalkut Mordechai: Notes from Rabbi Gross

A Vortel Out-of-Season

I am away from the JCMI community during the Summer months, and will return to the pulpit in September. In the interim, I offer a seasonal thought as a schtikeleh Toyre ("a little slice of Torah") to see the Congregational family through my hiatus months.



The Hasidic master Isaac Meyer of Bunem, the Gerer Rebbe, adduced a parable from the classic Midrash on the Book of Numbers, in which a man falls from a boat into the sea. The captain of the vessel throws him a rope and shouts: "Take hold of this rope, and do not let go— if you do, you will lose your life."

The Gerer continued: "The reference is to that verse in the Biblical Book of Proverbs which says that Torah 'is a tree of life to those that hold fast to it.' Torah is God's Own wisdom, and a lifeline for the human spirit. If you let go of her, you will lose your life."

The Talmud recounts the trauma of the Hadrianic persecution, in which the Roman emperor who had so brutally crushed the Bar-Kochba rebellion forbade teaching Torah on pain of death. Yet Aqiva ben-Joseph continued teaching Torah, nonetheless. When his friend Pappas asked him "are you not afraid of the Emperor's edict?," the Rabbi told him: "I will tell you a parable."

"One day the fox was strolling by the river, when he saw fish anxiously darting about in the shallows. When he asked them why they were so nervous, they told him 'there are wiers here, put out by the fishermen to trap us.' Licking his chops, the fox suggested: 'Why don't you come up here with me, on the river bank, and be safe from the traps?'

"The oldest and wisest fish told him: 'You are not so clever as they say, Mr. Fox. Of a surety, there <u>are</u> some potential dangers for us here in the river... but the water is our natural element; should we leave it, we should die of a certainty.'

"So it is that, even in times of danger, we Jews would never relinquish Torah, which is as much a natural element for us as water is for the fish."

Parashah study with Rabbi Gross is suspended until September, but do make occasion to stay on top of your own exploration of the timeless lessons of the weekly Torah portion.



Every year I am surprised that "season" is over. And this year is no exception. Wow! It's May 2023! Yet it's also only May; we have more than half of the year completely ahead of us.

I want to momentarily look back to April, before I move forward. I was struck by two NPR interviews this past week. Both interviews shared the same topic, and, since I had never heard any interview whatsoever on the topic, nor did I find the topic particularly timely, I found the choice alone striking. Linguistics.



Since Lia began college seriously studying linguistics, I had already learned

That this discipline is a very humbling one for me. Certain perspectives that

linguistics experts poo-poof are things of which I myself am admittedly guilty. For

example, it really annoys me when it becomes popular to "mispronounce" a

word. That popular food, pasta, is pronounced "pah-stah". Somehow, however,

some people have found it preferable to like the pronunciation as "passed-a".

It's pahhhhhhhhhhh-stah!!!

In reality, however, history over many centuries foretells that in another 50 years, both pronunciations will be equally acceptable/correct. It is beyond unlikely that a consistent historic pattern is going to change suddenly. So, I concede that the linguists are correct. It still really annoys me, though.

Here's one more example. Do you ever find it annoying when you hear someone's speech is riddled with "uh" or "um". If so, according to linguistics experts, you and I have to get over ourselves. Reportedly, each has a communication purpose; "uh" indicates that the speaker needs a second, but is not through speaking; "um" indicates that the speaker needs more than a second, but is not through speaking. Feel better? Me neither. However, I will say that none of this disproves my thesis: How we say something is really, really important.

What's more, our first parashah of this month of May, *Emor*, does not discount my premise. *Emor* contains many directives from God to Moses to pass on to the Israelites. There are numerous orders to and about the priests; there are declarations of the sacred occasions (Shabbat, Pesach, Shavuot, Rosh haShanah, Yom Kippur, and Sukkot); there is the prescription as to how to deal with someone who has blasphemed Adonai. Each of these statements is a direct order. There is no embellishment whatsoever. But ...

But that's Eloheinu "speaking". We, mere mortals, who are only in God's image, need to establish our sincerity, our values, our decency, our credibility. How we say our message(s) is our best insurance of successful communication and successful responses.


