Yalkut Mordechai: Notes from Rabbi Gross

A Vortel Out-of-Season

I am away from the JCMI community during the Summer months and will return to the pulpit in September.

In the interim, I offer a couple of wry existentialist Yiddish stories as a schtikeleh Toyre ("a little slice of Torah") to see the Congregational family through my hiatus months.

Fifty years ago, Carly Simon had a hit song called "Anticipation," which opened with the observation:

We may never know about the days to come—

But we think about them, anyway.

Carly is, of course, a nice Jewish girl, who derived from her heritage and religious background a strong legacy of building on days past while looking ahead to "the days to come."

Because the cycle of the Jewish year is filled with countdowns.

- The seven-week Spring ספירה ("count-down") between Passover and Shavuot commemorates the long-ago journey of our forebears from Egyptian bondage to Mount Sinai, a re-enactment of our own spiritual journey from Redemption to Revelation.
- <u>The somber three-week mid-Summer *s'firah*</u>, recalling the capture and destruction of Jerusalem by the Babylonians in 586 BCE, is an annual alignment with our history that teaches us to cope with and heal beyond hurt and disappointment.
- And the entire month of Elul (which begins this year on the last Sunday in August) is a count-down to Rosh haSha-nah, a סליות season of cultivating our spirit and our heart before the New Year.

A different kind of count-down (or perhaps count-up?) falls some weeks later, as Rosh haShanah itself approaches. Tradition holds that it was on Rosh haShanah that Abraham carried out his near-sacrifice of Isaac atop Mount Moriyah, described in Genesis 22, so it is on New Year's Day that we read that passage in commemoration of their exercise in faith. But according to fabulously ancient Jewish tradition (found in ספר The Book of Jubi-lees, published 2200 years ago during the reign of the Hasmonean King YoChanan Hur-kanos) Abraham himself felt there was more to it than just that one day. He decreed that, in addition to the day he met God, the three days' journey out to the Mountain and his three days' journey back home should be commemorated annually with a week-long "Festival of The Eternal One; and thus, has it been ordained and written on the heavenly tablets regarding Israel and their descendants, to observe this week with festive joy" [Jubilees 18:18-19].

Now, does that mean the three days <u>bracketing either side</u> of Rosh haShanah are part of a sacred week of joy, in which New Year's Day is a sweetly joyous midpoint feast; or does it mean that the first seven of the Ten Days of Repentance <u>beginning with</u> Rosh haShanah are a time of special jubilant purpose? And the answer, of course, is: "Yes." Because either way it has do with anticipation—looking forward eagerly to the promise and hope of a New Year and of fresh beginnings leading to good and blessed things.

I look forward to my return to the pulpit on Marco and anticipate with pleasure our seasonal reunion. Closing, as I opened, with a pop song: "see you in September."

Friday, August 26 - Featuring a blessing for the coming New Moon, and new month, of Elul.



At this moment, here we are, you and I together. For my part at this moment, my wish is for it to be a very good one for you. Certainly, if it is a good day all on its own, be sure to enjoy it. Each of us knows all too well that the next moment doesn't necessarily promise joy. I really, really, really wish that you take the opportunity to relish the moment. Whether the moment includes commemoration at a big barbecue with others or a simple lunch or dinner, remember and appreciate the many opportunities and unique freedoms – and all the many sacrifices made by others – that that day in history created for us in this country, along with aids we extend throughout the world. It is a day – it is a moment – for joyful revelry; it is a day and moment for somber appreciation.

May your every moment be filled with shalom and shalem.

Have a safe, peaceful, and restful summer.




