A Vortel Out-of-Season

I am away from the JCMI community during the Summer months, and will return to the pulpit in September.

In the interim, I offer a shtikeleh Toyre (“a little slice of Torah”) to see the Congregational family through the Summer season.



Every Spring, the seven-week ספירה *s'firah* countdown marks the days from Passover to Shavuot as a triumphant re-enactment of our people's long-ago journey from servitude in Egypt to service to God. In contrast to that jubilant pilgrimage of the spirit, the current Summer ספירה *s'firah*, by contrast, is a bitter time of painful remembrance. These three weeks commemorate the destruction of Jerusalem by the Babylonian Imperial army, which first broke through the walls of the city on Tammuz 17 (July 20, this year) and began dismantling the Temple on the 9th of Av (August 10).

The far more recent tragedy of the Nazi era understandably eclipses our concern for much of Jewish history from prior ages. Yet our ability to confront and cope and prevail in the face of existential threats represents a precious legacy of our forebears. They wrestled as we do with the same questions of faith, and responded with imagination and courage that continues to inspire us centuries later.

A case in point is this poignant Midrash (exegetical commentary) on the Book of Psalms:

Rabbi Pin'chas the Cohein taught that it was Moses who established the order of Jewish prayer when he proclaimed: “The Eternal One, your God, is God of gods and Lord of lords **הַאֵל הַגָּדוֹל הַגִּבּוֹר וְהַנּוֹרָא, אֵל עֲלִיּוֹן**, great, mighty, and awesome.”

The prophet Jeremiah, however, changed the order of prayer by saying [Jeremiah 32:18] **הַאֵל הַגָּדוֹל הַגִּבּוֹר** “the great God, the mighty God”— but not “the awesome.” He considered God to be mighty, because it took exceptional Self-control to remain silent when the Children of Israel were put in chains and the Temple was destroyed.

But if that is so, then why did he not consider God to be awesome? Because the idolatrous invaders came into the Temple in Jerusalem and put it to the torch. How awesome could God be considered to be, if enemies could come into God's Own House, and not be too abashed at its glory to destroy it?

Later the prophet Daniel also changed the order of prayer by saying [Daniel 9:4] **הַאֵל הַגָּדוֹל הַנּוֹרָא** “the great God, the awesome God”— but not “the mighty.” Why did he not consider God to be mighty? When the Children of Israel were being led away in chains, where was God's might?

What is important about this is that our forebears imagine even the prophets of Israel daring to question God. The right to broach tough challenges is a perk of being on a First-Name basis with the Creator of the Universe. Yet the question of boycotting our duty of faith to our Covenant Partner never enters into the equation. God's Own servants dare to revise the language of prayer, but it would never occur to them that we shouldn't pray.

🎵 NOTES FROM OUR
CANTORIAL SOLOIST 🎵



Towards the end of July – this year, it is July 20th – we read parashah “Balak”. For numerous reasons, it is a special gem. Personally, it’s particularly special, because it is from this portion that Lia, becoming a bat mitzvah, chanted atop Masada. That in itself, for an obvious myriad of reasons, was deeply poignant for the Jacobsens. Clearly, dayeinu (that would have been enough).

However, there was even more. As we looked down from the famous fortress, we were looking on the very site from which this reading’s most famous line comes; “How goodly are your tents, O, Jacob, your dwelling places, O, Israel.” Yes, we were looking where those very biblically cited tents were pitched. It still gives me goosebumps.

As you may well know, “How goodly” in Hebrew is “Mah Tovv”. And, also as you may well know, that text is recited regularly at the beginning of our morning services. Biblical texts which are included in our liturgy are selected with great deliberation. So, what is so special about those lines? How much time do you have?

Good news: I’m going to go for only one point. Of course, to give it a context, I’m going to run us through just a tiny pinch of what precedes the verse. The Israelites and the miracles God has shared with them, along with their just having defeated the Amorites, antecedes their arrival to Moab. The King of Moab, Balak, fears the threat the Israelites pose for him and his people. Enlisting the support of the Midianites, Balak calls upon a local prophet – yep; a local prophet – by the name of Bil’am (“Balaam” in English) to curse the Israelites. Bil’am checks with God, who surprisingly says no. But because of Balak’s “friendly” persuasion, Bil’am does address the Israelites. However, much to Bil’am’s surprise, rather than curses upon the Israelites emanating from his lips, it is “Mah tovu ...”. Instead of cursing the Israelites, he “blesses” them. Also as you may well know, what makes a “blessing” a “blessing” is that 3-word opening, “Baruch Atah, Adonai ...”

(praised or blessed are You, Lord). With this humongous congregation of nations, rather than a praise to God, God has Bil’am praise the Israelites; God causes, God chooses, to have the praise be made on amcha (His people). So, when we begin a service with the words “Mah Tovv”, we are beginning with the historical reminder and the personal responsibility of goodness. God said so.

Because of the powerful charge of these words, many composers have chosen to write musical settings for them. On Friday, July 19th, I’ll take a few minutes during the d’var spot to take us down the memory lane of “Mah Tovv” musically.

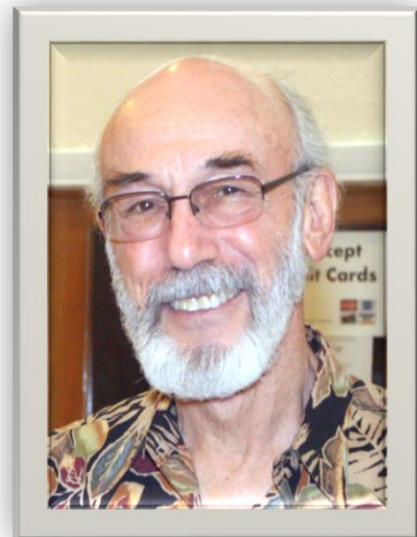

If the Hebrew date is chosen, the Hebrew date falls on a different English date each year. The Yahrtseit will be observed each year on the Friday evening of the week when that Hebrew date occurs.

Please inform the office as to which date you observe the Yahrtseit of your loved one so that it can be properly recorded in our records. I hope this clarified and eliminates confusion about our policy.
