Catching our Breath, Together

A classic story tells how a panel of theologians was posed with a challenge: what would the tenets of their faith tradition teach them to do, if the world were about to be destroyed by a cataclysmic flood like the one in the time of Noah? The Catholic priest, Muslim *qadi*, and Protestant minister all said their faith traditions teach them to accept God's dispensations humbly, so they would drown with trust and faith. The Buddhist monk and Hindu pandit said their faith traditions call upon them to accept what fate brings, and to hope to be worthy of reincarnation in the fullness of time. The Rabbi said: "We Jews would learn to breathe underwater."

That resilient spirit has made it possible for our malleable and creative people to maintain our eternal Covenant with God by enduring over the course of a sometimes turbulent national history lasting more than thirty centuries. And it continues to see our little Congregation through the challenges of this season of illness and quarantine.

Denied the privilege of being together in our beautiful Temple home, we continue to gather virtually for worship shared in cyberspace. We implemented "distance-davvening" by Zoom last Spring. Our Temple Board wisely resolved to implement CDC guide-lines by suspending all public gatherings—and inside of three days our wonderful Cantorial Soloist and I had created the means for our equally wonderful Congregants to continue praying and singing and studying and celebrating together even while "sheltering in space." Our seasoned lay leader Roger Blau has kept the home fires burning with Cantor Hari through my Summer off-season, and we will continue to live-stream our worship services when I virtually return to the JCMI pulpit this month.

That includes our sacred and solemn worship for the New Year season: Rosh haShanah and Yom Kippur services, also, will be conducted by live-streaming service. But we are doing everything we can to maintain the uniquely sacred spirit of the Ten Days of Awe:

- Cantor Jacobsen and I are leading worship from the pulpit of our Synagogue;
- we are making provision for individuals to participate with *'aliyot* to the Torah and other ritual honors, even while distance-worshipping in their own homes;
- we are sending all our members a self-contained *machzor* prayer booklet, to follow and participate in each service;
- and our leadership has taken steps to install professional-grade video and sound equipment in our Temple home. That way we can not only enjoy the best possible prayer experience for the High Holy Days; later on, when it is safe at last for us to join together under one roof, we will have the means to bring JCMI Shabbat worship into the living rooms of those unable to join us in person.

We appreciate the patience of our membership, as we all make necessary adjustments at this difficult and dangerous time. And we count upon everyone's generous commitment and ongoing goodwill, as we weather the storm (holding our breath, as an alternative to drowning)—and as we prepare to come out the other side the same way we do everything: together.

Tashlich: A Moving Waterside Experience

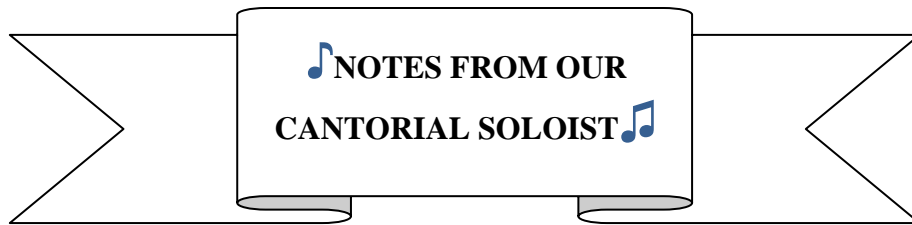

כַּפֹּת תְּמָרִים וְעֵנָף עֵץ-עָבֹת וְעַרְבֵי-נָחַל

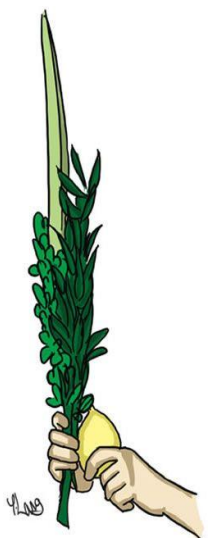
palm fronds, and sprigs of myrtle and willow,

Our policy at JCMI is to offer members the choice of recording Yahrtseit dates in accordance with the English or Hebrew calendars.

If members choose to remember loved ones on their Yahrtseit using the English date of death, the Yahrtseit will be observed each year on the Friday Evening of the week in which that English date occurs.

If the Hebrew date is chosen, the Hebrew date falls on a different English date each year. The Yahrtseit will be observed each year on the Friday evening of the week when that Hebrew date occurs.

Please inform the office as to which date you observe the Yahrtseit of your loved one so that it can be properly recorded in our records. I hope this clarified and eliminates confusion about our policy.
