Yalkut Mordechai: Notes from Rabbi Gross

A [Proper] Spiritual Focus

With the spirituality of the New Year season behind us, the arrival of October sees us involved with spirits of a different kind. Hard on the heels of The Ten Days of Repentance, when we sing exalted hymns about the celestial messengers On High, comes All Hallows Eve, with its emphasis on ghosts, goblins, and ghouls.

Now clergy love a good ghost story as much as anyone else. The light reading in our guest room includes an Alfred Hitchcock anthology, *Stories That Go Bump In The Night*. And, for that matter, we have our own Jewish ghost stories in the Talmud (including a favorite one I shared a couple of years back, on the Shabbat of Hallowe'en weekend, about a man who took to hanging around the graveyard late at night to get hot trading tips about commodities futures).



But the point is that those are <u>our</u> ghost stories. The teachings and anecdotes of the Talmud may reflect the Babylonian host culture's obsession with demons and spirits. However, by the tone and tenor of those teachings our long-ago sages reflected a uniquely Jewish "spin" that removed the threat of these preternatural creatures, by normalizing them as an orderly part of God's Creation... the same as us.

Nomenclature alone is an index of foreignness. Consider that, in the aforementioned unholy trinity of "ghosts, goblins, and ghouls," those terms are, respectively, German, Greek, and Arabic— in other words, not very Jewish. (Add to that list that "witch" and "devil" are also German; "demon" is Greek; and "vampire" is Serbian). Israeli Hebrew does offer a translation for those terms, but in each case it is a modern fabrication; the cultures that spawned these words did not exist in Biblical antiquity.

More significant, the ideas themselves are foreign to the Jewish experience. They presuppose a duality, with forces of evil inimical to and opposed to God. Such a concept is mutually exclusive of the religious thinking of the Jewish people, who recite daily

hear, O Israel: <u>The Eternal One, Alone</u>, is God,

and who mean every word. Speaking through the prophet Isaiah, God affirms:

יוֹצֵר אוֹר וּבוֹרֵא תֹשֶּׁדְ עֹשֶׂה שְׁלוֹם וּבוֹרֵא רָע אֲנִי יְהֹוָה עֹשֶׂה כְל-אֵבֶּה Forming light <u>and</u> creating darkness, making tranquility <u>and</u> creating disruption— I, The Eternal One, do <u>all</u> these [Isaiah 46:7].

It is the challenge of wrapping our finite thinking about that infinite possibility, that makes the idea of God so very intriguing to us. And so reassuring, as well.

May this season of the year, as darkness gathers earlier and lasts longer, find us confident and unafraid... not to mention, brushing our teeth thoroughly after all that holiday candy.


Danny Benarroch, Bar-Mitzvah October 3rd



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

THE 82nd ANNIVERSARY OF KRISTALLNACHT

On November 9th, 2020, we will commemorate the 82nd anniversary of Kristallnacht. This day in history is well known for the massive arrests of Jewish males throughout Germany and the destruction of Jewish owned businesses with an emphasis on the smashing of glass windows.



Some of the males that were jailed, were later released. Many were not so fortunate and were sent to concentration camps. Any insurance monies received for the destruction had to be turned over to the German Government.

I have heard a first-hand account of the happenings. You see, my husband, then only a young boy, and his parents were still in Berlin. Harold was home with his parents when the call came: "Hide! They are coming for the males." Where were they to hide in an apartment with a high German official as the next door neighbor? Harold's mother was a smart woman and came up with a quick idea she hoped would keep them safe. She told Harold to get on his bicycle and spend the day riding around. Then she told his father to get to the subways and ride them all day. Because of her quick thinking, both survived the day.

While riding around the city that day, Harold cycled towards a fire in the distance. He arrived at his Synagogue, where he had been bar-mitzvah, in time to watch the burning of the prayer books. A scene he never forgot.

How important it is that we never forget this event from our history. It is our history from which we learn how to move forward to the future.

Our policy at JCMI is to offer members the choice of recording Yahrtseit dates in accordance with the English or Hebrew calendars.

If members choose to remember loved ones on their Yahrtseit using the English date of death, the Yahrtseit will be observed each year on the Friday Evening of the week in which that English date occurs.

If the Hebrew date is chosen, the Hebrew date falls on a <u>different English date each year</u>. The Yahrtseit will be observed each year on the Friday evening of the week when that Hebrew date occurs.

Please inform the office as to which date you observe the Yahrtseit of your loved one so that it can be properly recorded in our records. I hope this clarified and eliminates confusion about our policy.
