Yalkut Mordechai: Notes from Rabbi Gross

"Crossing the Line"

The morning of September 22 marks the milestone of the Autumnual Equinox. It represents the precise midpoint of the pendulum swing between the late sunset of Summer and the early sunset of Winter. Here on Marco Island, sunset on the Fourth of July was 8:22; on Thanksgiving,



it will be 5:35 p.m.. The Equinox bridging those two astronomical extremes falls at precisely 8:43 a.m. on September 22.



A thousand years ago, the Julian Work Calendar of Merry Olde England characterized the Autumnal Equinox by noting that in September (as, six months earlier for the Vernal Equinox in March) *Nox habet horas xii et die horas xii*, "the night has 12 hours, and so does the day." You and I, however, live in a more precise and finely-tuned scientific era. We know that there is only one precise astronomical moment in September (and, again, in March) that represents precisely twelve equal

hours of dark and light, immediately after which the proportion of daytime to nighttime began imperceptibly to change. On just such a basis, the morning of September 22 will see no alarm bells marking the precise moment of Equinoctial Passage at 8:43, nor will the clocks begin ticking any faster. It is not for many weeks afterward that we will get the vaguely restless feeling that the days are getting shorter.

That kind of small, incremental fine-tune comes home to us, when we follow the candle-lighting schedule for Shabbat. Tradition is to kindle the lights of Shabbat no less than eighteen minutes before local sunset. Look at the designated times for Marco Island, on our Schedule of Services in this edition of *The Messenger*, and you will see that stipulated candle-lighting time is seven to eight minutes earlier from one Friday to the next. Even before the putatively even dark/light split of the planet at the Equinox, we have already begun to fall away from the sun into an ever greater time of darkness at the rate of a minute or more each day.

We light Shabbat candles, in part, as a celebration of the orderliness of the universe about us. It is only when we attune and realign ourselves to the cosmic pattern of all around us that we are in a fit spiritual place to honor the One Whose Creation the holy Sabbath honors.

And we light Shabbat candles, in large part, as an act of sacred affirmation, in a world that in every season seems to fall ever farther into darkness. A Protestant colleague of mine famously noted that "it is far better to light the candle than to curse the darkness," but we see him one better: every Friday night, we light two candles, and offer a benediction to go with them.

S'lichot on September 28


Join us in a farewell to the Last Shabbat Of The Year, and in a sweet welcome to the coming New Year.

Dear Fellow Congregants,

I wanted to reach out on behalf of JCMI's Board and all its members. As most of you know, these past few years have been extremely fiscally challenging for the Congregation. To meet operating shortfalls, the Board was required to draw upon our limited financial reserves to make up for the lack of fundraising. 
