Title

February 21 is International Mother Language Day, observed since 1999 by all U.N. member nations to promote linguistic and cultural diversity and multilingualism.



The United States, a vast continental nation spanning five time zones, is one of the few world nations where you can afford to speak only one language. We nonetheless place a value on linguistic sophistication, and as such maintain a foreign-language requirement (usually Spanish, French, or German) for kids to graduate high school. Moreover, even if our multilingualism consists primarily of international restaurant vocabulary, our acquaintanceship with *souvlaki* or *pho* or *cassoulet* or *tamales* or *kimchi* marks us as cosmopolites who value our richly diverse American society in a place where everybody came from Somewhere Else.

Our earliest forebears Abraham and Sarah originated in Ur, speaking Akkadian, then migrated first to Haran, where the local language was Aramaic, and then to Canaan, where the native Canaanite language is what we now call “Hebrew.” Although Akkadian and Aramaic and Hebrew are all cognate Semitic languages, they are nonetheless as distinct from each other as the “Romance languages” of Romanian, Italian, and Portuguese; jumping ship, and starting over, took effort and commitment.

We Jews have always been linguistic cosmopolites. With the establishment of The Third Jewish Commonwealth in 1948, Hebrew language became an important tool of nation-building and identity formation. But prior to that the international language of the Jews had long been the Judeo-Latin patois called “Yiddish.” Although we think of it as Judeo-German, Yiddish originated in Italy a thousand years ago as Judeo-Latin: in part as the native tongue of the Jewish slaves brought from the first-century destruction of Jerusalem to build the Coliseum in Rome, and in part as a tool to integrate into European society waves of Jewish migrants from what is today Iraq.

For my parents and grandparents, Yiddish was their “*mama loishen*” (mother tongue), and English was their language. As, in the case of Grandpa Gross, were Polish, Russian, and Ukrainian. And my late father-in-law, who grew up in an immigrant neighborhood of Los Angeles, spoke Mexican Spanish with a Yiddish accent (and *vice versa*).

Let’s make an occasion this month (not necessarily just on the 21st) to find joy in the diversity and richness of our American society, and to take pride in how well attuned our fabulously ancient People has always been to “linguistic and cultural diversity.”

What would you have if you had a room full of Adam and Eve and Cain and Abel and Noah and Abraham and Sarah and Ruth? And add to that room Mahatma Gandhi and Maria Corina Machada and the Dalai Lama and Mother Teresa and Malala Yousafzai? A room with a bunch of goys. Dang! Those darn goys! What's even worse – Oh, yes! – what's even worse, the first parashah in February is named after one of them. Yeppers. *Yitro* (*Jethro*). And, sorry, but even worse, Yitro is Moses' father-in-law and most treasured mentor (And that also means that Moses was married to a goy.). Oh, the shame!

Obviously, I lack fondness for the all-too-often used reference that someone is a goy. Now back to Parashat *Yitro*. What obscure tidbits do we find in this *Torah* portion named after a non-Jew? *Aseret haDibrot* (*The Ten Commandments*). Ironic, huh?

Are there advantages when our children date, marry, whatever Jews. Of course. However, the Torah does not indicate that God chastised Moses for marrying a non-Jew nor for heeding the counsel of a non-Jew. Apparently, one's words and actions were the consequential issues.

May we embrace this up-coming re-reading of *Aseret haDibrot* with all its intent and merit, and may its power strengthen us for all our up-coming trials.

Dear Fellow Congregants,

I wanted to reach out on behalf of JCMI's Board and all its members. As most of you know, these past few years have been extremely fiscally challenging for the Congregation. To meet operating shortfalls, the Board was required to draw upon our limited financial reserves to make up for the lack of fundraising. This is because our due's structure, including the Above and Beyond Campaign, alone are not sufficient to meet the annual operating costs of JCMI. This past season, we have successfully established and renewed events and fundraisers that are necessary to support and maintain JCMI's annual cash flow.

We also had an incredibly successful Above and Beyond Campaign that included a generous matching gift from one of our members that enabled the Board to replenish funds drawn from reserves during the Covid years. However, these reserves are not likely to be sufficient to cover expenses the Board is expecting in the coming years, including the cost for a new roof and HVAC systems.
