Wheels Within Wheels

The ten-year Nazi Kingdom of Death is brought to mind by two milestones in the January calendar.

January 17 - commemorates the 1945 arrest of Raoul Wallenberg by the Red Army. My Congressman Tom Lantos and his wife Anita were among the tens of thousands of Hungarian Jews saved by this heroic Swedish diplomat, who continued interfering with the Nazi occupiers of Budapest right up to the point he was whisked away by the Communist conquerors. Neither Rep. Lantos nor Presidents Carter and Reagan were able to leverage the Soviets to divulge what happened to Wallenberg, and efforts by a coalition of Jewish educators in the 1980s to at least establish the annual observance of January 17 as “Raoul Wallenberg Day” were equally unsuccessful.

January 27 - commemorates the 1945 capture of the Auschwitz-Birkenau camp complex by the Red Army. On the sixtieth anniversary of that occasion in 2005, the United Nations proclaimed this date to be henceforth a universal observance in memory of the victims of Nazi genocide.

One conundrum: The Red Army features in both cases: once as obstructionist malefactor, and once as hero. Another conundrum: January 17 failed to engage, in spite of extensive efforts, whereas January 27 got the imprimatur of the entire global parliament of nations (although it did take sixty years to gain traction...).

One last conundrum is the “*pars pro toto*” aspect of both dates: Auschwitz-Birkenau was only the most visible and infamous of the forty thousand forced-interment facilities operated by the Nazis. Raoul Wallenberg was one out of the unknown thousands of צדיקי אומות העולם “righteous ones of the peoples of the earth” who risked and lost their lives saving Jews during the War. But perhaps that it is really the way it must be.

The enormity of the tragedy of the Nazi era, and the scope of human suffering over a vast European continental panorama, is such that trying to ponder the prospect of it overloads the mind and shatters the soul. We can only learn one name; we can mention one camp or liquidated *shtetl*; we fix one date (January 17 or 27, or for that matter 27 Nissan for *Yom haSho'ah v'haG'vurah* later this Spring)— and suddenly the swirling wheels-within-wheels find focus and clarity.

May we, on any date in this month (or any other), bear witness to the enduring meaning of Jewish life and of the Jewish mission of service to God— a meaning that transcends any the tragedies (or even triumphs) experienced by our fabulously ancient People.

Welcoming the Queen of Days is our “main event” at JCMI, with shared worship in the beautiful Sanctuary of our shared Temple home every Friday night.

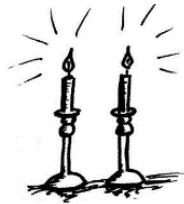

With great gratitude I say good-bye to 2025; gratitude for ultimate outcomes; gratitude that its trials are now behind. Parallely, I look forward to our new year of 2026 bringing healthier and, therefore, happier times for us all.

We begin this new year reading parashah *VaY'chi*. A strikingly fitting portion, if I do say so myself. It contains very significant facets of looking to the future and equally dynamic facets of closure; as for looking to the future (in addition to its containing Jacob's first meeting his grandsons by Joseph), Jacob predicts the future of each of the leaders of the 12 tribes; as for closure, first Jacob dies and is mourned and buried, and then at the end of the portion, Joseph likewise dies and is mourned and buried. Like a new year, it leads us ahead, while placing some closure on the past.

Looking even further ahead and since the February newsletter may well not reach you before the first Shabbat that month, I'm going to mention this, too. As you may recall, each year we have a "musical Shabbat" in which the sermon spot is delivered musically and the musical settings throughout the service are bit more pronounced. This year it's February 6th. For the occasion we have the wonderful treat of Lucille Gaita joining us, gracing us with her superb musical talents. Clearly, this is in no way a concert. We simply look to intensify the spirit of Erev Shabbat for which the musical settings are designed. The rabbi, Lucille and I look forward to sharing both some that are well-known and probably some that are new to you. Again, both looking – and listening – back and looking – and listening – ahead.

May the new year of 2026 provide all that you wish, looking back and moving forward.

Dear Fellow Congregants,

I wanted to reach out on behalf of JCMI's Board and all its members. As most of you know, these past few years have been extremely fiscally challenging for the Congregation. To meet operating shortfalls, the Board was required to draw upon our limited financial reserves to make up for the lack of fundraising. This is because our due's structure, including the Above and Beyond Campaign, alone are not sufficient to meet the annual operating costs of JCMI. This past season, we have successfully established and renewed events and fundraisers that are necessary to support and maintain JCMI's annual cash flow.

We also had an incredibly successful Above and Beyond Campaign that included a generous matching gift from one of our members that enabled the Board to replenish funds drawn from reserves during the Covid years. However, these reserves are not likely to be sufficient to cover expenses the Board is expecting in the coming years, including the cost for a new roof and HVAC systems.
