Yalkut Mordechai: Notes from Rabbi Gross

A Vortel Out-of-Season

I am away from the JCMI community during the Summer months, and will return to the pulpit in September. In the interim, I offer a seasonal thought as a schtikeleh Toyre ("a little slice of Torah") to see the Congregational family through my hiatus months.

An individual who prays only for himself is like one who retires alone into his house, refusing to assist his fellow citizens in the bolstering of their city walls. His expenditure is as great as his risk. But one who joins with the majority spends little, yet remains in safety, because each supplies the defects of the others. The city is in the best possible condition— all its inhabitants enjoying its prosperity with but little expenditure, which all share alike.

In a similar manner, Plato styles that which is expended on behalf of the law "the portion of the whole." If the individual, however, neglects this "portion of the whole," which is the basis of the welfare of the commonwealth of which he forms a part, in the belief that he does better in spending it on himself, he sins against the common welfare— and even more against himself.

For the relation of the individual is as the relation of the single limb to the entire body. Should the arm, in case bleeding is required, refuse its blood, the whole body— the arm included— could suffer. It is, however, the duty of the individual to bear hardships, or even death, for the sake of the welfare of the commonwealth. One must be particularly careful to contribute one's "portion of the whole" without fail.

It is because ordinary speculation did not institute this sense of corporate responsibility that God, in the Torah, prescribed it in the form of tithing of crops; the corners of the field and gleanings left for the needy; and remission of debts in the sabbatical year, as a "portion of the whole" of our worldly property for a greater good.

A Season of the Spirit: Part Two

The Summer ספירה s'firah is the three-week count-down bridging the 17th of Tammuz, the day



on which the besieging Babylonian empire broke through the walls of Jerusalem in 586 BCE, and the 09th of Av, on which they began systematically to dismantle the House of God. These associated traumas may have been long ago, but we Jews are so keenly attuned to the history of our fabulously ancient people that our seasonal remembrance of them constitutes a time-traveling re-experience of

the pain. As such, traditionally the entirety of the Summer ספירה s'firah is a time of restraint and of low-level mourning.

A more uplifting linear count-down begins, later on this Summer, as August 24 inaugurates

the introspective month of Elul. During the entire month leading up to Rosh haShanah and the Ten Days of Repentance, we turn inwards to our own best self; outwards to those we may have wronged during the past year; and upwards to God to aspire always to do better. Make the most of the season... and we'll "See You in September."



The approximate distance between Marco Island, Florida and Goodland, Florida is 4.6 miles. Fascinating.

Obviously, not really. So, why on earth am I mentioning it? Well, I, myself, needed a point of relative reference when I looked up the distance between the spots where Moses (in the Book of Exodus) received the *Ten Commandments* (at Mount Sinai) and where he "once again" (I say "once again" in quotation marks, because, as you probably already know, the two recitations are not identical.) read the *Ten Commandments* (in



the <u>Book of Deuteronomy</u>) (from Mount Nebo - or Horeb) . The approximate distance between the two mountains is 3 miles.

Some of you walk that same distance for exercise.

Perhaps I'm the only ignoramus who had no idea that the two sites were virtually kissing cousins. In any case, though, I was significantly surprised.

When it takes me a long time to find something I have misplaced, it usually also is very near.

And when I make a phone call, whether the recipient of my call is near or far, it takes the same time.

And often a "close" friend is actually quite far.

And my point?

Well, while distance makes a difference, it doesn't really, really have to. For example, our snowbirds - our beloved snowbirds - are gone. We could still have dinner with them. Set a time and eat dinner together (use Facetime or Zoom). Or bring them along in the car (the same way).

In fact, most - certainly, not all, but most - problems can be greatly alleviated with a bit of thought, a but of planning. So, perhaps in consideration of the High Holy Day season upon us in just 2 months, we might just try to lighten our loads and have more happiness and less tension. We then might just find that the mountains we face today are as gifting as those of Moses' days.

May our wonderful times be surprisingly nearer and more rewarding than we can imagine.



I wanted to reach out on behalf of JCMI's Board and all its members. As most of you know, these past few years have been extremely fiscally challenging for the Congregation. To meet operating shortfalls, the Board was required to draw upon our limited financial reserves to make up for the lack of fundraising.
