Yalkut Mordechai: Notes from Rabbi Gross

A Vortel Out-of-Season

I am away from the JCMI community during the Summer months, and will return to the pulpit in September. In the interim, I offer a seasonal thought as a schtikeleh Toyre ("a little slice of Torah") to see the Congregational family through my hiatus months.



A thought on responsibility:

Leviticus 19:26 teaches that "you shall eat nothing with the blood." Rabbi 'Aqiva says that this means that a court which has pronounced a capital sentence must fast for the rest of that day [Midrash Sifra 90b].

A thought on worthy personal aspirations:

The principal merits are: at a wedding, to cause merriment; among mourners, to remain silent; at a lecture, to listen; at a meeting, to arrive early; and at a time of fasting, to make charitable gifts [Babylonian Talmud, B'rachot 6b].

A thought on companionship:

Two dogs tending a flock were constantly quarreling together. But when the wolf attacked one of the dogs, the other thought: "If I do not help my partner today, it may be me that the wolf attacks tomorrow." Thereupon the two dogs at once came to terms, and together drove off the wolf [Babylonian Talmud, Sanhedrin 105a].

A thought on compassion:

Rabbi Huna says that the servers at a feast should be furnished with their own portion of the food after the banquet is over. But if what is being served is a delicacy, such as fat-marbled meat or fine old wine, they should be given their portion at the outset, so that they may be spared a longing for it [Babylonian Talmud, K'tubot 61a].

A thought on complacency:

Rabbi Shim'on ben-El'Azar asks: "How can a person, sitting contentedly in place, promote peace and concord in the community? Let one leave their place, and roam about promoting a larger welfare for others. Seek peace not just in your own dwelling-place, but throughout the world" [Avot d'Rabi Natan 12:6a].

A Season of the Spirit

The seven weeks between Passover and Shavuot not only mark the seasonal grain-harvest in the land of Israel, but also—in terms of linear time, with a sense of history—commemorate the



trek of our Israelite ancestors from Egypt to our meeting with God at Mount Sinai. It is on both counts that Leviticus 23 requires us to literally count the weeks and days from the first day of Passover to the fiftieth-day observance of Shavuot, Feast of Weeks, when we reenact the giving of the Torah.


This marvelous 18th-century Spanish-Portuguese wall calendar has handles at bottom to roll the interior scroll displaying the status of the current date (H for *hoy*, "today"), and the constituent weeks (S for *semanas*) and days (D for *días*) within in the seven-week *'Omer* season. You don't need an antique artwork, or to know Spanish, to fulfill the *mitzvah* of counting the *'Omer*: just remember that May 01 represents Day Twelve ("one week and five days"), and take it from there!

Who'da thunk? Yep. Already we have begun a new season. While this is a new season, it's part of the same, "old" cycle of seasons on Marco Island. It's far from uncommon for me to tie and contrast "old" and "new". Perhaps that comes from my looking at the good, ole *Torah* (or the *Mishnah*, or the *Prophets*, or ...) anew so many times. Those readings, along with who-done-its, keep me well entertained.

Not so entertaining was a recent turn of events that had me less than entertained. The crux of the issue was a hasty, self-centered decision, which left me a victim. While it's been resolved, it still leaves an after taste. We've all been there.



This month we read parashat *K'doshim*. Particularly timely for me. Among many other points in this portion, we read of God ordering the Israelites: "...not to reap all the way to the edges of a field, but to leave some for the poor and the stranger." In other words: provide for oneself, but always provide some for others in need, as well. And in the fall, we will read in parashat *Ki Teitzei*, "When you are harvesting in your field and you overlook a sheaf, do not go back to get it. Leave it for the foreigner, the fatherless and the widow ...". Obviously, the Torah "thinks" this is a message worth communicating in more than one way, lest we miss it due to the choice of wording.

Additionally, we have a similar twist in words attributed to Rabbi Hillel in *Pirkei Avot* (*Ethics of the Fathers*), ethical teachings and maxims of the rabbis of the Mishnaic period: "If I am not for myself, who will be for me? But if I am only for myself, who am I? And if not now, then when?"

Interestingly, I think, in each of these examples, the self is considered first, and others thereafter. That's just like the flight attendant's pre-flight directions about caring for children when oxygen masks are necessary; put on your own first, then the child's. If you yourself are not looked after, you can hardly look after someone else.

Bottom line:

Assess the situation.

NOTE: Make sure you assess the situation accurately. (duh)

Look after yourself first.

Immediately look after others.

Do not put this off.

And repeat.

May this serve all of us well.



Dear Fellow Congregants,

I wanted to reach out on behalf of JCMI's Board and all its members. As most of you know, these past few years have been extremely fiscally challenging for the Congregation. To meet operating shortfalls, the Board was required to draw upon our limited financial reserves to make up for the lack of fundraising. This is because our due's structure, including the Above and Beyond Campaign, alone are not sufficient to meet the annual operating costs of JCMI. This past season, we have successfully established and renewed events and fundraisers that are necessary to support and maintain JCMI's annual cash flow.

We also had an incredibly successful Above and Beyond Campaign that included a generous matching gift from one of our members that enabled the Board to replenish funds drawn from reserves during the Covid years. However, these reserves are not likely to be sufficient to cover expenses the Board is expecting in the coming years, including the cost for a new roof and HVAC systems. Due to our ageing building these costs and others will continue.
