Yalkut Mordechai: Notes from Rabbi Gross

A Vortel Out-of-Season

I am away from the JCMI community during the Summer months, and will return to the pulpit in September. In the interim, I offer a seasonal thought as a schtikeleh Toyre (“a little slice of Torah”) to see the Congregational family through my hiatus months.



The 10th century Iraqi Talmudist Nissim ibn-Shahin frequently used folk tales and fables in his sermons, including this classic first published in 1557:

Once in Baghdad, two neighbors lived in voluntary poverty in the lowest quarter of the town. One was a miserly merchant, who denied himself any pleasure (and who withheld charitable support from those in genuine need) in order to greedily amass all his profits as hidden wealth. The other was a simple Jew, who made do with the bare minimum in order to give generously to others more needy than he, and also so that he could amass the means each week to make a glorious feast in honor of the Shabbat—a habit that had earned him the nickname “Joseph, the Sabbath-honorer.”

Now the magicians and astrologers, who could discern the merchant’s secret wealth, warned him: “Know that this Jewish neighbor of yours is going to acquire and consume all your treasure.” Desperate to prevent this calamity, the merchant secretly converted all his vast fortune into a single very fine gemstone, which he hid in the wrappings of his turban so as to keep it safely by him always.

But one day, as the merchant was walking over a bridge across the Tigris, a blustery winter wind blew his turban off his head and into the River’s depths, where God provided a monstrous carp to swallow the gem it contained.

Not long thereafter, one of the local fishermen caught a carp so large and so fat that none could afford the purchase of it. Finally another fisherman suggested: “Take it to Joseph the Sabbath-honorer, who surely will give you a good price in order to honor the holy Sabbath with such a fine fish.” So the fisher took it to Joseph, who willingly paid the asking price and hastened home to prepare his Shabbat feast.

But upon opening the fish to dress and prepare it, Joseph discovered within it a glistening precious gem, which he sold for a vast sum. Thereby he was delivered from his constant need... and therefrom he constantly gave bountiful *tz’dakah* as an ongoing prayer of thanks to Providence, so that during his lifetime the poor of Baghdad lacked for nothing.

Whether with fish or fowl or good red meat, may your Shabbat be always bountiful, and may your hand in *tz’dakah* be always both filled with bounty and open in generosity.

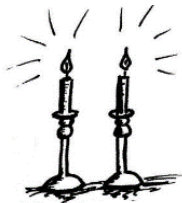

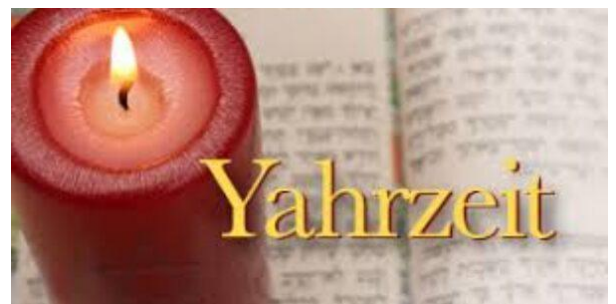
