

## JCMI Task Force Reopening Steps – Approved by the Board April 12, 2021

1. The synagogue will initially open only for members and those who reside in a member's home and guests that can prove vaccination.
2. All attendees must have completed the full complement of vaccinations two weeks prior to the event being attended. Proof of vaccination will be required. Preferably, members will pre-register by sending copies of their COVID vaccination certificate to the synagogue office. Alternatively, all attendees can bring their certificates that night. **No one will be admitted without proof of vaccination and a two-week waiting period** for full immunity to be reached.
3. Attendees must be free of any infectious illness.
4. Temperatures will be taken at the door. Those with a temperature equal to or greater than 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit are not permitted to attend the service and are encouraged to see their health care provider.
5. **ALL** attendees must wear proper **masks** that fit properly snugly around the nose and chin. **Both the mouth and nose must be covered.** Bandanas, gaiters and other makeshift coverings are unacceptable. Masks will be available at the door for those who do not bring a mask with them. 6. Six-foot social distancing should be maintained at all times. Members who live under the same roof may sit together. Groups of up to four people living under the same roof can sit together with their guests, however advanced notice must be given to the synagogue so that chairs can be placed with appropriate social distancing. The distance from the Aliyah table to member seating will be 30 feet.
7. Those honored with Aliyot should remain masked and are expected to recite, rather than sing.
8. The Synagogue will be responsible for:
  - a. The HVAC units will be in good working order with clean filters and able to provide adequate ventilation to the facility.
  - b. Plexiglass barriers will be installed in front of both the Rabbi's and the Cantor's podium.
  - c. Paper Siddurim will be provided for all attendees. Those attending via streaming will be able to download their Siddur prior to services. Attendees are encouraged to reuse their books at future services.
  - d. Hand sanitizing stations will be readily available.
  - e. Revisit these steps on a monthly basis with recommendations from the Task Force
