*Yalkut Mordechai*: Notes from Rabbi Gross

## **Strength— and Even Joy— From Adversity**

At 5:16 on the morning of April 18 in 1906, violent tremors awakened the residents of San Francisco, California, and wreaked havoc on those few who citizens who may have already been up and about at that early hour. Roiling the hillside city at an estimated magnitude of 10 on the Richter scale, and killing more than three thousand people, it is among the most violent tremors in U.S. history, and certainly the deadliest.



Thirty miles away in Palo Alto Stanford University President— and former biology professor— David Jordan frantically scrambled among innumerable shattered jars to salvage and identify tens of thousands of fish specimens tossed from their shelves. And in San Francisco itself, shattered gas lines fueled a blaze that burned for three days, destroying 28,000 buildings (including the newly completed City Hall) and leaving half the population homeless.

Perhaps surprisingly, at the time the plight of bereaved and impoverished San Franciscans invoked little compassion throughout the rest of the country. A prim Victorian America regarded the earthquake as just dispensation from On High against a bawdy and sinful city that was the Las Vegas of its time; one town in Michigan staged a parade to celebrate the disaster.

Isolated both by geography, and by the indifference (and even the gleeful *schadenfreude*) of their fellow Americans, San Franciscans pulled together— across boundaries of race and social class— to mobilize emergency resources and to start rebuilding their city. Driven by a shared disaster that redefined their sense of self, they found reborn resolve and a sense of purpose.

They also found a sense of humor, with laughter helping get past the pain of the moment. Charles Kellogg Field, editor of *Sunset* magazine, pointed out that among the many buildings saved by the heroic local fire brigades was the largest liquor warehouse on the West Coast—an incidental detail he chose to highlight in a little ditty challenging the self-righteous souls Back East who saw the earthquake as punishment from On High:

*If, as some say, God spanked our town    for being over-frisky,  
Why did He burn the churches down,    and save Hotaling's Whisky?*

We Floridians certainly know how a little wittiness offers a quantum of solace in the face of trauma. (I think of the fellow who points out what a great ice chest your washing machine makes, after a hurricane, with the added advantage that it can drain its own melt-water once the power comes back on). And we Jews certainly know the powerful part that humor plays in facing up to pain... which is a large part of the reason that we responded to the Purim story, last month, by “boo”-ing the villain.

Whatever befalls you this month— and in the ensuing months of my seasonal absence— may you respond with strength, humor, and a joy at both the challenges and the rewards of being alive.

**Qabbalat Shabbat Worship - Friday evenings - 7:30.**

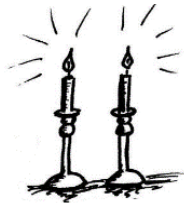
Welcoming the Queen of Days is our “main event” at JCMI, with shared worship in the beautiful Sanctuary of our shared Temple home every Friday night.

**Portion-of-the-Week Torah Study - Saturday mornings, 9:30 a.m.**

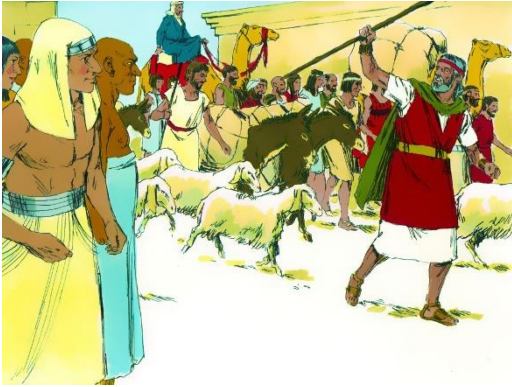

When making *seider* arrangements at home, or stocking in your pantry for the bread-free week of

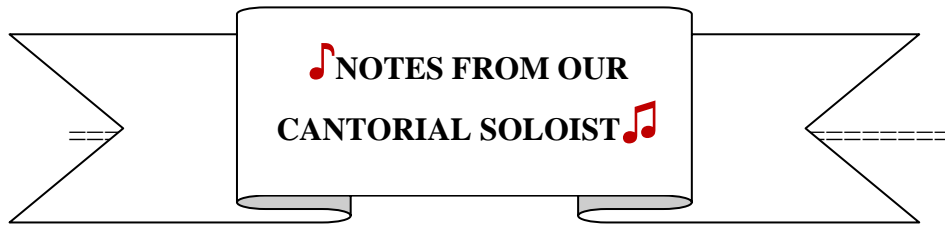

Wow! Passover AND “season” are almost over. Granted, it’s the same experience each year, but it still seems to just creep up on us.

Parallel to the repetition of our experiences at this time of year is the repetition of Torah readings for Shabbat during Passover (verses from *Exodus* and *Numbers*). The readings from *Exodus* include minor highlights like:

Pharoah letting Moses lead the Israelites out of Egypt;

God leading the Israelites to the Sea of Reeds;

The Israelites crossing the Sea of Reeds; and

God destroying the Egyptian army.

Huge moments; huge, big deal. And what follows in the reading from the Book of *Numbers*? It’s seemingly insignificant listings of God’s directed offerings that the Israelites are to carry out. However, let us not forget that the primary biblical synonym for “offerings” is “sacrifices”. And when we take the word “sacrifice” in its broader sense, we find ourselves ensconced in not only a monumental subject, but one with many potential layers of import. Oh, those crafty, little sages and their sneaky symbolism. What often appears simple and, perhaps, boring, often turns out to be very compelling.

Clearly, the Pesach Seider is not the only powerful offering at this time of year.

May this Passover season be filled with meaningful moments for each of us.

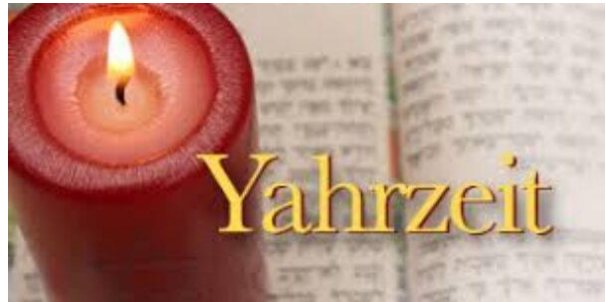

*Dear Fellow Congregants,*

*I wanted to reach out on behalf of JCMI's Board and all its members. As most of you know, these past few years have been extremely fiscally challenging for the Congregation. To meet operating shortfalls, the Board was required to draw upon our limited financial reserves to make up for the lack of fundraising. 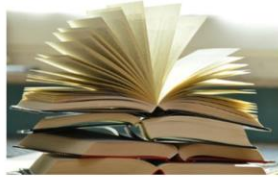

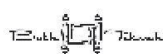
