

REGULAR MEETING  
SHERIDAN VILLAGE COUNCIL  
April 14<sup>th</sup>, 2026

The regular meeting of the Sheridan Village Council was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President McKay.

Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Present: President McKay, Pro-Tem Edelman, and Trustees: Ritter, Wyckoff-McFarland, Wagner, and Pomranky.

Absent: None.

Guests in attendance: Jamie, from Granger Waste Services. AJ, from Republic Services. Lili Patricevic, from Sheridan Community Hospital. Katie Sisson.

Public Comment: Jamie discussed the bid Granger submitted for Village trash removal. AJ discussed the bid Republic submitted for Village trash removal. Lili Patricevic discussed plans for the new hospital and the desire to work closely with the Village throughout the building process. Katie Sisson stated that she was here to get some new details regarding the water project.

Pro-Tem Edelman made a motion to approve the agenda as presented. Trustee Pomranky supported. All ayes, motion passed.

Trustee Pomranky made a motion to approve the minutes from March 30<sup>th</sup>, 2026, Budget/Annual meeting. Trustee Wyckoff-McFarland supported. All ayes, motion passed.

The council reviewed paid bills as of March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2026. Pro-Tem Edelman made a motion to approve the paid bills as presented. Trustee Wyckoff-McFarland supported. All ayes, motion passed.

The council reviewed the Treasurer's report ending March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2026. Pro-Tem Edelman made a motion to approve the report. Trustee Ritter supported. All ayes, Motion passed.

Ed Lingeman, Village Superintendent: Ed discussed progress of water project: adding that Mother Nature is not helping. Currently about a third of the meter pits are in. Work is going on this week on Grant st and continuing to Oak st. Ed also updated Council on progress for the Iron Removal Plant: the building framework will be going up next week, then panels will be added and painted.

Dan Wickes, Assistant Superintendent: Absent.

Cindy Patmore, Office Manager: Cindy reported to Council, that Ed is appreciated more than words can say. He is more than willing to go the extra mile for the staff and residents. She also reported the office seems busier than normal, water bills have been sent and payments are rolling in.

Steve VanHolstyn, Code Enforcement Officer: Steve presented Council with an update on outstanding ordinance violations, also noting that our contract with the Police department has helped clear the violation before it escalates.

Brandon Stowell, Fire Chief: Absent. Deputy Chief VanHolstyn presented Council with an update on calls for the Fire department. He also reported that the Fire department has joined the "I'm Safe" program, a program to help prevent child abuse. Steve also reported that the Fire department was able to help a cub scout group achieve a badge by coming to the Fire barn and washing a truck. He also reminded everyone of the change to the Tornado siren; testing will now be the first Wednesday of the month at 11 a.m.

McKala Robert, Community Center: MaKala reported that reservations for the Community Center are coming in steadily for open houses and receptions.

#### Committee Reports:

Budget: Nothing to report.

Personnel/Community Center: Nothing to report.

Property/Ordinance: Trustee Wagner reported that Bush Hardware has started preliminary steps towards their new building.

Equipment: Nothing to report. Nothing to report.

#### Old Business:

Emergency call in number for Village residents: This is still being researched and will stay on old business until complete.

Firework Ordinance: Pro-Tem Edelman questioned if the ordinance needs all definitions, if not can we cut some of that out. Cindy will check with Attorneys and have the ordinance reviewed.

#### New Business:

Sheridan Community Hospital: Lili gave updates during public comment; no further discussion was held.

Review Waste Bids: Bids received from Grange and Republic were discussed. Trustee Wyckoff-McFarland made a motion to award the contract to Republic with an amendment adding the Community Center dumpster to the Municipal contract. Pro-Tem Edelman supports. All ayes. Motion passed.

Closing Comments: President McKay reminded everyone that Springfest is just around the corner and if you have time to assist, please do.

Pro-Tem Edelman discussed Village beautification and addressed the appearance of the downtown buildings. Cindy will check into Downtown Development grants.

Pro-Tem Edelman made a motion to adjourn. Trustee Wyckoff-McFarland supported. All ayes, motion passed. Meeting adjourned at 8:16 pm.
