

REGULAR MEETING  
SHERIDAN VILLAGE COUNCIL  
December 9<sup>th</sup>, 2025

The regular meeting of the Sheridan Village Council was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President McKay.

Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Present: President McKay, Pro-Tem Edelman, and Trustees: Ritter, Wyckoff-McFarland, Wagner, and Pomranky.

Absent: None

Guests in attendance: Curt and Katie Sisson, Kristin Kilduff.

Public Comment: Kristin stated she was here to get information on the water project and police presence in Sheridan. Curt and Katie Sisson stated they were here to find out about the decision on fluoride in the water.

Trustee Wyckoff-McFarland made a motion to approve the agenda as presented. Trustee Pomranky supported. All ayes, motion passed.

Trustee Ritter made a motion to approve the minutes from November 11<sup>th</sup>, 2025, regular meeting. Trustee Wagner supported. All ayes, motion passed.

The council reviewed paid bills as of December 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2025. Pro-Tem Edelman made a motion to approve the paid bills as presented. Trustee Wyckoff-McFarland supported. All ayes, motion passed.

The council reviewed the Treasurer's report ending December 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2025. Trustee Wagner made a motion to approve the report. Trustee Pomranky supported. All ayes, Motion passed.

Ed Lingeman, Village Superintendent: Ed reported that he had received several complaints regarding Winterfest (Tree of Lights). The complaints were about the road closures and detour routes. Also, in reference to the lack of parking near downtown. The Village office received a letter from Bush Hardware that Ed also presented to Council. President McKay responded that these things were discussed at the Springfest meeting on Monday and a plan had been developed to address these concerns going forward. A discussion also occurred regarding where the parade entries could line up.

Ed also reported that the water project had halted work for the winter and will start again around the middle of March. He also stated that work had started on the wells to get them ready for the

project. The iron filtration plant has been delayed by EGGLE, due to permits needed for the retention pond.

Dan Wickes, Assistant Superintendent: Nothing to report.

Cindy Patmore, Office Manager: Cindy reported that there will be a price increase for the vouchers that the Village gives to the residents and we will keep that in mind when budget talks start.

Steve VanHolstyn, Code Enforcement Officer: Steve reported that notices had been served and he turned it over to Officer Richmond for a report. Officer Richmond reported on 13 addresses that had been cited for blight and/or nuisance ordinance violations. He also reported on enforcement activity. Trustee Wyckoff-McFarland inquired on the time frame the residents had to address the notices that were served. Steve explained the time frame to her.

Brandon Stowell, Fire Chief: Absent. Steve reported in his absence that the fire department was again participating in "Stuff a Bus" this year. He also stated that they had interviewed 4 applicants and hired 3 new firefighters. Recent calls have mostly been automobile crashes and wires down.

McKala Robert, Community Center: Absent. Cindy reported that she and McKala had put up a tree and decorated the Community Center for the holiday and renters have reported back that they love it.

Vote on removal of Fluoride: President McKay opened the floor for anyone that wanted to further address the removal of Fluoride from the water supply. Trustee Wyckoff-McFarland stated that she still disagreed with it, as she had at the previous months meeting.

Trustee Wagner made a motion to remove fluoride from the water supply. Pro-Tem Edelman supported. Vote resulted in 4 ayes and 1 nay. Motion passed.

President McKay's Comments:

President McKay stated that Winterfest went well, there was a good turnout and traffic issues will be further discussed. He went on to wish everyone present to have an enjoyable and safe holiday.

Trustee Wyckoff-McFarland made a motion to adjourn. Trustee Ritter supported. All ayes, motion passed. Meeting adjourned at 7:32 pm.
