

**Clearview Seniors Golf Club Board of Governors
Minutes of the Meeting held October 28, 2025.**

George Diamond called the meeting to order at 10:09 AM at Mr. Diamond's House. The meeting began with the Board members reciting "The Pledge of Allegiance", and a moment of silence was observed to honor all past deceased members and those members who are ill.

Minutes:

Secretary Giudice read the minutes from the September 30th Board Meeting and moved to accept the Minutes, Mr. Katz scolded the motion and the motion passed.

Financial Report:

Mr. Coburn was hospitalized and unable to provide a Treasurer's Report. Mr. Giudice gave an unofficial statement. He reported that there were 27 members that had submitted their dues to date. Given 48 members pay their dues along with the carry-over from 2025 the Club should begin 2026 with around \$10,000.

The Club has received "non-profit status and is allowed to seek refunds for sales taxes for the past three years. Mr. Diamond, having such experiences in his business, cautioned the Club in seeking the refunds stating that there are unintended consequences for doing so.

Outings:

Mr. Blohm attended the meeting to present a 2026 proposal for a Club Outing outside of the Clearview course. He stated that he could secure a Long Island Country Club venue for the golf Club next year. The proposal would include golf, a full breakfast, hamburger and hot dogs at the turn and a complete dinner. A minimum of One Hundred (100) participants would be required and the price would be \$325. There was a lengthy discussion of the pros and cons for such an Outing but The Board concluded that the 100 golfer commitment plus the hefty price tag was not possible.

Constitution & By-Laws

Mr. Schultheiss stated that 2026 will be a year to change or amend the By-Laws. He urged the Board members to review the contents of the Constitution and By-Laws and note possible enhancements to the doctrine.

Old Business:

There was a discussion to modify the Awards Dinner event at Verdi's. The discussion centered around saving the \$3800 price tag and holding the Awards Event at our September BBQ Outing

at Clearview. The proposal for this approach was put up for a vote and the members voted in favor of adopting the change to the Awards Dinner.

Mr. Aiello presented the list of Club members, with handicaps, to their assigned Flight in the new 3 tier flight arrangement. Given the uncertainty of returning members the flights show about 17 golfers in each of the 3 flights. The scores for September and October rounds will count towards the 10 round qualification for Championship play.

The proposal for starting the golf season in May was considered citing weather uncertainties for April weather. After a discussion there were many that felt the Club should continue to provide the opportunity for April play since those disliking the conditions are not forced to play.

Mr. Bass suggested that we introduce a \$500 prize for any guest that gets a hole-in-one as an incentive to recruiting new members. After a discussion the proposal was not adopted.

New Business:

Mr. Katz noted that the Club lacks a photographer and should recruit one from the members.

Mr. Feilich will send out a notice inviting a member to volunteer as a Club Photographer.

Adjourn:

Mr. Katz moved to adjourn the meeting, Mr. Diamond seconded the motion, and the members voted in favor. The Meeting ended at 11:15AM.
