AHSOW At The LOL Convention

Hey everyone. Something different is happening at the convention this year, possibly for the first time ever. At least, I don't recall it happening before, and I've been barbershopping for nearly half a century. There's gonna be an AHSOW Room this year! If you're not someone who goes to International or Midwinter where these opportunities happen regularly, you may not know what AHSOW is. It's an organization for woodshedders. (In keeping with the fine traditions of the SPEBSQSA founders, AHSOW is an acronym for Ancient Harmonious Society Of Woodshedders.) We make up our notes "on the fly" rather than sing arrangements, pole cats, or tags. It's the way barbershop used to be done. Indeed, it wasn't even legal to sing written arrangements in contests at one time.

It's challenging and a lot of fun. A foursome picks a song (often from one of our booklets that only contains words and melodies), and someone sings lead. The adventure begins when others pick a part to sing and make up their parts spontaneously, trying to harmonize to the implied harmony of the song. Discovering chords and where you fit into the each as you go along is the challenge. You "gotta have your ears on", so you can hear if you're doubling someone unnecessarily or what note might be missing. It's often said that "there are no wrong notes - just better choices", but the goal is to end up being able to sing the whole song thru with as few clinkers as possible. Some people think it's gotta be impossible, but I promise, it's not. We'll start you off with some easier ones and move to tougher ones as your skills improve. It's not a "spectator sport" either. Until we work things out, the melody singer will most likely sing slowly to give everyone a chance to hear where things may be going. It often only takes a melody note and one harmony note to suggest what the other 2 notes need to be, and sometimes only the melody note in context to "hear" the chords before they happen and find your note.

Whether you're an old hand at it or never done it before, you're welcome to come and give it a try. The room will be open in the downstairs boardroom on the main floor of the hotel, just to the left of the main doors. Things get started at 9:30 Friday night. As a barbershopper, I'm sure most, if not all of you, have sung notes in your quartet or chorus that you thought fit better than what was written. If so, you've been woodshedding without knowing it. The people in your quartet or your chorus director probably didn't appreciate your efforts, but at AHSOW, we encourage it. Please stop by and give it a try. It's a blast!

How is MY Chapter Doing? That is an important question for all LOL Chapters to ask themselves! Sadly, we lost two more Chapters in the last year, and the Chapter Support Committee has identified FOURTEEN more that could fold in the next two years. Is your Chapter one of them? There are many resources on the LOL website to support your Chapter. Check them out at: https://loldistrict.org/chapter-development. Or, give me a call...!'m happy to help!

Don't forget the ongoing **LOL programs** available to assist your Chapter development efforts:

- A Chapter Show Grants subsidize registered District Quartets to perform at your show for up to \$750 per Chapter per year.
- A Chapter Development Grants provide up to \$1,000 per Chapter per year to promoteyour Chapter or pay for resources to help your Chorus in your musical development.
- A Visioning Retreats provide a method to survey your Chapter and bring consultants to guide your conversations on how to focus your efforts toward growth and development.
- A Take Coaching to the Chapter helps identify and pay the mileage for bringing a coach to choruses who want to improve their performance packageor basic repertoire.

In order to more effectively support our Chapters, your LOL Board we decided to increase the focus of our Chapter Liaison Program. Beginning in 2026, we will replace the Liaisons with **CHAPTER MENTORS**. A District Mentor will work with one or two Chapters to learn the strengths present and challenges facing their Chapters and to support them with resources from the District and other Chapters within the LOL. The goal is to help Chapters be as successful as they can be.

The District organization will also shift from two regions to **THREE DIVISIONS**. The composition of the Divisions is still in process but may be something like this:

- A The East Division will be composed of 14 Chapters in Wisconsin and Upper Michigan, with Mike Ziegler as Division Vice President.
- A The Central Division will likely be composed of 11-14 Chapters in Minnesota and Wisconsin, with Arv Zenk as Division Vice President.
- A The West Division is likely to be made up of 7-10 Chapters in Minnesota, North Dakota and Canada, with Brent Gerber as Division Vice President.

Mike, Arv and Brent are seeking those who might be interested in becoming mentors. There will be a class offered to train mentors at the **Harmony Academy** on January 9-10 at UW-River Falls! (Yes, it's new name for the Leadership Training Academy and not just for leaders anymore!!) Put it on your calendar today!

The lab holds the Guinness World Record for the quietest place on Earth with its anechoic chamber, which measures at an astonishing -9.4 decibels. Join the quartets as they sing a tag in a space where all sound reflections are eliminated, allowing every nuance of the human voice to be heard in unmatched clarity.

In addition to the anechoic chamber, the quartets will be singing in the lab's reverberation room, designed to create the exact opposite effect. Here, sound lingers and bounces, enhancing overtones and offering a dramatic environment for vocal music. Orfield Labs also holds the distinction of being home to the first digital recording studio in the world, making it a true historical landmark where you can join the quartets for another tag.




