Throughout 2024 we have seen stabilization of the membership in our singing community, and several of our groups are beginning to grow again.

- •Here we are again! What Jay called last year our "Family Reunion". Well more than 500 of our friends and family are here to enjoy the music, the good times, and especially each other's company.
- •Your district leadership meets virtually or in person at least ten months each year. This is on top of smaller committee and work group tasks that do all things great and small and allow us all to enjoy

our hobby. Many have served for years in various capacities, and some are newer to the game, but I believe we owe them all our sincere gratitude for their time and talent.

- •The District remains in very solid financial shape. The balance sheet remains strong, meaning our funding to invest in our chapters as well as all contingency funding are in rock solid shape. This continues to be influenced positively by direct charitable contribution.
- •Last year, our district membership was around 930 people. As of BHS official accounting ending 9/30, the LOL membership rolls had grown to 947 people. Kind of cool, huh? What would we look like getting ourselves back over 1000 by the end of 2025? How many





more positively impacted lives, new talents discovered, workload spread out more, and all the other great things that comes with growth could that afford us? We know also that our chapters have IO-15% more singers that are participating

without benefit of membership. Jay is spearheading a lot of work to show the value in membership, and different ways of approaching it. We continue to want to hold those close who love our harmony and not run them off, and work to embrace them within our structure rather than from afar.

•Our District Grants program has continued to actively help our chapters get music to the people. Such diverse things as website and PR funding to bringing LOL district champs to shows our ears remain open to your requests. We are not in a white-hot hurry to just spend money, but this will be the second year running that we have budgeted more for grants than what has been requested or given back. Details are on our LOL Website.

•Jim Rasmus has done a bang-up job with our regional VPs in getting our arms around what is actually going on in our chapters and more importantly, what is needed to attain success in whatever way your singing community defines that success. Please actively embrace Mike Ziegler and Justin McCullough as they reach out to your chapters. They are asking the questions out of a place of helpfulness, not nosiness or judgment. Let us know how you can best be helped.

•Finally, BHS is wisely trying to use the vast

underutilized volunteer network native to our world. There are current opportunities for such things as ambassadors who can be sounding boards and answer centers at conventions like these. They will be versed in knowing what is happening at the International level and able to carry messages both ways – from and to BHS – in a more direct fashion than before.

They are also looking for volunteers to pick up some off hours call center time. There is work being done that I am a part of investigating what our Barbershop "Brand" is, and a short-term work group to explore that is being seated soon... And as will be mentioned here in a moment, entire chapters are being asked to volunteer to explore differing means of serving the members by charging for those things seen of value and precious little else.

This means that there are opportunities to become involved in great and small ways, regardless of where you live, size of chapter or whatever. Please raise your hands when you hear of these projects and we will work to find you the best avenue to use your talents and time.

This has been a year of stretching, learning and growing for us all. It is a sincere pleasure for me that you trust the leadership of this great board to move us even more forward. Especially in the LO'L, It is great to be a barbershopper!

# I'M HAPPY TO ANNOUNCE THE **LO'L GRANTS AND PROGRAMS** WILL CONTINUE IN 2025!

- Chapter Show Grants support up to \$750 for District Quartets to perform at your show.
- Chapter Development Grants provide up to \$1,000 to help you promote your Chapter in your community through advertising or public relations or provide resources for creative projects to help your Chorus in your musical development.

(One intriguing grant is funding a consultant who specializes in non-profit organizations to assist them to engage more senior men in their chorus!) Stay tuned for those results.

Larry Lewis and I have now completed three *Visioning Retreats*, which engage Chapters in a three-hour conversation to develop goals to move their Chapter forward. Though we can't take credit, we noted the Stevens Point Chapter (our first retreat participant) just received recognition as the Most Improved Chorus at District Convention....

Although I hate bringing it up, we need to face the facts: 10 LOL Chapters have folded since the Pandemic and 2 Chapters will cease singing by the end of 2024. Our research tells us up to 9 additional Chapters may not survive to see 2026.... It is our hope that our efforts will help struggling Chapters to grow and develop. Let us know how we can help!

# Land O' Lakes 2024 Fall Convention, October 11th and 12th

Thanks to everyone who got on-board the LO'L Harmony Express and participated at our 2024 Fall Convention! There were about 800 people who enjoyed the camaraderie, performances, contests and fun that make up our convention.

We started the convention early Friday morning with free quartet coaching and the performances by those quartets early in the afternoon. Our House of Delegates and our District Board met and elected next year's board of directors Friday afternoon. In addition, the Association of District Champs met, BHS Sponsored a Listening Session and the All-Chapter Chorus rehearsed. Then, starting at 5:00 PM we enjoyed the first round of the quartet competition that included 28 quartets. We then announced our 2024 Barbershopper Of The Year, Jim Rasmus. After announcing the 10 quartets that advanced to the finals round, the judges and other quartets held feedback sessions late into the evening.

Saturday started at 9:00 AM with the chorus competition that included 17 choruses. Right after lunch we had the quartet finals round. We then inducted our 2024 Hall of Fame recipients, Dave Sylte, Dave Speidel and Gordon Billows. And then announced all of our competition winners. A special congratulations to Spice, our District Quartet Champion, Forward Harmony, our District Chorus Champion, Northwoods, our District Seniors Quartet Champion and Late Nite, our District Novice Quartet Champion. In addition, both Coulee Classic and First Ave qualified for the International Quartet Competition and Checkmate qualified for the International Seniors Quartet Competition.

Following the competitions our attendees enjoyed an afternoon of tag-singing, Polecats and just being with friends, old and new. Then at 6:30 PM about 350 of us enjoyed a banquet and another 100 joined us for the Showcase performances. The All-Chapter chorus

kicked off the show, followed by 11 quartets and we wrapped up the Showcase with the Association of District Champions chorus. We also announced the Joe Liles Lifetime Achievement Award winners for 2024: Carl Grahn and Chuck Schubbe (posthumously).

The Hospitality rooms started about 9:30 PM with about 300 people gathering to sing and also hear more performances by our quartets. And sometime in the wee hours of the morning the last of us went to bed and our convention concluded.

Our events team, led by Jay Althof, is dedicated to improving the experience year after year. Technology plays a key role in this ongoing effort. One area we're focused on is enhancing our media. We've upgraded our sound and lighting and made significant changes to how we capture performances on video. This includes using higher-quality cameras with multiple angles and integrating our video direction with the sound system for superior audio recordings.

To achieve this, we brought in Johnathon Purvis, a fellow barbershopper with extensive experience recording barbershop performances, including the Wisconsin Youth Festival. While we encountered a few minor delays in getting the videos out to performers, we ultimately delivered them successfully and received positive feedback. We're committed to further enhancing video quality and

exploring new services like individual audio recordings and, if possible, webcasting.

We're also improving our photography. We commissioned Todd Mueller, another talented barbershopper, to capture contest pictures, and the results are a significant improvement over previous years. We're already discussing how to elevate the quality even further.

A huge thank you to both Todd and Johnathon for their hard work, not just during the convention, but in the weeks following, diligently editing pictures and videos to ensure top-notch quality.

Finally, we've made strides in improving our website and contest registration process. Todd Smith has dedicated countless hours to keeping our website current and streamlining online registration. Todd is fantastic to work with, always fulfilling requests promptly and offering valuable suggestions for improvement. Thank you, Todd!

If you have a chance, please express your gratitude to these incredible men for their dedication and countless volunteer hours. They truly deserve it!

That will enable you to download to your computer the most current form for use. This will also show the current fee for each performance you have. Two shows, even on the same date means two times the amount shown. Complete the form, print, sign, then send one copy along with the check. I will sign and forward the paperwork to Society. If you wish to email the form without printing, please type your name in the chapter member space.

A few years ago, Society updated policy and now ALL shows, even freewill shows need a show clearance form and payment of fees.

# Seven Habits of Highly Effective People

Dr. Stephen Covey penned one of the most influential leadership books of the Twentieth century. Here is a brief recap of his famous list:



#### 1. Be Proactive

- Make your behavior a function of your decisions, instead of a function of conditions.
- 2. Begin with the End in Mind
  - Never lose sight of the target. Build the appropriate foundations to get where you're going.
- 3. Put First Things First
  - "Major on the majors." Put the big rocks in the jar first. High-percentage budget numbers are the biggest opportunity for analysis. Keep priorities in order.
- 4. Think Win/Win
  - In Win/Lose approaches, everyone loses.
- 5. Seek First to Understand, Then be Understood
  - No one was ever convinced by someone whom that person thought wouldn't be willing to be convinced otherwise themselves. If you want to *influence*, you first have to *listen*. And listen to *understand*, not to *win an argument*.
- 6. Synergize
  - Build upon differences (think Win/Win), instead of multplying negativity.
- 7. Sharpen the Saw
  - Always take the time to study yourself and others who have done what you've done and what you want to do. Every great idea has already been said before, and by someone who didn't think of it.

They have made arrangements to have this quartet give a master class to area choral students in the morning and afternoon of Friday, April 11th at two locations.

It is wonderful to see the enthusiasm of area educators as they inspire our local youth. Singing can be a lifelong source of joy and is worthy of all our support.






# Incoming District Treasurer Matt Nagel
