Land O' Lakes 2025 Fall Convention,

October 10th and 11th



Thanks to everyone who participated at our 2025 Fall Convention! There were about 700 people who enjoyed the comradery, performances, contests and fun that make up our convention.

We started the convention early Friday morning with free quartet coaching and the performances by those quartets early in the afternoon. Our House of Delegates and our District Board met and elected next year's board of directors Friday afternoon. In addition, the Association of District Champs met, BHS Sponsored a Listening Session and the All-Chapter Chorus rehearsed. Then, starting at 4:00 PM we enjoyed the first round of the quartet competition that included 32 quartets. We then announced our 2025 Barbershopper Of The Year, Justin McCullogh. After announcing the 12 quartets that advanced to the finals round, the judges and other quartets held feedback sessions late into the evening. The rest of us enjoyed a few beverages, did a little singing in the AHSOW room and looked forward to the next day.

Saturday started at 9:00 AM with the chorus competition that included 15 choruses. Right after lunch we had the quartet finals round. We then inducted our 2025 Hall of Fame recipients, Mike Lietke, James Estes and Frank Marzocco. And then announced all of our competition winners. A special congratulations to Jukebox, our District Quartet Champion, Midwest Vocal Express, our District Chorus Champion, Nightcap, our District Seniors Quartet Champion, What's New, our District Novice Quartet Champion and Frostbite, our NextGen Varsity Quartet Champion. And Northwoods qualified for the International Seniors Quartet Competition.

Following the competitions our attendees enjoyed an afternoon of tag-singing, Polecats and just being

with friends, old and new. Then at 6:30 PM about 275 of us enjoyed a banquet and another 100 joined us for the Showcase performances. The All-Chapter chorus kicked off the show, followed by the Association of District Champions chorus and 6 quartets. We also announced the Joe Liles Lifetime Achievement Award winners for 2025: Jack Edgerton and Dick Staedt.

The Hospitality and AHSOW rooms started about 9:15 PM with about 300 people gathering to sing and also hear more performances by our quartets. And sometime in the wee hours of the morning the last of us went to bed and our convention concluded.

As you can imagine, there is a tremendous amount of time and effort required to plan and deliver our conventions. Tribute to Frank Marzocco

Frank Marzocco was a proud member of the Barbershop Harmony Society for more than 50 years — a respected director, songwriter, coach, and arranger whose passion for harmony touched countless lives. Over the decades, he directed the Greendale, Milwaukee, Midwest Vocal Express, and Heart of Harmony choruses, as well as the beloved Milwaukee Showcase Chorus of Sweet Adelines.

Frank was known for his extraordinary creativity and flair for producing chapter shows that were truly "out of the box," often featuring his signature "multimillion-dollar" production numbers that delighted both performers and audiences alike. His original songs and arrangements have been performed around the world - including "I Miss Mother Most of All" and "Fun In Just One Lifetime". Early in his barbershop music career he enjoyed an enriching collaborative relationship with Joe Liles.

As a lead singer with the quartets Shear Delight and Easy Days, Frank entertained audiences for more than 40 years, especially within senior communities who adored his warmth and humor. He loved mentoring new and established quartets and choruses, generously sharing his knowledge, encouragement, and joy for the craft. His contributions were recently recognized with his induction into the Land O' Lakes Barbershop Hall of Fame.

A lifelong resident of Waukesha, Frank graduated from Waukesha High School and proudly served in the Army Reserves for 14 years.

Frank will be deeply missed by his many friends and family, but especially his wife of 47 years, Linda. Linda also known to many in the Barbershop community as a masterful, champion performer.

I write this as a fan of Frank's who has sung under his direction; sung many of his arrangements; was coached by him; and sang with him in quartets when a member would not be able to perform. It is he that I credit for switching me to tenor (from Baritone) on the day of an MVE performance when illness and snow prevented our established tenors from performing. I also golfed with him many times. This means I have stories for another day.

Later, he honored me by asking me to coach his choruses and turned quartets my way for the same coaching.

So yes, to know Frank was to have a Frank story. And I have mine. And I am happy to tell them.

A Celebration of Frank's life will be held this spring on his 90th Birthday, May 23, 2026 — a joyful remembrance of a man whose song will live on in the hearts of all who knew him. Knowing his health was waning, this was his wish. Not people awash in tears, but in great memories. Telling stories. Did I mention I have stories?

Will miss the Maestro.



As I look back on my years singing barbershop, I am very grateful for the educational opportunities provided by the Land O'Lakes District and the Barbershop Harmony Society! I have been to Harmony University five times (twice with my quartet) and have lost track of the LTA's I've attended.

Whether you are a newly elected or returning officer, or just interested in furthering your singing skills, the time is now to make plans to attend the (newly renamed) **District Harmony Academy at UW-River Falls January 9-10, 2026**. Trust me: if you want to improve your singing, enjoy a weekend with your larger barbershop family, and learn new ways to help your Chapter grow and develop, you will want to be there!

As your District continues to invest in our Chapters, we have even made it easier to participate!

- Each Land O'Lakes Chapter may send two (2) students to Harmony Academy, tuition free!
- 2. Additionally, the newly established **District**Harmony Grant will provide financially challenged Chapters up to four additional
 (4) free tuition and up to \$250
 reimbursement for mileage and hotel expenses. Grant application forms and further information were sent to Chapter Presidents. Secretaries and Treasurers.
- 3. Stay tuned for the details about the continuation of **Chapter Show Grants** and **Chapter Development Grants**.

Your District wants to do everything we can to help your Chapter be all it can be!

The other breaking news is the District organization will shift from two regions to **THREE DIVISIONS** in 2026. The reason for this change is to attempt to put resources closer to our Chapters. A **District Mentor** will soon be assigned to work with one or two Chapters to connect you with the resources you may need to grow your Chapter. The new Division structure will look like this:

- A The East Division will be composed of 14 Chapters in Wisconsin and Upper Michigan: Appleton, Delta County (MI), Green Bay, Greendale, Lake Geneva, Madison, Manitowoc, Menomonee Falls, Milwaukee, Oshkosh, Racine, Rock Valley, Stevens Point, and West Allis. Mike Ziegler will serve as their Division Vice President.
- A The CENTRAL DIVISION will include 11 Chapters with Arv Zenk as Division Vice President: Dunn County, WI; Faribault, MN; Greater St Paul, MN; Hilltop, MN; LaCrosse, WI; LeRoy, MN; Mankato, MN; Minneapolis, MN; Polk County, WI; St Croix Valley, MN; and Windom, MN.
- A The WEST DIVISION will be composed of have 9 Chapters with Brent Gerber as Division VP: Bismark-Mandan, ND; Fargo-Moorhead; Fergus Falls, MN; Winnipeg, MB; Western ND, (Dickinson); Thunder Bay, ON; Duluth-Superior; St Cloud, MN; and Willmar, MN.

Selling Ads – A Guide for Croix Chordsmen Members

Based on Jack Novak's tips for selling ads for Indianhead Chorus Edited and adapted by Walt Ogburn for The Croix Chordsmen

Selling ads in our show program is one of the most important ways we raise funds to support our chorus. This guide is designed to give you a clear, simple process to follow and the confidence that you can succeed. Remember —every ad sold helps us share the gift of harmony with our community.

1. Set Your Goal

- Decide how many ads you'd like to sell or how much revenue you want to generate.
- Make it realistic but challenging—goals keep you motivated.
- Block out time in your calendar for this project.

2. Be Prepared

- Carry ad price sheets, order forms and chorus business cards.
- Bring free tickets (if available) to offer as part of the ad package.
- Have a copy of last year's program book to show examples.
- Define the area or businesses you'll approach.
- Dress neatly in your chorus shirt (veterans: a service cap can be a great conversation starter).

3. Make a Great First Impression

- Walk in with a smile and positive attitude.
- Greet the first employee warmly; ask to speak with the owner or manager.
- If the owner isn't available, leave your card and ad sheet, and ask for a good time to return.

4. Present the Offer Keep it simple and clear:

- Our Standard Offer:
- \$125 for a business-card size ad
- Includes 6 free tickets (\$90 value)
- Tickets can be used by the owner, staff, or customers
- Larger ad sizes also available

5. Handle Objections

- If they hesitate, show examples of other ads.
- Emphasize the value: advertising + free tickets = great community exposure.
- If they decline, thank them, leave your information, and move on, many will reconsider.

6. Close the Sale

- If they say YES:
 - Thank them enthusiastically.
 - Fill out the advertiser enrollment form.
 - Collect ad copy or business card (or explain how to send later).
 - Hand over the free tickets.
 - Ask if they'd like to purchase additional tickets.
- Record their info in your prospect log right away.

7. Motivation & Example

Jack followed this approach and sold 40 ads—38 from new businesses—raising over \$3,500. If he can do it, you can too!

Chordsmen Score Success in Music Education Fundraiser

The Clipper City Chordsmen of Manitowoc Wisconsin held a fundraiser concert entitled "Teach the World to Sing" on Saturday September 20th at the Franciscan Center for Music Education and Performance. This effort raised nearly \$16,000 which will be shared equally with all high school vocal music programs in Manitowoc County as well as the Franciscan Center music program.

Ten years ago, the Chordsmen updated their mission statement to reflect a desire to do more for their community. As a part of the Mission Statement, the Chordsmen "...strive to improve the quality of life for (their) members and (their) communities through music education and family-friendly musical entertainment." This revision inspired the members to get more involved with their local music educators by volunteering to assist as door monitors and helpers for solo and ensemble contests, attending local high school musical productions and concerts, and by offering help directly to local educators with musical charts, learning tracks, coaching of student quartets, offering scholarships for summer music programs, and inviting the choruses to participate on their annual Christmas Show.

Anthony Schreiter, who serves as the treasurer for the Chordsmen, pointed out that "Our educators are always under substantial budgetary restrictions. The cost of musical charts and tracks has gone up, the cost of transportation for enrichment experiences has risen, and the cost of show outfits has also climbed. If we could help in some way to make vocal music education affordable to more kids, we wanted to do that."

In 2023, the Chordsmen put on a fundraiser show at Woodland Dunes Nature Center titled "Tunes at the Dunes." Despite the limited seating of only 120, they raised over \$1,000

with donations and revenue from raffle baskets. This money was donated directly to two local high schools.

In 2024, a larger fundraiser show was held at the Franciscan Center for Music Education and Performance in Manitowoc with seating of over 450. With the chorus from Two Rivers High School and instrumental music students from the Franciscan Center performing alongside the Chordsmen, nearly \$7,000 was raised. Checks for \$650 were delivered to eight school districts in Manitowoc County as well as to the Franciscan Center.

The 2025 show included the Valders High School Concert and Treble Choirs with their director Tami Witter and the Lutheran High School Lancer Singers under the direction of Joel Ungemach. Recently retired WBAY-TV News anchor celebrity Bill Jartz was the MC for the program.

Chapter quartets Lake Effect, Quandary, Barberpops, Late Expectations, Pass the Buck, and the Harmony To Go ensemble also performed. To make this day even more special, the Chordsmen reached out to men in their community who were willing to learn three songs along with the chorus and to sing with them on stage at the end of the show. Over a dozen volunteers attended the first special rehearsal as an indication of the level of community support for music.

The song "I'd Like to Teach the World to Sing" was the inspiration for this year's fundraiser. Performed by all 85 participants on stage as a finale, the reception by the 350 supporters in attendance was overwhelming.

In addition to musical performances, there was a raffle of multiple gift baskets. Admission was free, but a donation to help support the music programs was encouraged. Every dollar donated went directly to area school music departments since all overhead for the program was already covered by donations.

Supporting Music Education is a key mission of the Clipper City Chordsmen. According to a variety of experts, musical training has been shown to lead to improvements in a wide variety of different skills including memory and spacial learning as well as verbal memory, the ability to focus attention, and emotional control. Music in our schools is essential to the production of well-rounded students.

Chordsman Jon Cisewski said "On stage I was taken back to singing in high school some 45 years ago and it occurred to me that this is something that these students could remember all their lives. Some things like participation in sports may end after high school or college, but music follows you through your entire life."

This thought was echoed by Gary Neustadter who commented "As a past music educator it was especially magical to reconnect with high school level students and to share music with them as equal performers together rather than as their director. It was a great opportunity to have youthful singers and guys up to five times their age on stage together."

Chordsman President Bill Fricke was thankful. "The generosity of the lakeshore community was amazing. We even received some very substantial donations that were given in memory of recently deceased family members who had loved music in all its forms. That those families wanted to support music education as part of their legacy was inspiring."

When presenting the checks to the educators and their choruses, the gratitude was clearly evident. Stephanie Maertz of Reedsville commented "Now we can not only afford the cost of transportation to take our kids to the Singing in Wisconsin festival choir experience, but ALL our kids can attend without individual costs holding them back." In addition to affording new music and transportation to events, other uses for the funds will include helping buy new risers for concerts and replacing show choir outfits..

The Clipper City Chordsmen is an all-male cappella barbershop chorus of 34 members in a county with a population of only 81,000. They are located between Milwaukee and Green Bay on the shore of Lake Michigan. Formed in 1945,The Chordsmen are singing in their 80th year.

After an amazing weekend at the LOL District Fall Contest, there are so many people to thank, and it starts with everyone in attendance. The love and support we felt on and off stage all weekend was absolutely incredible. It is not lost on us just how fortunate we are to have been able to perform for you, and to come home the new LOL Champions.

The question we were asked most often over the weekend was "How the heck did you guys find each other?" Without fail, the other three guys would point to Josh and say "this guy"... Around April 2024, baritone Josh Umhoefer (Milwaukee WI) reached out to lead Ian Wolfe (Philadelphia PA) to ask if he had any interest in starting a quartet. They chatted a bit, and eventually agreed that if either of them had 3 other parts, they'd reach out to each other.

Fast forward a year, Josh was still on the quartet search, and reached out to bass Jeremy Conover (Savannah GA). They chatted about family and life, and eventually Josh asked about quartetting. Josh reached out to tenor Terry Blessing (Waterloo IA), as they had talked a few times about trying something. A day later, the harmony trio was on a video call, a week later lan joined for another video call, and 6 weeks later they were meeting in Savannah, GA on Memorial Weekend 2025 for a quartet "test run" rehearsal.




