

 The District is in excellent financial shape, in part due to savings by moving to more digital communications and video conferencing for team meetings. Starting in 2023, we have reduced the District Dues by \$10/year.



We held a series of Best Practice Sharing meetings with the chapters to find ways to increase our Membership We continued to hold virtual House of Delegates Meetings We presented our first Joe Liles Lifetime Achievement Award to Del Ryberg and Jim Richards

 The District Board and Leadership team met every month to help guide our District forward. And there is more, but I think you recognize that your leadership team is active and strive to be results oriented in our approach.

Now in 2023 we are off to a strong start. Our virtual leadership academy, held on January 7th, went very well and the vocal training session led by Sarah Wigley, called The Barbershop Belt, was a huge hit. All of the information, including videos of most of the sessions are available on our District Website. So, if you missed any of the sessions, or would like a reminder from Sarah's class, just go to the site and click the links. And, we already have great suggestions on how to make next year's academy even better.

We held our House of Delegates meeting via Zoom on January 21". The best practice sharing session was one of the best and most uplifting set of discussions we've had in a long time. While some of our chapters are struggling, so many had lots of positive comments, have turned the corner after the pandemic and are growing.

Also, on January 21" we had a kick-off meeting with our District Liaisons. The purpose of that meeting was to ensure the 13 District Liaisons had a common understanding of our Liaision program and expectations for connecting with all of our chapters. We are optimistic that by having a closer connection between our chapters and District leadership that we can more effectively focus our District support in a manner that helps our chapters be even more successful.

The District has put in place two types of financial support opportunities for chapters. One is a grant that will subsidize the cost of hiring District quartets

to headline chapter shows. Our hope is that our entertaining District quartets will provide the opportunity for chapters to put on successful shows that not only give a boost to the chapters, but show the public at large what contemporary barbershop truly is. The second grant is an opportunity for chapters to request funds to help them with membership drives, train their directors, promote barbershop in their communities and more. Both grant forms are on our District website under the Document Center. And our Liaisons will be able to provide advice and assistance to those chapters who are interested.

We have made updates to our District Directory, and will continue to do so throughout the year. The updated directory will always be posted on our District website under the Document Center tab. Please let me know if you see items that we need to modify.

Many of our chapters are well underway with preparations for their spring shows. It is great to see the comradery and enthusiasm shared by all our members as they work toward their common goals. Also, a reminder that the Northern Pines Harmony Brigade Rally is scheduled for Friday, May 5through Sunday, May 7th at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Plymouth, MN. Coulee Classic will be the guest quartet and judging panel.

Yes, we are off to a strong start in 2023 and there is so much more to come. Planning for our Fall Convention, and more future events, is already underway. All of this positive activity makes me feel great about the direction we are heading and gives all of us even more opportunities to share the barbershop experience with more people!

The Power of Saying Thank You

I'd love to share with you the benefits and power of two simple words. THANK YOU.

They are two words that have the power to transform our health, happiness, barbershop performance and success. Research shows that grateful people are happier and more likely to maintain good friendships and successful organizations. A state of gratitude, according to research by the Institute of HeartMath, also improves the heart's rhythm, which helps us to reduce stress, think more clearly under pressure and heal physically. It's actually physiologically impossible to be stressed and thankful at the same time. When you are grateful you flood your body and brain with emotions and endorphins that uplift and energize you rather than the stress hormones that drain you. Gratitude and appreciation are also essential for a

healthy chorus environment. In fact, the number one reason why people leave their jobs and hobbies is because they don't feel appreciated. A simple thank you and a show of appreciation can make all the difference. Gratitude is like muscle. The more we do with it the stronger it gets. In this spirit here are 3 ways to practice thankfulness every day.

I. Take a Weekly Thank You Walk Around the Room at Your Barbershop Practices - Many years ago I started writing articles for the Pitch Piper with the theme

"Marketing the Magic of Barbershop Harmony." They lasted about ten years. One article reminded folks to just say "thank you" every chance you got. People told me that the other articles I wrote about strategy and methods were not as effective as this one article. Saying Thank you will set you up for a positive time at practice each week.

- 2. **Gratitude Visit** Martin Seligman, Ph.D., the father of positive psychology, suggests that we write a letter expressing our gratitude to someone. Then we visit this person and read them the letter. His research shows that people who do this are measurably happier and have stronger ties to each other.
- 3. Say Thank You at Every Level of Barbershop When Doug Conant was the CEO of Campbell Soup he wrote approximately 30,000 thank you notes to his employees and energized the company in the process. Energize and engage your fellow barbershoppers by letting them know you are grateful for them and their efforts. Organizations spend billions of dollars collectively on recognition programs but the best and cheapest recognition program of all consists of a sincere THANK YOU. So, don't forget to say thank you to all your fellow barbershoppers and barbershop customers too.Thank you for taking time to read this and put it into practice. I'm thankful for YOU.



Steve Case lost his battle with cancer on Sat, 1/21/23. To know Steve is to love Steve. He was well known to many throughout the LOL District and the Society, for that matter, as the Tagmeister. Steve was the one that would grab a newbie or a guest to teach them a tag and hook them into Barbershop for life. If he noticed someone listening that he knew didn't get the opportunity to sing in a quartet, he'd bring them in for the next tag. Upon his passing, many took to Facebook & CaringBridge to describe their first tag experience with Steve. He created memories for many to last a lifetime.



Steve took his tag singing to the extreme. Anytime he heard a mechanical/electrical hum, he'd identify the key of the hum, grab 2 others and sing a tag with the hum as the post. Steve was arguably one of the most accurate basses in the District. We, along with Roger Williams, had the pleasure of singing with Steve in the quartet, Trademark. We won the LOL District Championship back in 1999 and placed 23rd at the International convention in KC the following year. Steve had sung in many quartets but he knew that Trademark was something special. We were all members of the Great Northern Union Chorus and rehearsed just before chorus. At one of our first rehearsals, we grabbed a room and I closed the door. Steve walked over and opened the door. I looked at him and asked, "Why did you open the door? We're getting ready to rehearse." To which Steve replied, "There's a new sheriff in town!". The three of us just looked at him and shook our heads.

Outside of barbershop, Steve owned his own construction company, Thumbs Up. Steve was a perfectionist and his work demonstrated it. Even though he was in the business, he would freely help a friend with an emergency home issue or give advice over the phone. Steve was a true giver.

Steve was also a strong man of faith, providing prayer to those who needed it and lifting them up when they were down. He led many of us back to the Lord. He was also an avid fisherman, spending hours in the boat with anyone who wanted to fish. He taught tags out on the water even if there were only 2 in the boat. He was generous with his gear and his time.

Steve will be sorely missed by so many. For me (Dave), I lost my best friend, a loss that is going to hurt for a very long time. I loved Steve like a brother. I will miss his friendship, his humor, his prayers, his singing... literally everything about Steve. He was a one of a kind. We know Steve is already teaching tags to the angels and the Barbershop family that preceded him. I asked him to hold a spot for me next to him on the risers. We will sing with him again someday.



Steve didn't want a funeral. Instead there will be a Celebration of Life on Saturday, March 18th, from 2-4pm at the Minneapolis Golf Club, 2001 Flag Ave. S., St. Louis Park, MN 55426. Undoubtedly, there will be tag singing...just the way Steve wanted it!



Hello from FORWARD HARMONY!

If you weren't at last fall's District convention, you may not have recognized the name of Forward Harmony, the 2022 LO'L Chorus Champions! Well, we'd love to introduce ourselves officially to you!

In December 2021, the Greendale, WI chapter began exploring the possibility of adding a second, all-voice chorus. A committee of Derek Balke, Bryan Ziegler, Jim Ansay, Mike Lietke, Tom Rogina, and Bob Fichtner spent many hours over several months gauging interest, surveying current and prospective members, and gathering information from other multi-chorus chapters to establish guidelines for the creation of a second chorus under the chapter umbrella.

In July 2022, the Greendale chapter membership voted overwhelmingly to expand our membership to include all genders, and the board voted to add an all-voice chorus to our existing men's chorus.

The "Greendale All-Voice Chorus" (as it was known then) held its inaugural meeting soon afterward, with over 40 singers present! Simply by word of mouth, we were able to bring in singers from the Midwest Vocal Express, Capitol Chordsmen, Yahara River Chorus, Choral-Aires, Melodeers, New Tradition, Crosstown Harmony, Riverport Chorus, and Festival City Chorus. After a couple of rehearsals, we brainstormed several potential names, and the winning name chosen was Forward Harmony, representing not only the state motto of Wisconsin ("Forward"), but also our commitment to advancing barbershop forward through BHS's Everyone In Harmony initiative.

We were so thrilled to be able to compete at and take home the 2022 District Chorus Championship after only five rehearsals together! The singers worked amazingly hard to put together our two songs in time. The day of the contest was actually the first time we had sung on risers! We're so proud to be representing LO'L at the 2023 International Chorus Contest in Louisville, KY alongside our chapter-mates in the Midwest Vocal Express!

Since we have members from Madison to Milwaukee to the Chicago area, we rehearse every other Sunday - one of our driving motivators was that we didn't want any of our members to "drop" their regular weekly choruses in favor of singing with Forward Harmony.

Forward Harmony is truly an ALL-voice chorus, open to any person who has a desire to sing four-part harmony. If you're able, we would love to see you and sing with you, every other Sunday from 6-9pm at Emmanuel United Church of Christ on Sunset Dr. in Oconomowoc, WI. St. Cloud Success!

Happy to share with you. A year ago after our very successful Christmas show we had a period of very low attendance which might have been because of Covid resurfacing or a period of crappy weather and guys not wanting to make the trip to rehearsal. We were down to 6-8 guys at rehearsal. We chose to take a break from rehearsals for a couple months but still have board meeting/planning sessions for a restart in the spring. We figured it was an all or nothing deal. Spend some money and try to get going again or make the decision to fold.

With money help from the district we put together a plan to restart. A members wife revamped our Facebook/media efforts. We considered joining the local Chamber of Commerce but felt the cost was more than expected benefit. So we decided to try radio.

There are many radio stations in the St Cloud area so we picked one where we could get a 2 for 1 advertising package as a non profit organization. They also gave us a free half hour air time to talk about our upcoming guest night, explain more about who we are and of course sing a tag on air. We bought 45 thirty second ads for \$11 each and got 90 ads over a 2 week period before our restart guest night.

We had a great turnout of current members and got 5 guests from the radio ads. Also a couple of our younger members put on a big push at their private high school. Summer is our biggest performance/singout season and told everyone what our anticipated schedule was going to be and that we also expected to just have fun with being together again and singing for audiences that hadn't heard us for a couple years because of covid.

We started getting attendance in the mid to upper teens and enthusiasm started to spread among our members as well as the young group. We sang at Como Park and had 21 guys on stage. The momentum has continued as we got ready for our Christmas show this year. 32 guys on stage with 5 more former members joining us for the final 3 numbers for 37 on stage. A sellout crowd and a good moneymaker for the chorus. Oldest man on stage was 84 and several young guys at 15 yrs old.

There have been plenty of men from this chorus and other choruses that said radio won't work but maybe it worked well for us because of timing and circumstances revolving around the Covid deal and men just wanting a chance to sing again and audiences wanting to get out and hear music again. It was great to get monetary help from the district and has gotten us a wonderful restart. Other choruses can contact me by this email or 320-894-0433.


