To apply to become a candidate judge you need to fill out a few forms, get a few letters of recommendations and apply through me. Deadline for you to submit forms to me is December 1, 2019.

If you pass Candidate School you will then practice judge for 2 years and hopefully be invited to Category School in July 2022.

Q: Bryan, you wrote on the day after you won "It still doesn't feel real". Does it now?

A: Nope, it's still not really real. Every time I put my gold medal on, I just hold it in my hand for a second just to look at it, because I'm still kind of in shock that we were fortunate enough to earn them.

Q: You are "only" 30 years old, yet you've BBSed for 2/3 of your life. This past year you've connected to our hobby's history at a whole new level. How has it impacted you? A: I think it ties in with the feeling that it's not really real. I've



been watching and admiring champ quartets since I was a kid. It's unfathomable that I have the fortune to wear the same medal as Platinum and Michigan Jake, as Keepsake and the Gas House Gang, as Boston Common and BGSU, as the Suntones, Dealers Choice, Buffalo Bills, and Happiness Emporium. I consider myself very lucky to be a

part of this art form.

Q: When did you first think about quartets and competing in a quartet? Did you ever dream about capturing a Gold Medal?

A: Competition was never really a goal for me-when I first started singing in quartets, sometime in middle school, I just wanted to sing for the fun of it. I had sung for a couple of years in pickup Singing Valentine quartets, and one year we made it official by going to contest that spring. There was a period of six or seven years that I never went to school on Valentine's Day. When I started getting serious about competing, I was very focused on the results of the contest. However, the closer I got to the gold medal, the less important it was as a goal. After Hours went into the 2016 contest in 5th, and we put a lot of pressure on ourselves to win a medal. We placed 6th that year, and we're really disappointed. We didn't feel right about that, so we all had a big talk shortly after that contest and we vowed that we just wouldn't care about the contest, so long as we were getting shows. In 2017, we qualified in 6th, and went with the goal to get more shows than any other quartet. That change in mindset allowed us to make the jump up to 3rd.

Q: Do you have any stories about Schmitt Bros and **Happiness Emporium**, or singing with the Champs when you were younger, or meeting Champs when they appeared locally? A: No stories about **Schmitts**, other than that I'm the only other Wisconsinite to win. I remember I was 10 or 11 when Nightlife was on the MVE show. **Jeff Baker** had invited me to walk out on stage with them, but I had to refuse. Why? The chorus had just gotten out new tuxes with the silver vests, and we were expressly told that NOBODY in the audience could see the new tuxes until the curtain opened on the chorus wearing them- which was right after Nightlife's set. My first time I ever sang with a champ guartet was in Denver 2007, and my dad has video somewhere of me singing Bari in Come Fly with Me with **Realtime**. Shortly after I joined **After Hours**, I was asked to fill in last minute on a long show with **Crossroads**. I was feeling pretty confident that I could keep up, so when we started warming up I tried to sound as big as possible to match their big sound. I found out real guick that that's not how Crossroads sings- I totally overpowered the quartet! I was shocked at how lightly and easily they sang, and I immediately took that back to AH.

Q: Any stories from headlining LOL shows when in earlier quartets?

A: The thing about chapter shows is everyone is so nice, especially in the LOL. There are chapter quartet hosts who I met with **Expedition** who I still say hey and chat with whenever I see them at conventions.

Q: Talk about your time with **GNU**, relationship building with them and Happiness guys.

A: **Bob** (**Dowma**) and **Rick** (**Anderson**) were the only ones who were active at the time. It was fun to see the inside of both sides of the **MVE-GNU** rivalry and talk with those guys about the days when both choruses were near the top 5.

LOL YIH Committee, Nice work!

Friends, the LOL YIH program is starting to draw the attention of educators and members. Success is rarely or ever an accident. Our LOL YIH Chairman, Jim Rasmus and his committee, are not letting moss grow under their feet. Follow their activity in the Pitch Piper and or better yet, get in touch with Jim, Jack Ryback, Ken Bestor, Bill Schmidt or anyone of the WYIH planning team listed in the May-June issue of the Pitch Piper and get your chapter involved also.

But with the growth of that activity, comes the growth of required funds to support the cost of venues, music, travel and a host of other expenses. LOL members have risen to the call for financial support in the past. But as I mentioned in previous articles, we as a membership, have reached a plateau. While the existing supporters continued to do so, new donors were difficult to find.

I have since 2017 said that the time has come to go outside of membership for financial support. There are some hurdles here however, that need to be addressed. Two major ones come to mind One, believe it or not, many, many people, still do not know about the BHS or even less the YIH. If you doubt that ask the next stranger what he knows about either one. Second, there are 1.8 Million IRS recognized charities. You know many of them. My mailbox is a welcome target for solicitations from many. Friends, that translates to competition. We are chasing the same dollar. Potential donors, not familiar with YIH, need to be motivated by something initially to support the program besides young folks singing and having a good time.

Permit me to give you an example, I was aware of the American Cancer Society Foundation but was not a donor until Carol, my wife came down with the disease. You get the picture? It struck a nerve. Here is my Hot Button to use.

Vandalism and Mischievous behavior. This country spends 8 Billion dollars annually to

remove graffiti. When I arrived home from a District Spring convention I was saddened to see that a large number of tombstones had been toppled on the cemetery of my church. November of 2017, Thanksgiving weekend, approximately 40 automobiles parked at the Amtrak Station located in Milwaukee, had the windows broken. Not once but a multiple of times, indicating robbery was not the motive just something to do. January of this year a brand new 450 automobile parking lot in Owensboro,KY had light switches, fire extinguishers destroyed, etc.

I thought, why is this stuff happening? So I did some research and found that other folks were also concerned why kids were doing this. The reason found for which I totally agreed. Notice when these events are happening, when the swimming pools are closed, play grounds are closed and ball diamonds are closed. The kids are BORED. The YIH has a solution, get them to sing. They always have their instruments with them and singing with others, develops a sense of team work. You do not need a large group to enjoy it. I have in my life sung many times doing duets.

Tell the story, use my examples. You may have thoughts of your own. Give me some feedback.

Children singing, boys and girls, will be too occupied to fool with spray paint cans or other mischief. They also will not have a guilty conscience.

I am attempting, hopefully with suggestions from you, to develop a presentation which will motivate those not familiar with the YIH program, to give financial support. Meanwhile, my thanks to those of you who continue to contribute not only financially, but with your time and talent.








Harold "Cass" Casselman Winnipeg's 70 Year Barbershopper

Carrie plays the organ for Chicago Blackhawks hockey home games, but she also is active in the Barbershop Harmony world. She has been the Music Director of the Chicago West Towns Chorus since 2013. She led the West Towns Chorus to the Illinois District Barbershop Chorus Championship in 2014 and 2017 and helped them return to the international chorus contest stage after 10 years. She also sings in a Sweet Adelines International (SAI) quartet, Cantina Vocal Project. To round out her music resume, she is a choir director at Waubonsie Valley High School in Aurora, Illinois.

So what is the LO'L LTA-LCC connection? She will be part of the LTA-LCC faculty on January 17-18, 2020 where she will lead the Chorus Directors and Assistant Directors Core Class as well as elective classes on Vocal Warmups and Vocal Techniques. She holds a Bachelor's degree in Music Performance from Western Michigan University and a Master's degree in Music and Liturgy from St. Joseph's College in Rensselaer, Indiana.

- The Society Board elected Blair Brown and Jeremy Brann for the two Board Members at Large positions.
- The **Society's Contest Expansion Proposal** has Male, Female and Mixed chorus and quartet contests at the 2021 International. The qualifying scores quartets 78%+, choruses 81%+. Division contests would include the 6 categories in 2020. Districts would not be GUARANTEED inclusion at International contests and quartets/choruses can compete in any district. It was stressed that GENERAL MEMBERS should be encouraged to **VOICE THEIR OPINIONS VIA THE SURVEY** sent to members in June (information and survey are on the BHS website).
- A District Memorandum of Understanding is being prepared for Society that will serve much like a District's Business Plan. The MOU will provide an overview of LOL operations and outline some of the responsibilities/interrelationships of the two groups.
- Dr. Perry White, CEO of Harmony Foundation, emphasized that HF works independently from BHS and continues to support Society's youth outreach projects, like the Next Generation BBS Varsity and Junior Quartets and Junior Chorus Invitational at Midwinter and International. Your donations to Harmony Foundation, at all levels, support these events. With the DONOR CHOICE option on the HF donation forms, you can also provide support to your Chapter or District!
- There are 2 Senior Chorus Competition spots available at the Midwinter (Jacksonville FL). Can a LOL Senior's Chorus be organized, learn/rehearse 2 songs over the next few months and score at least a 61 at our Fall Convention? All Chapter Chorus members interested????? 2020 will be the last year to qualify for the 2021 Senior's Chorus Contest finale in New York. This 5-year pilot project will be evaluated for continuance after that contest.


