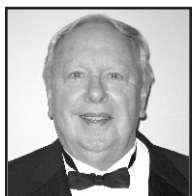

Barbershoppers are very aware of the situation between Barbershop Harmony Society and Harmony Foundation and the turmoil that the split has caused. Sing Canada Harmony has not been affected by the split in any way. Our donors continue to support Sing Canada Harmony's charitable purpose and continue to benefit from Canada's tax laws and charity regulations.

Sing Canada Harmony is a registered Canadian charity that was established in 2008 specifically for Barbershoppers wanting to support vocal music education in Canada. Our charity derives most of our funds via donations from Canadian members and Chapters of the three Barbershopping organizations (Barbershop Harmony Society, Sweet Adelines International, and Harmony, Incorporated) and provides vocal music education scholarships to deserving Canadian individuals, schools, community groups and to Chapters and members of the three organizations. Carbershop Brings Regina Men Together for 'Harmonic Euphoria' Through Radio Dial

A Regina barbershop chorus is tuning their car radios along with their voices to sing safely during the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Living Skies Chorus has been doing drive-in rehearsals in the parking lot of Thom Collegiate.

They sing in their cars through wireless mics that feed into a mixer and are aired through a FM transmitter to their vehicles. "For the first time in eight months, we're able to sing together," said Al Neufeld, the director of the chorus.

In March the barbershop chorus, an a cappella singing group, went silent when recreational activities were cancelled due to the pandemic. They tried rehearsing online through Zoom, but it didn't allow them to harmonize.

While the group could have moved back to singing at the Knox-Metropolitan United Church in August, Neufeld said they decided it wasn't worth the risk, given that some member are older than 50. But the idea of singing over Zoom for a year or more wasn't appealing either.

Carbershop conception

Neufeld came across a group in New Jersey rehearsing in what they dubbed a "carbershop." "I just I stopped everything and I just asked them the question, 'How badly do you want to sing together?' And most everyone said, 'Yeah, badly.' So I pitched the idea. They liked it and we ran

with it," said Neufeld.

After a few test runs, the men of Living Skies Chorus are singing in harmony once again. Each singer pulls up to the parking lot in their vehicle, turns on their wireless mic, tunes their radios to 106.5 FM, and watches Neufeld from a window of Thom Collegiate, where he directs and adjusts and the levels of the 24 mics.

"It was phenomenal because the sound was immediate. There was no lag time," said Gord Moker, president of the Living Skies Chorus.

"Reminded me the first time that I sang with the chorus back in 2007 and chills went up my back and my neck because the harmonies were just so wonderful. I call it harmonic euphoria. It's like nothing else when you when you sing in a choir or a choral group, when you're singing in harmony and everybody's doing their part and staying on their pitch."

In between warmups and songs, the men catch up and joke over the FM station. "We're really a brotherhood. We get together once a week and we enjoy each other's company," said Moker.

"This whole carbershop is something that brings us together. We're able to sing together. We were able to do a little bit of fellowship among ourselves while we're in vehicles. We're safe."

The group is still figuring out how it might perform and do community outreach. In other years, the men would visit long-term care homes in the winter, perform for seniors then stay to visit with them. "We love to perform. We love to entertain. We love to make sure that we can put smiles

on people's faces," said Wayne Hellquist, a member of the chorus.

Neufeld said he would like to be able to make the "carbershop" portable and find a way for them to pull up to a parking lot and ask the audience to tune their radios to listen.

"The human soul, the human body is built for harmony," he said, "In this world of ours today, with everything going on, we all need a little bit of harmony."

Chapter Rehearsal Updates



Winnipeg's Virtual BOTY Award Night

Normally, the Winnipeg Chapter (LOL District) holds an annual BOTY Awards Night at a local restaurant where we visit, dine, make presentations, celebrate and sing. We knew it would not be possible in this "Year of the Pandemic" so we decided to hold a virtual version of the event. This challenged the organizers to create an interesting program with virtual presentations and entertaining activities. The evening turned out to be an outstanding success!

At 6:45 p.m. on Wednesday, October 28th, our computer screens lit up via Zoom as River City Sound Chorus members, their "cheerleaders", alumni, and guests were welcomed in from the "waiting room". This was an excellent opportunity for the ~65 attendees, especially former and newer members, to connect, albeit virtually. At 7:00 p.m. the scheduled program began with toasts to our "cheerleaders" and members and our President's address. A "BOTY Bonanza" contest tested our familiarity with details from member's autobiographies submitted to our "Getting to Know You" newsletter series. This was followed by virtual award presentations to deserving Chapter members. Two very special guests attended to see the awarding of the Dorothy Casselman Lifetime Achievement Award - named in honour of their mother. It was very touching to have Jewel and Lynn join us as we acknowledged the chorus' loss of its longest-serving member, their father, Harold "Cass" Casselman.

The climax of the evening was the announcing of the 2020 BOTY award winner, Les Creek. The BOTY Award first originated for the Winnipeg Chapter in 1955 and has been adopted internationally. Featured during the interludes were short videos demonstrating some member's talents. This culminated with the showcasing of our latest music video "Bridge Over Troubled Water". The formal part of the evening ended at 9:00 p.m. with "Irish Blessing", but many attendees lingered afterwards to talk some more and share in the incredibly warm feelings that the evening had evoked in everyone.

This 2020 Awards event was so successful, that Winnipeg Chapter is planning a virtual Christmas gathering to substitute for the in-person event we usually hold at the end of our Christmas performances. We have learned the importance of our camaraderie and truly appreciate every opportunity to share in it, whether in-person or virtual.





Croix Chordsmen Virtual Christmas Show

As with all Barbershop Harmony Society Chapters, Croix Chordsmen in-person rehearsals were terminated in mid-March 2020. Thanks to the efforts of Jeff Knight, Jay Althof and Tyler Stromquist-Levoir, virtual meetings were begun via the Zoom Meeting App on March 24th and have been conducted weekly since. They are well planned and attended and have helped us to learn new songs, maintain familiarity of old songs and ensure that we maintain the atmosphere of being a close knit musical family.

In the May-June timeframe, it became obvious that our long established Christmas Show was not going to materialize for December 2020. Thanks to Cliff Turnbull during a midnight awakening, the idea of producing a virtual Christmas Show emerged. Following discussions with several Chordsmen members and an outside acquaintance of Cliff, a plan was developed to produce a virtual show.

A show team consisting of Jeff, Jay, Tyler, Cliff, Walt Ogburn and show co-chairs Tyler Smith and Duane Hall was formed. Based on the findings of the team, it was determined that it would be possible to produce virtual recordings. However it was also learned that it would be too daunting a task to do all the songs using the virtual chorus technique for a 75 minute show. Fortunately, past Christmas Shows have been recorded and produced by our local TV company resulting in professional quality DVD's. The show team reviewed all the DVD's from 2005 on and narrowed down favorite songs to 30-40 picks. Final songs were then selected to arrive at a mix of song styles sung by the Chordsmen, guest choral groups and quartets. These songs were then clipped from the DVD's and sequenced on video software.

Team members, Walt and Jay, volunteered to develop a plan to have all Chordsmen individually video and audio record two Christmas songs, one to open the show and one to end the show. A make-shift video recording studio was established with provisions made to prevent anyone's health to be put at risk. Thirty-two members were recorded at home or in the make-shift studio. Walt, who also volunteered to learn video editing with Davince Resolve software, then combined all the individual video tracks with the audio tracks to produce the two virtual chorus songs.

Our long-time emcee, Charlie Payne, then produced introductions for all the show songs and invited Chordsmen members and friends to record introductory videos for some of the songs.

In the Chordsmen's mission to support youth choral groups, arrangements are being finalized to include song selections from the local VocalEssence youth chorus. Walt is in the process of putting all the pieces together to end up with the final virtual

show. The Barbershop Harmony Society has graciously offered to host the show on their YouTube site and to promote the show through their marketing channels. Chordsmen are also promoting the show to their friends around the world so it is expected that the show will be viewed by a much wider audience than any show we have done.

The show is free to watch and will air at 2pm Central Time on Saturday, December 5th. The link to the show is www.croixchordsmen.com. Currently this link takes you to a site that has information about the show and on the 5th it will take you to the virtual show. If you wish donations can be made to the Chordsmen.

We would far prefer performing this show in public and we know that our traditional audience would prefer to be watching in person. However, we are excited to be able to produce a fun, high quality show that will be available to people all over the world, both live on the 5th and recorded for future enjoyment.



Barbershopper of the Year (BOTY)

The "Barbershopper of the Year" Award was first originated for the Winnipeg Chapter in 1955, when Director Vern Leatherdale offered to the executive of that year to provide a suitable trophy for annual presentation (on a similar basis to the Land O' Lakes District) to a member of the Winnipeg Chapter.

They produced a set of rules and policies so the award would be recognized and established as a real tribute each year, to the man selected as having done the most to promote, preserve and encourage Barbershopping in Winnipeg for that year.

In addition to having the recipient's name inscribed on the BOTY trophy, the Chapter provided the winner with a silver, engraved lapel button as a permanent sign of recognition of the wearer's achievement. The BOTY pin was to be worn by all winners at all Chapter functions.

Today the tradition of recognizing the Barbershopper of the Year continues throughout the Society in many of the Chapters and Districts. In the Land O' Lakes District, the Barbershopper of the Year receives a LOL BOTY pin and has their picture, name and specific District achievements displayed on the permanent BOTY display board.

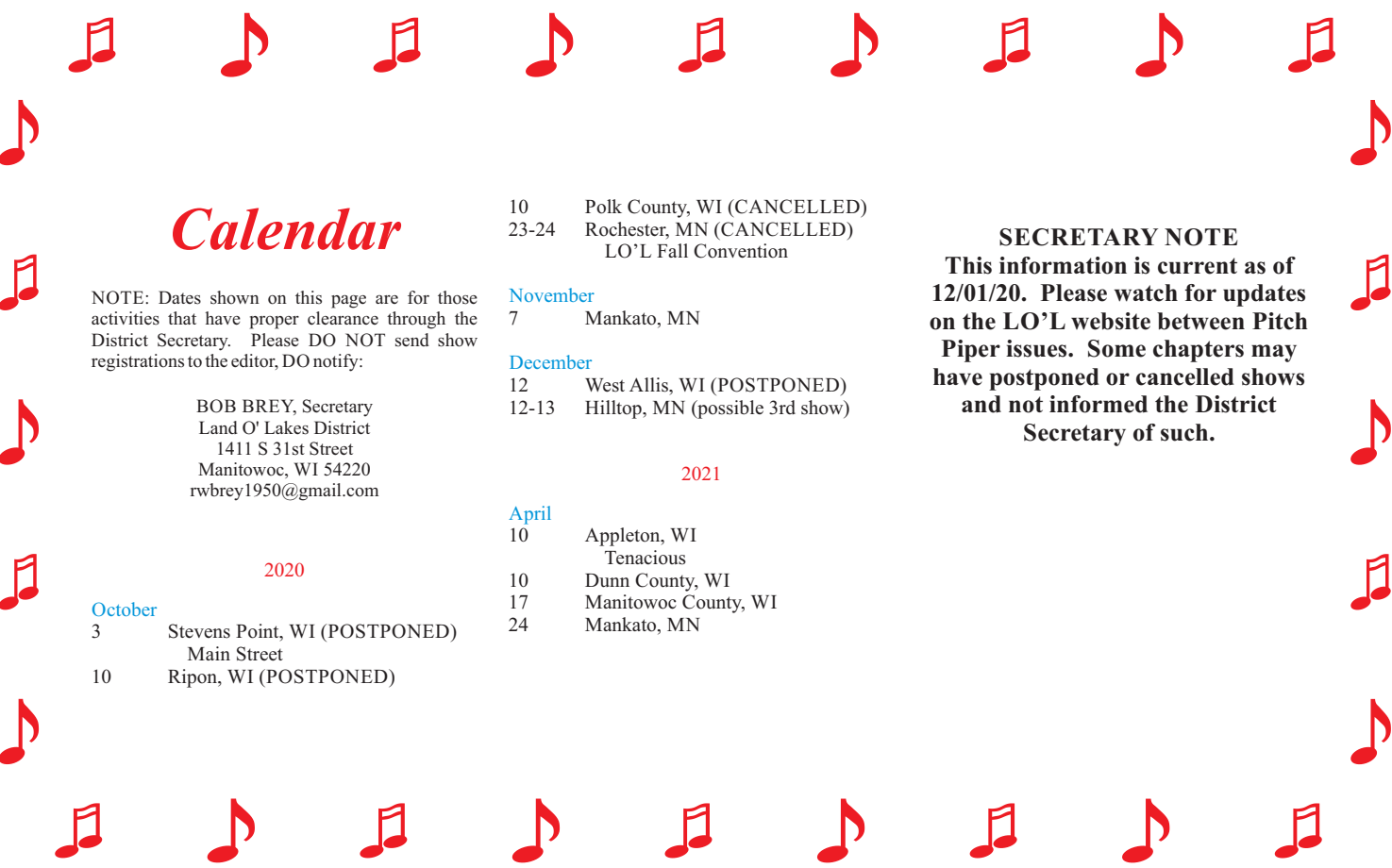
