

### Dauphin Chapter - Keystone Chorus Farewell

The town of Dauphin, Manitoba, established in 1901, is a town and grain farming community populated largely by Ukrainian and British families.

The Dauphin Chapter was chartered in 1972 and their Keystone Chorus enjoyed singing Barbershop in their town and surrounding communities for almost 50 years. However, after almost three years with no chorus rehearsals due to



Covid and having an aging and declining membership, the Dauphin Chapter members made the hard decision to give up their charter and to dissolve.

The Keystone Chorus's Annual, Christmas and other shows were always very popular and the chapter earned an excellent reputation for providing great entertainment. The chapter also had excellent support from the local businesses. Many of their annual show programs included business ads that netted the chapter between \$2000 and \$3000! The Chapter recently posted an article in the local newspaper thanking the Dauphin community for their support over the years. Many LOL quartets headlined the Dauphin annual shows and often commented, to me, how welcoming the members were and that it was always a real pleasure to be featured on the shows.

The Dauphin Chapter has almost completed the dissolution process and dispersed most of its assets to local community groups and charities. They also collected Dauphin Chapter—Keystone Chorus memorabilia and will be preparing it for a permanent display in the town's museum. President Dale Friesen has documented the chapter's 50 year history and will be incorporating it into that display.

On September 12th, 12 former and the few current members gathered at President Dale Friesen's home for a dinner and final "farewell" to the chapter. As mentioned, they had not sung together for almost 3 years, so this was a nice reunion, in spite of the underlining reason. They enjoyed catching up on each other's lives and eventually sang a few Pole Cat songs and, of course, Keep the Whole World Singing. Several members commented that it was very nice to be singing together again. As their Chapter Advocate/Counselor since 2007, I visited their chapter regularly, attended several of their shows and really appreciated the excellent communication and cooperation with their administration. President Dale invited me to attend that evening event to celebrate the reunion, retrieve the chapter's charter, complete some paperwork and then address the group on behalf of Land O' Lakes. We completed the evening by singing God Save the King!

## LOL Convention Survey Results Submitted by Arv Zenk


We've compiled the results of your 2022 Fall Convention Survey. We are glad that so many of you thoroughly enjoyed our time together and thank you for providing feedback for future conventions. The following is a brief summary of the weekend and what you told us about your experience:

- There were 655 registrations/tickets for the convention (440 for 2021) with 304 people attending the Showcase Dinner. We had 21 quartets and 15 choruses with a total of 351 contestants crossing the contest stage.
- The survey was sent to 452 e-mail addresses (only a single address was available for most couples and some quartets). We had 191 responses (42% response rate) to the survey.
- Convention Location, Hotel, and Communication received very positive reviews.
- The Showcase Dinner and Fun Squad activities also received many positive reviews
- Many would recommend others attend future conventions.
- Take a look at the attached charts/graphs which summarize your inputs.

We also collected 111 comments covering a variety of topics, compliments, and concerns. Some comments went into great detail and provided specific recommendations which will be very helpful in planning our next convention. The Fall Convention Committee will share all of the results and work with the District Board to improve future conventions. ### Music Scholarships from the "Come Back Chorus"

The "Comeback Chorus" of Janesville WI (formerly the Badger Chordhawks) has for many years given scholarships to high school seniors going to college with a potential vocal/music major.

To that end we have an annual fund raiser at the Rock County Thresheree. We sell brats, sweet corn and beverages. Because of our low membership we need to partner with the Sweet Aldines Yahara River Chorus. Between the two groups we had enough man/woman power to raise over \$4,600 for each chorus. I would like to thank Judd Orff and the Land O' Lakes district for their grant and support.

This year we decided to try something different. Over the summer we sponsored individual vocal lessons for six high school students who were motivated to sing, but would not otherwise be able to get individual lessons. To do this, we worked through the Parker Arts Academy of Janesville music director, Matt Knutson. Their vocal committee identified the student recipients, a qualified instructor, and arranged for the lessons (10 to 12 lessons for each student).

We're happy to report that it was very successful. The Music Director reported, "In the first month of this school year, these students all are showing even more leadership in choir and musical rehearsals and a greater passion for the Arts."

The Vocal Committee selected students who were:

- Interested/motivated to study private
- Involved in our Parker HS Choir, Musical Theatre Program, and Parker Arts Academy program
- Needed financial support to study private voice lessons

Some comments from the students were:

"Lessons were fun. Definitely helped me prepare vocally". "Without them [the lessons], I feel I would have not done anywhere near as good in Grease as I feel I did."

"My summer lessons were amazing! I really built my voice from the beginning of the summer to the end!"

"The voice lessons over the summer really helped me grow my range... With the summer voice lessons, I was also able to work on audition songs and learn new songs that pushed my voice and helped me grow my voice."

Was an area counselor, division VP, District Secretary, District President, International Board Member and Society President. He was also the consummate coach and teacher, as a contest judge, category specialist and harmony college faculty. He clearly loved making music and helping others enjoy barbershop, teaching tags and also playing bass fiddle.

Andy Richards, please join me to accept this award on behalf of your father for all of the significant contributions he made to our District over so many years.

Our second recipient is: Del Ryberg. Del is a 64 year member of the society. Like

Jim. Del has held every office with the Rochester chapter as well as several committee chairs. He has been an area counselor, Division VP, District Secretary, Executive VP, Events VP, and District President. Many of us will think of Del as the District Convention Chair and the person who developed the approach and templates we continue to use today. He has participated and chaired many, many District Committees. And he was also very active at the International Level leadership as a Board Member, International Planning Committee member, Chapter Officer Training School faculty and coordinator and several additional

### IN MEMORIAM

Frederick Lee Street passed away



peacefully on October 20, 2022 at the age of 95. He was born on January 28, 1927 in Long Beach, California. He enlisted in the Navy in 1944, completed electronic technical

school, and during the war was assigned to teach the new technologies of sonar and radar for Fire Control Radar at Treasure Island. After leaving the service in 1947, he attended Heald Engineering College in San Francisco where he received a degree in Electrical Engineering. Fred joined a crew that hand - constructed San Francisco's KRON television station.

Fred began his barbershop career in Minnesota in the early 1960's by helping to start a new chapter in Roseville. Fred directed the new chorus for many years. He led them to a district small chorus championship. The chapter eventually merged with the Saint Paul Chapter and became the Greater St Paul Area Chapter. Fred continued his directing duties for many years. Primarily, he put his education and experience to work by coordinating sound and lighting for annual shows and other events. He also performed this duty at the district level. For over 25 years he served on the faculty of Harmony College utilizing and teaching lighting, sound and video. Fred was honored by his chapter and the district by being named BOTY (Barbershopper of the

Fred loved quartetting and sang in several quartets over the years. Most 'notable' were Stanley Steemers and more recently Vintage Years for almost 20 years. Vintage Years represented the LOL District three times in the International Seniors contest. The quartet performed hundreds of times mostly for senior groups. However, it was most proud of presenting barbershop to over 7,000 school kids

Fred was preceded in death by his wife Barbara (Bobbie) and is survived by four children, five grandchildren and five greatgrandchildren.




All Chapter Chorus with Burlington High School directed by Dave Speidel
