 - B. Get a commitment to attend the fall

convention from chapter member & spouses in Minneapolis October 15th & 16th, 2021.

5. Set up a calendar that highlights date of things coming once we open up.
 - A. Rehearsal nights
 - B. Re-treat
 - C. Shows/Fall/Christmas
 - D. Board meeting
 - E. Chapter membership birthday
 Print the calendar for each member to carry in their music or on line.
6. Be sure your chorus director is on board & has a current contract.
7. Begin to formulate your "elevator speech" to let the public know who you are as a performance group and your goals and aspirations. Update your website with this information.
8. Develop a team around your membership V.P. to handle:
 - A. Guest night plans and dates
 - B. Welcome guests at each meeting
 - C. Have a sufficient guest books

Good news is on the way for the chapter members of the HOL Harmony Capella Chorus!

It will have been 57 weeks since our last indoor rehearsal to when we plan to resume indoor rehearsals on 12 April 2021!

Recently, chorus members were polled on a series of questions regarding their viewpoint on when we should resume harmonizing at our indoor rehearsal site.

We plan to return to singing while practicing for the care and safety of each chorus member; therefore we encourage each member and guest to have received their complete COVID-19 vaccinations before their return to our rehearsal site.


Upon entering the site, singers will encounter a reception table for attendance, music distribution, mask distribution hand sanitization and a forehead temperature scan.

Singing masks' will be furnished by our chorus chapter to each singer and they are expected to wear it at all times while indoors. This singing mask will be the sole the property of each singer to care for and wear at future rehearsals.

As most chorus members will have done minimal singing in the past year, our rehearsals will start out slowly to strengthen and exercise our voices, and thus rehearsals will limited to 75 minutes with no coffee fellowship.

Upon completion of rehearsals, singers are then expected to exit the site for the health safeguards.

We are starting out cautiously and safely, although we do plan on having fun while singing together.

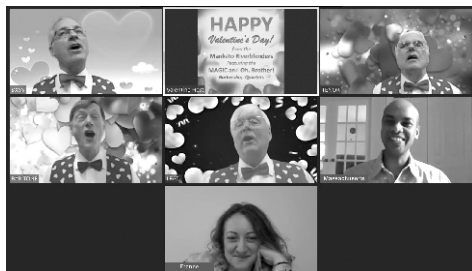
There were many questions:

Clipper City Chordsmen Partner with Food Pantry in Manitowoc

The Clipper City Chordsmen of Manitowoc, Wisconsin needed a new home. They had been rehearsing on the Campus of Holy Family College in Manitowoc when the college abruptly and permanently closed last summer as the pandemic began to take hold.

The Chordsmen put together a small task force that visited two dozen possible alternative sites before deciding on their new home; the site of a former UCC church in the heart of Manitowoc itself. This building had changed hands and now belonged to a non-profit entity, Grow It Forward, Inc.

Run by CEO and Founder, Amber Daus, Grow It Forward (GIF) promotes healthy food access through a cafe, a winter Farmer's Market, a food pantry, and even an indoor hydroponic farm. They also provide food skills programs to teach families to grow, cook, and choose healthy food for themselves. GIF is also involved in advocacy for individuals and the community to seek an end to hunger. According to Ms. Daus, "We distribute boxes of food from the USDA each week to over 3,000 people. This is in addition to the over 300 folks who use our pantry services."

For the Chordsmen, the previous sanctuary in this building offered a large open space for rehearsal and included a large screen TV and sound system. In addition, the chorus has exclusive use of a locked room in which to store their equipment, risers, and refrigerator.

Of course, 2020 was not like any other year. Chordsmen member Don Lewellen states "Over the last year, it has been unsafe for any of us to sing together in person because of the pandemic. However, we have continued to meet weekly via Zoom with over 20 members attending on any given week. In addition, we have reached out to virtual guest music educators, judges, and arrangers from all over the world to join us at our weekly rehearsals. We have also produced some virtual chorus and quartet projects to keep each other engaged."

With the Chordsmen moving into their new storage space, members discovered that GIF needed their help with many small tasks around the building and grounds. Starting with just cutting the grass and trimming bushes, the guys got more involved in other maintenance and repair projects throughout the building. Member and artist Randy Detjen volunteered his talents to produce outdoor signs for the building; highlighting Grow It Forward, Mara's Cafe, and the Clipper City Chordsmen.

GIF received financial support that enabled them to completely renovate the former sanctuary with laminated flooring. Because of Covid concerns and the need to replace equipment, their new air handling system offers 6 air exchanges per hour, the significant addition of outside air, and an ionizer system. GIF also opened a

Cafe - featuring healthy food options prepared and sold on site. Chordsmen look forward to the possibility that this could provide on-site food options for small shows and afterglows for the chorus.

After consultation with a local contractor, GIF offered the Chordsmen an opportunity they eagerly accepted. Under the supervision of the contractor, GIF would provide the materials if the Chordsmen would put in the labor to remove the existing hardwood flooring and elevated areas. They would then install new laminated flooring to match the rest of the room. In addition, the project also will involve filling in the void in the front wall, lowering an access door to the level of the stage, and removing wall paper before painting the whole area. The final result would be a flat space which would be large enough to allow them to leave their risers assembled throughout the week.



Several of the chorus members have significant experience in renovation, engineering, painting, and woodworking and their skills have found good use in this project. The number of man-hours to complete this project will be significant, but the end result will be a great addition to the facility.

Director Dave Buss said "I'm really excited for this opportunity. We are all looking forward to being able to rehearse in this amazing space."

The Clipper City Chordsmen has members ranging in age from 19 to 90. The chorus is in its 76th year as a Manitowoc County Organization having been founded in March of 1945. They look forward to sharing photos of the finished project later in the Spring.

Northern Pines Harmony Brigade

NPHB will be running a 'mini' version of their annual Harmony Brigade Rally starting on Thursday. This is a great opportunity for quartet enthusiasts to 'wet their whistle' on the fun of 'full throttle' quartet singing with guys from all over the LO'L District and beyond. Take advantage of the convention rooming rate (\$85/double occupancy + tax). If you take part in this super, fun event, you'll be glad to know that it doesn't end on Thursday. The quartetting will go through the weekend and wee hours of the night. NPHB will also be hosting more hospitality dedicated to Rally attendees in one of the Presidential Suites on Saturday night.

Quartet Clinic

It's new this year! We will be hosting a quartet clinic for all quartets registered for the convention. You will be provided the kind of feedback you need to improve – no matter what level you're at right now. If you sing in a quartet, prepare a couple of songs and get at least one hour of coaching from the best. Whether you're a skilled quartet who has sung for years or just a pickup quartet who sings Valentines you will enjoy this clinic. Sign up early for this clinic since we may have to limit the number of quartets we can coach.

Quartet Contest and Festival

For the first time, we will be holding a district quartet contest and festival. All quartets must register for one or more of the several contests/ festival performances. Your quartet may be evaluated as a male quartet, female quartet, or mixed quartet competing for a number of awards from Novice Quartet to District Champion, as well as, the opportunity to qualify for the International Competition. But, if you don't want to compete and have your score recorded, you may sign up for the festival and just get an evaluation. Contest and Judging will provide more detailed information in upcoming Pitch Piper articles.

All-Chapter Chorus

Some of us don't get the chance to sing on the risers with 100 guys very often, but if you want that experience you can do it this weekend. Just sign up, in advance, with Steve Zorn who will send you the music and learning tracks. You must memorize the two songs and then you will practice with members of the Northern Pines Harmony Brigade on Saturday. It's a great experience. This will be the fourth year Steve has organized the All-Chapter Chorus which performs at the conclusion of the Chorus Contest. If you haven't done this already, you really need to take advantage of this wonderful experience.

Chorus Contest and Festival

For the first time at the district level, we will hold a combined chorus contest and festival. Choruses may compete, just as they have done in the past, but this year we are encouraging all choruses that do not wish to compete to get on stage and sing for

us. Festival choruses will sing a couple of their best songs and will get an evaluation without a published score. The coaching and evaluation for all choruses is designed to improve chorus performance. We look forward to adding the festival choruses!

Showcase Dinner and Show

The Showcase Dinner and Show is another chance for us to be "Together Again" as we wrap up the weekend. This will be the time we will recognize our outstanding performers and present our Hall of Fame and District Barbershopper of the Year Awards. Storm Front will be our special guest who will be there throughout the weekend – helping with coaching, singing tags, and just having fun. There will be special performances by our own outstanding quartets and we will wrap up the evening with a Storm Front show package. The Showcase Dinner is new and it will be a time for us to sit back, have a wonderful dinner, and enjoy an evening of top notch entertainment.

Fun Squad

As part of the Roar Back theme for the Fall District Convention, we are creating a Fun Squad team chaired by Steve Grady. The mission of the Fun Squad is to actively promote fun and participation by everyone who is at the Convention. We will be asking for a Fun Squad volunteer from every chapter this month to join the team. Fun Squad team members will brainstorm fun participative activities for the Convention, encourage their chapter members to attend the Convention, and nurture involvement in the many activities including the All District Chorus, Polecat Dance Card, Ten Tags Sheet, the Tagatorium, and Afterglows. Students will again compete to determine the best high school barbershop and treble quartet in the state. **All high school barbershop and treble (women's and mixed) quartets** are invited to submit a video for the virtual competition.

Here are the basics:

- ✓ The deadline for quartets to register their video submissions is **April 30th**.
- ✓ Because this contest is VIRTUAL, we hope to have a judging panel of Certified Barbershop Harmony Society Judges from around the country do their adjudications between May 1 - 6.
- ✓ **On May 22nd at 1:00 pm we will premiere the Virtual WYHF on the Barbershop Harmony Society YouTube Channel and contest winners will be announced.** Plan now to tune in! BHS will also host the video for delayed viewing. We'll share that link when we receive it.
