Many times I was also blessed with the presence of my brother and a few times my children got swept into the Barbershop wake to be on or help with a Chapter show.

The journey to Pasadena started back in the fall of 2019. But the original destination wasn't the "City of Roses", it was Los Angeles. The pieces were starting to fall into place for a great Barbershop adventure. The 2020 International Convention was slated for Los Angeles. It was the Society's 75th Anniversary. It promised to be a spectacular event! Bob and I could fit the convention into our schedule. My brother Mike (a current member of the West Allis, Wisconsin chapter) informed us at Thanksgiving that he would be able to attend. The final piece of the puzzle was my son Spencer. He was living and working in San Jose, CA. At Christmas he told us he could make it work and would make the journey down to LA. Flights were booked, hotel rooms reserved, convention event tickets purchased. Excitement pursued!!!

And then Covid-19.

Covid-19 has been exceptionally rough for the Barbershop community. This hobby is truly a brotherhood. We are united in song and stories, in humor and tears. Vocality – 15 Year Anniversary Submitted by Jay Althof



On February 4th, 2007, David, Tony, Bob and Jay got together for the first time to sing a little and determine if the four voices and personalities would be a good fit. Once we sang "Shine On Me" and heard the ringing chords there was no doubt that something very special was happening. We named ourselves Vocality and started learning songs. Much to our surprise we qualified for International at the Prelims contest in May and won the District Quartet contest in October of 2007. Over the next few years, we continued to improve our singing with the help of many coaches. This led to placing in the Top 20 at International and gave us the opportunity to perform on many Chapter shows. And we recorded our 1st Album – Vocality.

In 2011 Bob needed to leave Vocality due to work commitments and Tom joined the quartet. We continued a busy show schedule and also recorded our 2nd Album – Alleluia in 2011. Also starting in 2011 we started singing songs arranged for Vocality by Jay, often with input from everyone in Vocality.

We continued to look for ways to improve our performances through coaching and finding special songs that our audiences could relate too. In 2013 we released our 3rd Album – Midnight Clear. And in 2016 we released our 4th Album – Carry On. All during this time we continued to very much enjoy each other's company and the opportunity to do shows all across the District and beyond.

Also, in 2016 we were humbled to be inducted to the LO'L District Hall of Fame. It was a huge honor to be recognized for our contributions helping with Youth-In-Harmony events, Contest Emcees, Coaching and our many performance and contest appearances.

Now here in 2022 Vocality is still going strong. We have done over 175 performances and just love getting together to make music and spend social time together. Like many groups, we needed to find creative ways to rehearse during the pandemic. And we have continued to work on the songs that will be in our 5th Album – Never Enough. We just need the pandemic to subside so we can get in the studio and record them!

As you can gather from this note, one of the best parts of our long tenure is that we have many very entertaining songs that we can

perform. We know some Chapters are wondering if their chorus is ready to put on a show since they haven't been able to rehearse as much as they would like to have enough quality songs to share with their audiences. If your chorus is in that situation, an option to consider would be to have Vocality perform two sets on your show and reduce the number of songs your chorus would need to perform. There would be no extra charge for the extended performance by Vocality and it will help keep your audiences engaged with your Chapter shows.

Individually we are so very thankful to be part of Vocality and we hope to continue for many more years to come. We look forward to seeing many of you at shows and conventions in the future!

Your Board of Directors approved the creation of a new District Award to recognize those individuals who have made very significant positive contributions to our District over a longperiod of time.

We named the Award in honor a long-time member of our District, who passed away last year, Joe Liles. For those who may not have known Joe, there are no words to encompass his breadth of influence on the Barbershop Harmony Society, and on the barbershop art form. In addition to hundreds of original songs, and hundreds of arrangements, his fingerprints are on untold more works that he brought to print as Music Publications Editor, as a teacher, mentor, and colleague to other arrangers. A member of the BHS Hall of Fame, a seniors quartet champ, a past Society Executive Director— any list of accomplishments falls woefully short of describing the man.

A few details of the award:

- Award Candidate Criteria
 - o A person with at least 25 years of membership in the LO'L District
 - o A person who has held multiple District leadership roles over a period of several years
 - o A person whose leadership had a sustained positive impact on the well-being and on-going success of the District
 - o Other considerations may include:
 - Significant musical impact through directing, quarteting, arranging or composing
 - On-going participation on District Committees and other administrative duties
 - Informal leadership via evangelism for the District, the chapters and members

Award presented at the Fall District Convention

Candidates may be nominated by any one, but must include justification in concert with award criteria and nominations must be made no later than Sept 1st each year.

This award is separate and differentiated from the BOTY or Hall of Fame by being reserved only for those individuals who have truly provided leadership and support for an extended period of time, measured in decades.

If you want to nominate candidates for this award, send the names and justifications to Jay Althof, District President, and the award committee will evaluate all candidates prior to the Fall Convention.

After a year of distanced rehearsals, members of Great Plains Harmony (Fargo, ND - Moorhead, MN chapter) were growing tired of staring at a screen. This isn't news as many chapters were having the same experience.

Between the waves of the pandemic, a stroke of good fortune was presented to our chorus in the form of a unique performance invitation.

The popular 80's rock band Foreigner has a long tradition of featuring an amateur vocal ensemble on their concert stage. They are passionate about promoting singing and support it by sharing the excitement of a massive rock-and-roll venue stage performance. Typically, a high school pop-choir is invited (or competes) for the opportunity to perform.

Our good luck was the timing of their fall tour. With a September 9th performance in Grand Forks, North Dakota, their concert manager was unable to find a high school or college choir with any repertoire prepared at this early date. The Foreigner manager then approached Shirley Derrick of the Twin Forks Sweet Adeline Chorus. Unable to perform, Shirley forwarded the opportunity to Great Plains Harmony and our chorus immediately jumped into action!

Our board approved in person rehearsals beginning in July for singers who were fully vaccinated. We had repertoire we could polish up for the performance including; Africa by Toto (arr. A. Morris), Sweet Caroline by Neil Diamond (arr. D. Oxford), and Pretty Woman by Roy Orbison (arr. S. Delehanty). The band thought our repertoire was perfect!

Leading up to the big performance, our membership renewed their energy and focus on rehearsing well. We booked a tour bus for the 70-mile drive and even created custom 'GPH World Tour' performance t-shirts.

But then, another wave of Covid-19 began to spread across the United States and we got a call from Foreigner's management team. Unfortunate news. If we still wanted to perform, everyone performing and traveling with the chorus would need to show a negative Covid-19 test result within 72 hours of performing. We tapped the resources of the chorus and luckily one of our members had access to Rapid tests and the nurses to administer them!

With the performance at the Alerus Center in Grand Forks occurring on our usual rehearsal night (Thursday), our schedule was tight. After an hour-long motor coach ride, a smooth on-stage sound check, and a quick bite to eat, we were ready to perform!

"I was so pleased with the focus and energy that the chorus members brought to the stage," said director Sheila Childs. "We knew singing in such a large venue would be a challenge, however, the guys demonstrated their professionalism by listening carefully and performing the musical plan we crafted."

The satisfaction of singing live for a large audience after such a long absence was palpable. As members left the stage, they were bubbling from the excitement of simply performing again.

We stayed for the remainder of the Foreigner concert and thoroughly enjoyed their repertoire to which many of us grew up listening.





Leadership Academy
