# President's Message Submitted by Jay Althof - LO'L District President



Hello LO'L Members! There are many great things happening all across our District. Here is a quick recap on several of those items.

• The Barbershop Harmony International Convention was held in Louisville, KY the week of July 2nd. We were very well represented in the contests by the

Coulee Classic quartet from LaCrosse and the Forward Harmony and Midwest Vocal Express choruses from the Greendale chapter. The level of performances continues to rise and there was great enthusiasm by those who attended to both watch and participate in the barbershop experience.

• Over the last couple of years, we've been working hard to make our barbershop hobby more sustainable into the future. This past February we brought together the Society Board of Directors, Harmony Hall Leaders and the District Presidents Council. We wanted to understand the main challenges with our current organization, how we raise funds, and what we offer our members. After that meeting, we formed six smaller groups, and each group set specific goals to improve different parts of our hobby. They looked at the problems we face and came up with ideas to make

things better. Then, at the International Convention, everyone got back together for more than 4 hours of workshops. We discussed and decided on four important things to work on. One of those things is to test new ways for people to join us and how we should be funded. Working with selected chapters, we will try these new ideas as pilot programs. Our hope is that these changes will make it easier and more exciting for many more people to join and enjoy the barbershop experience for many years to come. I'll keep you informed about our progress, so stay tuned!

• On July 15th Barbershoppers from all across the District came to Two Rivers, WI to join with 335 Schmitt family members to dedicate a new performance stage in honor of the Schmitt Brothers quartet. Starting with a ribbon cutting ceremony at Noon and wrapping up the afterglow about 9:00 PM (and after-afterglow at about 1:30am, right St. Croix Crossing and Coulee Classic?), the whole event was outstanding. In addition to several performances by members of the Schmitt family, 10 District quartets and choruses provided entertainment from the new stage. The Manitowoc host chapter did an outstanding job working with the Schmitt family to organize this successful event. Thanks to all who participated and made this such a memorable day!

- 1. REGISTER FOR THE CONVENTION Register online with your credit card or download a mail-in registration order form and send it in with your check. You can also order a Saturday lunch, the Showcase dinner (chicken or pork), or get a ticket for the Saturday evening show. Once you register, your badges and meal and event tickets will be ready for you when you arrive.
- 2. RESERVE YOUR ROOM Reserve a room at the Headquarters Hotel MSP Airport Hilton Hotel, 3800 American Blvd E., Bloomington, MN 55425. You can register online, or you may call the front desk at (952) 854-2100. Press '0' and ask for the \$104 (plus tax) Barbershop Fall Convention Rate. There is a second link for the Embassy Suites (next door to the MSP Hilton) with a rate of \$154 (plus tax) per night.
- 3. CONTEST AND FESTIVAL REGISTRATION There will be a link to Barberscore on the Contest and Festival section of the registration webpage which opens August 1<sup>st</sup>. You must click on this link to register your chorus or quartet in Barberscore if you plan to sing in the contest or festival. Everyone crossing the judges' stage must be registered. Remember that all members of your chorus or quartet must also purchase an All-Events registration badge (\$60) for the convention. Contest and Festival registrations must be completed in Barberscore no later than midnight September 13<sup>th</sup>!
- 4. QUARTET CLINICS If your quartet would like coaching, the District is offering Quartet Clinics on Friday morning and a chance to perform in the afternoon. All you need is a quartet, two songs, and an All-Events registration badge all at no extra cost. Sign up with Mike Lietke either online or by mail.
- 5. ALL CHAPTER CHORUS You may register for the All-Chapter Chorus online. For just \$10 Steve Zorn will get you the music and the learning tracks. Another great opportunity for you to sing with some of the best! Just click on the webpage link to sign up.

We look forward to seeing you at our Barbershop Family Reunion. We had over 600 in attendance last year and want to break that record. Hope to see you soon!

# THE EARLY DAYS OF THE LAND O'LAKES DISTRICT

In the last issue of the Pitch Piper, I chronicled the meteoric rise of the Eau Claire chapter's Four Teens Quartet, who joined as charter members of the chapter and brand new members of SPEBSQSA in September, 1949. A few months later they performed on the chapter's first Parade of Quartets, then took their first shot at competition at the 1950 LOL Regional Contest hosted by Appleton. Just two years later they succeeded LOL's Schmitt Brothers as reigning International Barbershop Quartet champions.

It was the back-to-back international championships of LOL District quartets that I emphasized in my tribute to the 1952 champs from Eau Claire by way of the Scott Air Force Base in Illinois. I mentioned that the Teens in their gold medal performance became the youngest quartet to be awarded that honor (I think that record still stands). I also noted that the Teens' monumental achievement reemphasized the competitive dominance of Wisconsin quartets in early LOL district competition and the overall gigantic contributions of Wisconsin barbershoppers to the rapid growth of our magnificent hobby in the Land O'Lakes District and the greater Society. I'd like to expand on that a bit.

Let's look first at results of early LOL District Quartet competition. (I continue to argue that the Four Teens were indeed an LOL quartet and that their success adds to the dominance of Wisconsin quartets). The first LOL quartet championship was held in 1945 and was won by the Hi-Los from Milwaukee, who were to earn a medalist ranking at the following year's International Contest. Wisconsin quartets, moreover, proceeded to win seventeen of the first twenty LOL quartet gold medals. Part of this early Wisconsin success was doubtless related to their getting an early start in Barbershopping. The Wisconsin Association of Chapters was organized in 1945 so I assume that the 1945 contest included only Wisconsin quartets. The District was soon to grow, however. In 1947 it was renamed the Land O'Lakes District Association of Chapters and soon thereafter enlarged itself by adding Minnesota and Upper Michigan to its constituency.

The addition of Manitoba, Saskatchewan, certain other Canadian regions, and North Dakota in the next few years added competitive balance to LOL, but didn't immediately put an end to Badger quartet dominance. As mentioned earlier Badger foursomes brought home the gold medal in 17 of 20 LOL District contests from 1945 to 1964. Only the Atomic Bums (1949) and Hut Four (1958) from Minnesota, and the Gate City Four (1961) from North Dakota were able to avoid the Wisconsin quartet stranglehold. This changed, however, during the next twenty years. During that period (1965-1984) quartets from Minnesota earned thirteen gold medals, those from Wisconsin seven. The tide had definitely turned, doubtless aided in large measure by what I am about to report.

Without question the LOL District in general and Wisconsin chapters in particular played a most significant role in the growth of the Barbershop Society following its inception in 1938. For example, the first District chorus contest in the entire Society was held in Oshkosh in 1946. Eight years were to pass, however, before the first official Society-wide chorus contest took place in Washington, D.C.

Moreover, the Janesville chorus quickly took home the gold medal in the Society's second year of chorus competition in 1955. Our district also took the lead in the essential field of communication. The Society's first monthly publication, Harmony News, was edited by Sheboygan's Hans Beyer. And Leo Fobart from Stevens Point was named Associate Editor of the Society-wide publication, the Harmonizer, in 1961.

The Land O'Lakes district also provided the Society with high level administrative leadership. O.H. (King) Cole of Manitowoc served as Society President in 1948 and 1949, as did fellow Manitowoc Barbershopper, John Means, in 1953-54. Val Hicks in his "Heritage of Harmony" history of Barbershopping stated that no man had more missionary zeal in starting new chapters than Cole, who organized eight new chapters including both Sheboygan and Manitowoc, for whom he served as chapter president simultaneously. Apparently, Cole's daughter, Ginny, shared his zeal and love of Barbershop harmony. She and three of her Sheboygan friends organized a popular women's Barbershop quartet named the Chordettes in 1946 which appeared on Barbershop shows throughout the United States, recorded a Barbershop album, won the Godfrey Talent Scouts competition, and subsequently earned a spot as regulars on Godfrey's radio and television shows. (This was long before they recorded "Mr. Sandman" and "Lollipop.") The Chordettes, Schmitt Brothers, Four Teens, Sing-copates (1951 LOL District Champs and 1953 Third-Place International Medalists) and a wealth of excellent LOL show quartets made planning for Chapter Parades of Quartets an enjoyable task.

This same plethora of talented quartets likely stimulated the growth and development of Barbershop chapters and quartets throughout the LOL District. I know that I couldn't wait to get in on the fun. I grew up in Sheboygan County, attending not only the Sheboygan Chapter's annual Parade of Quartets, but performances they did at the Hingham Hall, just a few miles from our farm. I am now enjoying my 71st year of Barbershop fun thanks to all of the Barbershoppers and Barbershop groups I've just cited.

And a lot of you readers, and more likely predecessors of you readers, joined me in the worship of seventh chords and wonderful camaraderie as well. By 1954 our Land O'Lakes District had become the Society's largest district in terms of membership and second largest in average members per chapter. Sheboygan led the way with 159 members, second in the Barbershop Society only to the Manhattan, New York chapter. (Not bad for a metropolis of about 42,000 souls). And one last important stat. St. Paul ranked first, Duluth fourth, and Marquette, Michigan fifth across all Society chapters in percentage of membership growth over a specified period of time.

I'd say that we 2023 LOL'ers should be mighty proud of and thankful for those who helped O.C. Cash build this wonderful organization. Now it's our turn to keep America and the whole world singing!!!

# Schmitt Brothers Stage Dedication Brings Harmony to Two Rivers

In the same park where the city of Two Rivers welcomed their hometown heroes after they won the 1951 International SPEBSQSA Championship on the first try, the new Schmitt Brothers Stage was dedicated to the harmonies of six quartets and four choruses. It was an incredible day for Barbershop Harmony in Wisconsin!

For the past 18 months, the city has been working with the extended Schmitt family to build a lasting memorial to honor the four brothers – Jim, Joe, Paul and Fran Schmitt – who put Two Rivers on the map. The extended Schmitt family along with their barbershop friends raised more than \$122,000 for the naming rights.

"If the quartet was alive today, they would be thrilled to hear the harmony of this wonderful celebration and see this city coming together to create and enjoy this beautiful park," said Jim Schmitt, son of the quartet's lead singer and former longtime mayor of Green Bay.

Jim emceed the official dedication, introducing City Manager Greg Buckley as well as the two surviving spouses of the quartet, Mary Ann (Jim) Schmitt and Toni (Joe) Schmitt Becker, who were feted with bouquets of roses. Toni reminisced about attending the original welcome home event where people packed the park, much like the audience at the dedication. Mary Ann sincerely thanked everyone involved with building the stage, from the excavators and construction workers to the high school students who fabricated the decorative screen for the back of the stage. More than 325 Schmitt family descendants from nearly 20 states attended the celebration and gathered on stage to sing a Schmitt Brothers favorite, "These will be the Good Old Days."

Hundreds of people were involved in building, funding and celebrating the stage's

dedication. Jim, Father Carl, Bill, Tom and Tony Schmitt (sons of lead singer Jim) spearheaded the fundraising efforts. Christine Beck (daughter of quartet baritone Paul) chaired the design committee responsible for the stone donor wall and huge bronze plaques that tell the stories of the Schmitt Brothers quartet and their family. John Gorski (nephew of the quartet) managed the efforts of the Schmitt Brothers Eleven, Inc., the family organization that not only helped fund the stage but plan the celebration.

Vice President of Chapter Development for the Clipper City Chordsmen Jim Rasmus and Bill Schmitt (son of lead singer Jim) coordinated the talented line up for the three-hour Harmony Show, emceed by 2004 International Senior Quartet Champion and Downstate Express lead singer Bruce Odell, Land O'Lakes District President Jay Althof, and Barbershop Harmony Society CEO Marty Monson.

Following the show, the Schmitt family invited their barbershop friends to dinner in the Community House with place settings for nearly 500. Of course, an afterglow ensued followed by an after-after glow at the Cool City Brewing Company, which offered a commemorative Schmitt Brothers Barbershop Brew for the occasion... and stayed open extra late to accommodate the enthusiastic songsters!

Throughout the day, the park was filled to capacity. Many took advantage of taking a photo while sitting on a park bench with a life-sized cutout of the Schmitt Brothers or having their copy of "The Schmitt Brothers" book signed by the author.

"The Schmitt Brothers are still remembered today, and their legacy here will last for years and years," said Bill Schmitt. "Our sincere thanks to all the barbershoppers who made this historic day possible... and fun!"

What a summer it has been so far! First, a huge congratulations and thank you to our Land O' Lakes district representatives at the International Contests in Louisville, Kentucky! Both choruses from the Greendale, WI chapter (Midwest Vocal Express and Forward Harmony) did an awesome job in an increasingly competitive contest, and Coulee Classic had their highest score ever in the quartet contest, exceeding an 80% average (80.5) for the first time!

Second, a reminder for anyone interested in submitting an application for consideration in the BHS Contest & Judging program, applications with letters of recommendations are due December 15, 2023 to dir-cj@loldistrict.org. This application window is only open once every three years, so if you feel you are ready to apply, send that application in! Finally, we are NOW accepting entries for the Fall District Quartet/Chorus Contest and Festival in Bloomington!! Head over to https://loldistrict.org/2023-fall-convention for the entry link. Make sure to purchase your registration to the Fall Convention, as that is a BHS and District requirement to compete. In addition, make sure your BHS and District dues are current/paid as of October 13, 2023 so that your group (chorus or quartet) is not disqualified. Entries are due September 13, 2023 at 11:59pm, so be sure to get your entry in soon!

If you have not been to a Land O' Lakes convention in recent years, and are unsure if you want to compete (or you're sure you don't!), we encourage all of you – chorus and quartet – to walk across the same stage as the competitors, as part of the regular draw, singing for the same judges, but as a Festival participant. While your group will not be eligible for any awards, your scores do not appear on the scoresheets, and you still get to sing for the same, amazing Land O' Lakes district audience during our convention! In addition, you can have feedback sessions (formerly called "evaluations") with the judges, just like the competitors. It is a super fun and educational way to get in front of the best audience in barbershop and learn how your group can get even better afterwards in a low-to-no pressure, non-contest environment.

Give it a shot! I promise you you'll have a blast! Oh, and feedback sessions (evals) will be done before dinner on Saturday, so NO LATE NIGHTS worrying about your feedback session. You'll be free to party starting at the Saturday night dinner! Heckuva deal!
