

# Interview with Chuck Guthrie

September 17, 2023 by Tim Milbrandt

This is the first in a series of interview articles focusing on barbershoppers around the Land O' Lakes district who have made an impact on other barbershoppers and the hobby overall. If you know of someone who made an impact on barbershop and barbershoppers either as a quartet singer, director, administrator or in some other way that you feel has a valuable story to share, please suggest them to the editor by writing to Nate Peplinski at pitchpiper@loldistrict.com.

The inaugural subject in this series is Chuck Guthrie. You may know Chuck as the baritone in his district champion quartet Gemini Crickets, as longtime director of the Rochester Medicine/Music Men, or as just an all around great guy. What got you into music? I grew up in musical family; my mother was a piano player and played for silent movies. She had a baby grand. Dad worked for Minneapolis Tribune (grew up in Montana). I was born in Wisconsin, moved to Kentucky, Montana in 1936. I took piano lessons from mother and played drums.

When did you start singing barbershop?

We moved to Minneapolis when I was in 6th grade and I started trombone lessons. I sang in junior high and high school. In my junior year of high school I started a quartet called the "2x 4's". We got to see the "Four Teens" (1952 International Quartet Champions) perform at the Minneapolis show. Our quartet tried out for the Ted Mack Amateur hour, and there was a girls quartet, the "Harmony Honeys" right ahead of us from Jeffers Minnesota. More on this in a bit.

I visited the Minneapolis Commodores in 1952 and there I met Joel Kleschold who talked me into joining the chapter. We formed the "Four Flips" from within the Minneapolis chapter. We competed in 2 district contests with me singing lead. With veterinary school and getting married I dropped out of the quartet.

I went to college at University of Minnesota and worked that summer at a ranch in WY. One of my quartet mates started dating one of the gals in the Harmony Honeys, and soon I started dating another one. To make a long story short, we were eventually married. My wife Carol competed at Sweet Adeline International with her quartet and they finished 6th. This was back in the day when quartets were timed and if they didn't stay within the time parameters, were penalized. Well Carol's quartet were penalized for singing less than 4 minutes or would have finished higher.

We moved to South Dakota and started a barbershop chapter in Eureka SD. After a few years a classmate called and convinced me to take a job in Rochester, MN. I started as a large animal vet for 6 years and was working up to 90 hours per week. I loved working with large animals, and especially cows.

Eventually Del Ryberg and I started the Rochester Chapter in 1959/1960 and I was the initial director. Over the years others stepped in to direct here and there but I ended up doing most of it. Back in those days the quartet was king and ruled.

Share some more about your quartetting over the years. I was in several quartets over the years including "The Other Brothers" and "The Vocal Quads" among others. Myron Snesrud was the bass of my quartets. Then, a fella name Rod Johnson moved to Rochester from Waseca, and we got into a quartet together called the "Gemini Crickets".

Rod worked for me for a bit doing accounting for my dog and cat veterinary business and then started working at IBM. The "Gemini Crickets" first district qualified for International in Los Angeles. The other three members of the quartet worked at IBM in Rochester so Chuck would go out to the plant 3-4 times a week and they would sing in a stairwell, plus meet in the evenings. Lloyd Steinkamp worked for the Barbershop Society and would come to

town occasionally and coach the quartet in the stairwell at IBM. He told us "you guys be ready, when they announce you, the applause will be deafening so be prepared for it". It turned out we were on immediately before intermission and the Nighthawks (one of the favorites for the contest) were just before us. All we saw were peoples backs headed toward the exits when we took the stage. Not quite what we expected. We never finished in Top 20 but were 28th, it seems like 5 years running. We won the LOL district quartet championship in the fall of 1967 and last competed at international in 1971.

We were asked to go on a USO tour to the far east for 17 days, but I couldn't leave my practice so the quartet found another baritone who worked at IBM and got paid leave from IBM to represent them on the tour.

Rod Johnson eventually moved to the Twin Cities and started a quartet called "Happiness Emporium" (1975 International Champions).

Tell us about your directing and other activities.

I directed the Sweet Adeline chorus in Rochester for 5 years and loved it. The gals would learn their music and make their own outfits. This activity was made extra sweet because my wife Carol sang with the group.

I directed the Rochester Barbershop chorus until 1992 when Merle Savage took over.

I started singing with the "Alley Cats" quartet, which included Myron Snesrud, Dale Massey, Ken Knapp and myself. The four couples were all good friends and had loads of fun together. We got a chance to sing with the Turkey River All Stars band. What a great time it was singing with a whole band!

My wife Carol died unexpectedly and I moved to Lakeville in 2011. I rejoined the Commodores and competed with them once.

I'm an active member of the lunch bunch in the Twin Cities that meets every Thursday. There are a lot of members including some long time barbershoppers like Judd Orff, Steve Zorn and Bob Dykstra.

I'm also a member of the BQPA (Barbershop Quartet Preservation Association) and attend activities twice a year.

I winter in Arizona now and meet occasionally with a local group. I would like to get a quartet going in Arizona. For me, quartets are where it is at! There is nothing like the sound or four voices blending together.

What are highlights of your barbershop career?

- #1 Trying out for the Ted Mack amateur hour and meeting my bride.
- #2 Winning the LOL district quartet championship.
- #3 Seeing the lead I sang with for 6 years win the International quartet championship. I wasn't there when they won but I met them when they landed in Minneapolis upon their return to congratulate them.

One of Chucks great goals in life of barbershop was to get his picture on the front of the Harmonizer as a top 10 quartet member. In October 1972 on the face of the Harmonizer there is a collage of pictures of Chuck directing. He was directing the Rochester chapter at the Apache Mall in Rochester. Unbeknownst to Chuck, there was a photographer for the Rochester Post-Bulletin, taking pictures of Chuck directing. It was on front page of the paper the next day. SPEBSQSA used the collage on the cover of the harmonizer. In a way, he achieved his goal!

Chuck recently had a 90th birthday party with 180 people in attendance. There were 5 quartets singing including Gay 90's, Just One More (Minneapolis), Vocality, Happiness Emporium, and the Benson Family Singers.



# Harlequin Quartet Marks Its 25th Anniversary

We were very pleased on September 9, 2023, to host family and friends at a celebration commemorating 25 years since we formed the quartet, Harlequin bsq. We planned and hosted the event because we wanted to celebrate this achievement and share it with others who have been part of our journey. We featured a powerpoint show highlighting memorable moments over the past quarter century plus displays of awards, trophies, quartet attire and various memorabilia. It was a real highlight to present the crowd with a unique show featuring 25 years of our history with stories and songs.

We started rehearsing together in the fall of 1998, came up with a quartet name and set a goal to dedicate every Tuesday evening to improving our harmonies and becoming good entertainers. It's hard to believe that 25 years later, we would all still be singing together and dedicated to our Tuesday night rehearsals. Even though there are other quartets who are or have been active for this length of time, we decided it was a relatively rare feat for the same 4 guys to stay together this long and certainly

worth marking the occasion.

The evening program started by having each quartet member briefly describe their individual path that brought them all together. We appreciated the many positive comments from audience members about how much they enjoyed hearing that story. We also reminisced about being invited by Bruce O'Dell to be guest performers at a series of gospel shows for a fund-raising event in Winona, Minnesota more than 20 years ago. Fortunately, Bruce gave us sufficient notice that we were able to bolster our gospel repertoire for the show. Thanks to that experience, we recorded a gospel CD in later years and, to this day, we still include gospel numbers in our performances that date back to the Winona shows more than 2 decades ago. We've been very active over all of these years, winning the Winnipeg Chapter Quartet of the Year award 17 times. So, we knew that only a small sample of our quartet memories could be squeezed into a 1-hour show. Just our special guest and headline appearances alone span an area extending from Fort Frances, Ontario (east) to Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan (west) and from Dauphin, Manitoba (north) to Galesburg, Illinois (south). But we made sure to perform a couple of songs that we had sung for two different performances with the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra. We also included a Joe Liles number in our program that we had used in a play in 2015 that was a re-enactment commemorating the 100th anniversary of the Manitoba Women's suffragette movement that led to their successful campaign giving Manitoba women the first in Canada to win the right to vote. We're proud of the fact that this re-enactment was recorded and used as a teaching aid in Manitoba schools.

We extend our thanks to Gordon Billows, Winnipeg Chapter historian, who will be archiving our September 9th powerpoint show and program script, to preserve the memory of the occasion, which just happened to occur in the same year that the chapter is marking its 75th anniversary. We give another big thankyou to everyone who attended and for all of your well wishes. You made it a very enjoyable evening for all of us.
