Introducing dogs to each other can be an exciting and rewarding experience, but it's important to approach it carefully and thoughtfully to ensure that both dogs feel comfortable and safe.

It's best to introduce our dogs in a neutral location.

Use leashes and have control: Each dog should be on a leash, held by their owner. This will give you control over the situation and allow you to separate the dogs if necessary.

Start at a distance: Begin by walking the dogs at a distance from each other so they can get used to being in each other's presence. Gradually decrease the distance between the dogs as they become more comfortable.

Monitor their behaviour: Watch your dog's closely for signs of discomfort, such as growling or baring teeth. If either dog shows signs of aggression or fear, separate them immediately and try again another time.

Offer rewards: Reward good behaviour with treats and praise. This will help the dogs associate being around each other with positive experiences.

Don't force interaction: Let the dogs approach each other at their own pace. Some dogs may be more hesitant than others, and it's important to respect their boundaries.

We end the introduction on a positive note, such as with the walk or some playtime. This will help the dogs associate each other with good experiences.

As for sharing the same space for three nights, it's important to supervise our dogs closely and keep them separated when we are not able to watch them.

You will have your own room that you and your dog/s can move to for space at any time. Safety and of course fun is what we are going for with everyone involved (dogs included) of course.
