# Sidewalk Sunday School



#### **Much with Little**

"Do not despise these small beginnings, for the Lord rejoices to see the work begin, to see the plumb line in Zerubbabel's hand." Zechariah 4:10

Gideon with only 300 men defeated the Midianite army of 135,000 (Judges 7). The disciples find a boy who has five barley loaves and two fish. They say to Jesus, "What good are these for so many?". Jesus took what little the boy had and fed thousands.

God calls Zerubbabel to rebuild the temple. After much opposition the work ceased for seventeen years. God calls him to return to what he started. In this new beginning, Zerubbabel holds something small and seemingly insignificant, a plumb line.

Years of work had already taken place; plans did not progress the way they anticipated. The work would begin again not with some large or significant tool but with something little. When God's involved little becomes much.

The purpose of the plumb line in Zerubbabel's hands was to keep the walls lined up correctly. Without it, the walls of the temple would not have stood the test of time. Zerubbabel needed this small tool to correctly finish the work God had called him to do.

What God has placed in our hands, regardless of how large or small, significant or insignificant, will we use it for His glory? Great moves of God often begin as seemingly insignificant thoughts, dreams, desires placed in the hands of those who will steward them well.

When starting this ministry, we didn't have significant resources or a large team. Even today we don't have much but the little we have God does much with it. Every small beginning, every small assignment we have in our hands has a purpose.

Small things are happening but these small things are significant. Little things happening are significant in the eyes of the Lord. We must humbly serve the Lord where ever He calls, in whatever He calls us to do, however much it cost. We must not despise the day of small things.

The Lord rejoices in that the work He's called one to has simply begun. God knows we are incapable of completing the work He's called us to do. Gideon didn't have the ability to defeat the Midianites. The disciples couldn't feed thousands with five loaves and two fish.

Zerubbabel, even with the plumb line in hand, couldn't rebuild the temple. God took what little they had as they gave their hearts to Him and multiplied their resources, their efforts, and their ability to accomplish what seemed impossible.

Small things have begun but significant things are happening. Greater things to come are outside of our reach but we serve a great and wonderful God. We're grateful that God will continue to take the little we have and do much with it.
