Running the Race

What are some things you are looking forward to this new year? The answer to this question reveals, at least in part, the type of race in life you are running. New year resolutions have been set; goals are being pursued.

We may not all be runners or athletes but we're all running a race. What are you running towards? What's your idea of a finish line for your life? Paul says in Philippians 3:14, "I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus."

This upward call of God in Christ Jesus is one that I challenge and encourage each of us to consider. Too often most of the goals and things we pursue are in the realm of horizontal living as opposed to vertical (upward) living to which we have been called.

There's nothing wrong with personal goals (i.e. eating healthier, saving money, exercising, reading more, getting organized, etc.) These are good things and often necessary things in our lives. However, we must consider how these things (our personal goals) bring us and others close(r) to Jesus.

What good is it to run a race so focused on horizontal living that we neglect the call to vertical (upward) living? Vertical living empowers horizontal living not the other way around. The more we focus on Jesus and pursue Him the greater impact He has on our everyday daily living and horizontal position in the world.

Paul said earlier in this chapter that his sole desire was to know Jesus and the power of His resurrection. The focus of his life and the race he was running is the heartbeat of our ministry – to know Jesus, to make Jesus known, and to be known by Him.

Paul's eyes were so fixed on Jesus that every area of his life was impacted. Every choice that he made and decision he considered was filtered through the lens of the Gospel. We run the race to see children saved as God captures them with His love and grace.

We go into the dark places of the earth, hopeless places of desperation, and preach the Gospel of Jesus Christ who is light in the darkness and hope in seasons of hopelessness. Our focus this year isn't on how big we can grow as a ministry, how much money we can raise, or how many large events we can run.

These aren't bad things, but they are horizontal things of which God hasn't called us to prioritize. Our focus is on leading children to Jesus one person at a time. When we prioritize vertical (upward) living and the call to simply know Jesus all things horizontally fall into place.

Our ministry is growing, our influence is growing, our volunteer base is growing. Together let's prioritize everything that bring us and others close to Jesus. We can't even begin to comprehend or imagine what God would do in response if this remained the meditation of our hearts.
