#### What you need: Cardboard

- egg carton
   Acrylic paint Paintbrush
- Darning needle
- Fishing twine
- Scissors
- Googly eye
- or buttons




#### What you do:


- 1. From the egg carton, cut out the 12 cups. From the lid, cut out two fish tails.
- 2. On a protected surface, turn the cups upside down. Paint the outside of each cup and both sides of the tails. Let dry.
- 3. Thread the needle with an arm's length of twine. Tie a knot at the end.
- 4. Thread the needle through the end of the tail. Tie another knot an inch from the tail.
- 5. Thread the needle through one upside-down cup. Pull the twine through until the cup rests on the knot.
- 6. Continue tying knots an inch above each cup and threading on another cup until you've strung six cups. Tie a knot above the last cup and leave a long string to hang the fish. (You can make two fish with each egg carton.)
- Add googly eyes or buttons to the last cup to make a face.

Dear Beloved Children of God.

Welcome 2025! Are you as surprised as I am at how quickly we sped through 2024? I hope you are still Incide this issued enjoying the Christmas season as it does last for twelve days - until Jan. 5th. Then, Epiphany is on Jan. 6th. The themes of Epiphany per umcdiscipleship.org are: "the nativity, incarnation, and baptism of Christ" (continuing those themes from the Christmas season.) Other themes "include those around the Magi: gift giving; human search for and recognition of the divine in our midst; God's self-revealing and manifestation among us; evangelism; and missions."

The last Epiphany theme listed, missions, is going to be a focus of 2025. Most of us, though not all of us, are incredibly blessed financially. We have more than enough money to meet the basic needs of life for ourselves and our families. However, this is not the case for all God's children. So, there are plenty

of mission opportunities for us, Growing Friends families and church families, to collaborate and to help to make a difference in the lives of the people in our community and even around the world. Something which I think is an exciting prospect is that we will get to know each other, build relationships and strengthen the connections between the church and the childcare center families, all while caring for others.



Of course, donations of money are one way to support the non-profit groups, but so is serving people. There are two mission-focused entities we have contacted to see how we can help in early 2025 – the Stewartstown Food Pantry (SFP) and Mission Central. The Stewartstown Food Pantry says: "We are people from the community working together to care for one another. We come from all faiths or no faith. Just people working to care for one another because we respond to God who cares for everyone." We are trying to get a date when we can help them distribute food and/or do other tasks which a group could do to help. Back in VBS 2023, birthday cake kits were donated and were very much appreciated by the recipients of those kits. So, creating the kits here and donating them to SFP is another possibility.

Mission Central began as a United Methodist organization, but it is now its own non-profit entity. The main warehouse is based in Camp Hill. Its mission statement is "Connecting God's Resources with Human Need." This year "Mission Central provided resources worth \$815,536 for weather-related

disaster relief through October 2024" and it "delivered emergency supplies to over 100,205 people affected by Hurricanes Helene and Milton." They receive donations which are part of different types of kits, and they are also happy to receive kits which have already been assembled. We are set to serve at Mission Central on Sat., Mar. 1st from 9-11:30. If you'd like to serve there that day, please email me at rmcgee@susumc.org or call the church at 717-244-1984. There are volunteer forms which we must complete prior to serving at Mission Central.

If you have ideas for other places we could serve, please let me know using the same contact info previously listed. I pray that we will all have a safe and blessed 2025 and that we will work together to be a blessing to others in 2025, too.

#### CHRISTIAN SYMBOL - NOAH'S ARK



The image of an ark, or boat — often shown with pairs of animals — recalls the story of Noah and the "Great Flood" in Genesis. The floodwaters represent God's judgment on sin, while the ark reminds us of his gracious power to save and redeem. In this account, Christians see a foreshad—owing of our baptism into Christ: "And baptism, which [God's rescue of Noah and his family] prefigured, now saves you ..." (1 Peter 3:21, NRSV).

### FINANCIAL STANDING

The Shares of Ministry monthly expense payments remain in arrears for the months of February through December. If no other payment is made during December, at the end of December 2024 the amount in arrears for those eleven months will be \$28,183.21 (11 x \$2,562.11/mo).

The church oil tank was filled on December 10 with the resulting invoice of \$2,413.50 paid in December.

In addition to the normal tithes and offerings received this year, there have been several other types of financial support. During November an estate gift was received in the amount of \$49,000.00. A decision has not yet been made as to how the 10% tithe of \$4,900 will be used. Additional income includes, but is not limited to, donations from the Senior Youth candy making project from 2023 and 2024, the sale of the church owned zero turn mower, donations to purchase water when the UV light was not registering correctly, proceeds from metal recycling, facility rental donations for use of the all-purpose room, 5% discount proceeds from the purchase of Giant and Jerry's gift cards, and the clergy support received from Bethany Felton beginning in October.

Money received is used not only for ongoing operational expenses but also in support of our engaging in ministry. When we've asked this year for special financial donations, money has been provided that supported several organizations including Community Reach, UMCOR Hurricane Relief, Gideon International, pennies for the UM Children's Home, and the Pittsburgh Theological Seminary to honor Pastor Becky.

Thank you for your continued support as we work to make disciples of Jesus Christ and help all persons Encounter God, Experience Love, and Engage in Ministry.



Thank you to Connie Human for organizing our Christmas Covered Dish and to everyone who helped set up and clean up! It was a fun evening of great food and fellowship! We enjoyed having some ladies from Bethany Felton Nomen join us and hope to see them in the future.
