Sermon & Scripture this Week: Exodus 2:1-10

Is Civil Disobedience Wrong? Exodus 2:1-10 Birth and Youth of Moses

Now a man from the house of Levi went and married a Levite woman. The woman conceived and bore a son; and when she saw that he was a fine baby, she hid him three months. When she could hide him no longer she got a papyrus basket for him, and plastered it with bitumen and pitch; she put the child in it and placed it among the reeds on the bank of the river. His sister stood at a distance, to see what would happen to him. The daughter of Pharaoh came down to bathe at the river, while her attendants walked beside the river. She saw the basket among the reeds and sent her maid to bring it. When she opened it, she saw the child. He was crying, and she took pity on him. "This must be one of the Hebrews' children," she said. Then his sister said to Pharaoh's daughter, "Shall I go and get you a nurse from the Hebrew women to nurse the child for you?" Pharaoh's daughter said to her, "Yes." So the girl went and called the child's mother. Pharaoh's daughter said to her, "Take this child and nurse it for me, and I will give you your wages." So the woman took the child and nursed it. When the child grew up, she brought him to Pharaoh's daughter, and she took him as her son. She named him Moses, "because," she said, "I drew him out of the water."

It seems it is that time of year for graduations – Pomp & Circumstance, robes, tassels, mortarboards and all that. Here in Florida we continue to deal with book bans in our public schools and contentious school board meetings. We just celebrated Teacher Appreciation Week May 6-10 while trying to reconcile that

with the April report from the

National Education Association that ranks Florida 50th in average teacher pay. Add to that U.S. News & World Report's recent ranking of Florida as the #1 state for education. You may recall the "open letter" from the Florida Conference, which was sent to the Governor and legislators regarding controversial issues surrounding public education in Florida. It appeared as a paid advertisement in the Orlando Sentinel at the end of December. [The open letter may be found in

the December 6 Sunshine Connection and the February/March issue of Celebrate Florida.] We are grateful to have congregations that gift hardcover books to students at Christmas and over the summer, provide after-school and summer tutoring and mentoring, create banned book libraries on church property, donate funds to teachers to supplement the personal monies they use for school supplies and have rallied in support of New College in Sarasota. In today's space in the Sunshine Connection we are shining the spotlight on congregations which offer scholarships to students to pursue a post-high school education. We commend them for this special ministry. We note also that the Florida Conference offers a few very specific educational grants (see www.uccfla.org/requestscholarshipsmatchinggrantsorawards).


