Dr. Jensen's Property Proposal: Motion by T. Parry/2nd V. Ives for Sharon's Selectmen to pursue purchase of adjoining property for \$47,000 using funds from capital improvement account. This account has approximately \$115,000 which has not been earmarked for anything special. P. Chamberlain said this property could be used as an extension of our playground with some grading and some seeding using volunteer help. The motion carried with one no vote (D. Hall) and one abstention (B. Ives).
