

#### CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

Christian Ed continues to miss our time with the children. We hope that your families will enjoy the Advent calendars with the opportunity to open a new scripture and picture for each day. Rev. Terri's daily devotions are also a nice way to celebrate the season.

During Advent, we will continue email children's Sunday school material. For the younger children we will be using Children's Bulletins on the Advent themes of Hope, Peace, Love and Joy. For the older children, we have an Advent Mystery Room adventure. There will be a mystery each Sunday to solve and a final code to determine from the four weeks. So each solved mystery should be saved until the quest is done.

### Back-to-School Fair End-of-Year Report

I missed the excitement, fun, and hard work of hosting the back-to-school fair this year; how about you? Our alternative to hosting the fair this year was providing 41 nylon carry bags with homemade bookmarks and graphing calculators (TI-83 Pluses, for the most part) to Downers Grove South High School, O'Neill Middle School, Thomas Jefferson Junior High School, and to several church members. The calculators are useful for solving mathematical problems, particularly those on standardized tests (SATs and ACTs). We have also answered calls from several families and provided them with backpacks made up from leftover supplies from last year. And, thanks to our long-term and ongoing relationship with Love Christian Clearinghouse, we were able to donate to their drive to provide 20 pairs of gym shoes to needy students at Highland Elementary School in Downers Grove.

Our 2020 fair budget was uncertain owing to the COVID-related cancelation of the Women's Tea, so it was a special joy when we received a substantial grant from the Pro-Reconciliation, Anti-Racism committee of The Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in Illinois and Wisconsin. Having our church's fundamental beliefs acknowledged by the CCIW is, indeed, a great blessing.

Thank you all for your contributions and support of the fair over the years. I wish I could say for sure that we will be able to host the fair in 2021. But it all depends on reaching phase 5 of the governor's plan, which basically requires a well-distributed vaccine or a readily available, effective treatment. We keep praying for achieving this goal--for many reasons. I suspect that 2021 will require more "outside the box" thinking regarding the fair, requiring us to again adapt to whatever path God chooses for us. Please let me know if you have any ideas or insights about our community outreach.

### Holiday celebrations from around the world:



- \*Las Posadas (Mexico) For nine nights during this Christmas celebration, people reenact Mary and Joseph's search for lodging in Bethlehem. In some communities, a man and a woman dress as Mary and Joseph. In other communities, children carry figures of them. People follow Mary and Joseph until they are granted entry to a home, where they have a party with a piñata for the children
- \*Año Viejo (Ecuador) On December 31, families make a scarecrow that looks like an old man. They write his will, which is a list of everyone's faults. They dance around him and read his will at midnight. Then they burn the scarecrow so they can start the new year without faults.
- \*Chanukah (Jewish) The Jewish Festival of Lights is a celebration of religious freedom. It is celebrated by lighting candles each night for eight nights, giving gifts, eating traditional foods, and playing dreidel games.
- \*Luciadagen (Sweden) This holiday has its roots in winter solstice celebrations. The oldest girl in each family plays the part of St. Lucia. According to the legend, she dons a white dress and a crown of candles and takes coffee and special buns to her parents.
