Back-to-School Fair



Although we will not be hosting a large back-to-school fair on our campus this year, our back-to-school outreach ministry will continue! Last year, we donated graphing calculators to three schools. This effort was much appreciated, so we are again providing needy students at those schools (Downers Grove South High School, Jefferson Junior High School, and O'Neill Middle School) with calculators. We need a total of 35 calculators for this effort. The calculators are essential tools for developing skills necessary for success in mathematics and physics.

New this year is our partnering with the local elementary school, El Sierra, for both students and teachers. Our primary goal is to provide school supplies to 33 families whose children attend El Sierra (total of 54 children). Fifteen teachers also asked for assistance to help reduce their own out-of-pocket expenses, so we are going to set up a "star" tree in Fellowship Hall with different needs and dollar amounts on them. Churchgoers can choose a star (or two!) and purchase supplies themselves, or donate cash and the BTSF committee will do the shopping!

Once we have ordered, received, and sorted the school supplies based on the students' grade levels, we will distribute them from Fellowship Hall at prearranged times on Saturday, August 14.

The back-to-school ministry was gratefully aided this year by donations from the outdoor concert led by our pianist, Rick Sladek, four of his musician friends, and the Chicago Federation of Musicians. The well-attended concert featured two classical/jazz suites by the renowned French composer Claude Bolling.

We are continually heartened by helping provide school supplies to families in the area who might otherwise go without. It is a blessing to be able to do God's work in this way, and we hope to continue the ministry for many years to come!

The traditional diet in the Czech Republic may be considered heavy, with an emphasis of meat, potatoes, and dumplings and the use of substantial amounts of animal fats, butter, and cream. Meats – primarily pork, beef, poultry, and organ meats such as liver, kidneys, brains, and sweetbreads – are frequently prepared with gravy and eaten with potatoes or dumplings (*knedlik*, pl. *knedliky*). Soups are an important part of the noon meal. Potato and tripe soup are favorites, as well as beef or chicken broth with tiny liver or marrow dumplings. The most commonly used vegetables are carrots, peas, and cabbage. Salads were eaten only seasonally until recent years.
