The **Korean** father is the head of the family; he and the oldest son receive the greatest respect.

Traditionally, men were seen as the primary providers and final decision-makers, and mothers were responsible for supervising the household and children.

Today, however, women are generally expected to work outside the home to help support their families and pay for their children's educational expenses, which can be significant given the focus on high-quality education in South Korea. Women have increasingly been able to pursue both higher education and careers. However, broadened opportunities for women have not meant an increase in household responsibilities for men.

Working women are still expected to maintain households and rear children often without help from their working husbands. Although women comprise slightly more than half of the labor force, their status is lower than men's in the workplace. Even so, urban women enjoy greater equality with men than do rural women, and women occupy a growing number of high positions in traditionally male-dominated fields. Female politicians are becoming more common, and the first female president was elected in 2012.
