

#### **PARISH COUNCIL NEWS**



As a Parish Council we feel very privileged to be involved in the Annual Remembrance Sunday Service at St Luke's Church and it is an honour to be invited to place a wreath in the church as part of that service. Our Chair, Councillor Ajaz in front of a full congregation was one of several people representing organisations and the armed forces who placed a wreath in memory of those that served and lost their lives in protecting our country. Following the service, a further wreath was laid on the village green at the base of the village sign, directly below the plaque commemorating that Stoke Hammond is a 'Thankful Village' one of 53 such communities in England who suffered no fatalities in the First World War, where all those left for the war did thankfully return home alive. The

picture to the left shows Cllrs Ajaz, Noble & Venn plus ex-serviceman Greg Peck at the Village sign after the laying of the wreath.

You may recall in the last Parish Council News we made mention of the proposed development on the land south of Newton Leys (Chadwell Farm) seeking to build up to 290 dwellings, in that the applicant had submitted an appeal for non-determination. The hearing date for the appeal is still set for the 9<sup>th</sup> December at the Buckinghamshire Gateway offices in Aylesbury, but where previously 8 days had been allocated, this has been reduced to 3. Perhaps due to the fact that Bucks Planning have advised they will not be attending the hearing and have submitted documentation advising that if the application had not gone to appeal, they would have anyway approved this development. Representatives from both Stoke Hammond and Newton Longville Parish Council will be in attendance, the latter presenting very strong arguments and evidence that the applicant's figure for increased traffic numbers that would be generated by this new development are wrong, basically incorrectly calculated and thus have seriously underestimated what the actual numbers would be. Given, Newton Longville is already a 'rat run' for traffic travelling between Newton Leys and the A421 Buckingham Road, they have major concerns that this new development would only make things far worse. As for your Parish Council, we will be reiterating our previous objections as made to the planning authorities in relation to this proposed development, but in addition and with the independent examiner of our evolving Neighbourhood Plan being very supportive and complimentary of our said Plan, we have in advance of the hearing written to inspector highlighting the following:

As part of the Neighbourhood plan process, the Parish Council undertook a 'call for sites' in 2021. There was no submission made for Chadwell Farm (Appellant site) despite the Council contacting the owners on several occasions.

- The Neighbourhood Plan identifies specific site allocations, and that for Newton Leys South is the site to the west sitting on the corner of the Drayton and Newton Road. The examiner has concluded that the Parish Council's proposals make sense in land use terms and the reasoning of the Parish Council is entirely sound. The appellant's site falls outside of these development limits.
- Thus, the Parish Council opposes the appellants application on the grounds that it is not compliant with the Neighbourhood Plan and the examiner's recommendations, with the plan proceeding to referendum early in 2026.

The inspector has subsequently accepted these Parish Council comments.

In part still on the subject of land, the Parish Council have been involved in some exploratory discussions with Buckinghamshire Highways concerning the Stoke Road Layby and the small area of land just to the r/h side of Old School Lane as you enter from Fenny Road. With regard to the former, Bucks Highways do very much wish to be relieved of the responsibility and burden for maintaining and the continually clearing of fly tipped rubbish in the layby. They have therefore put forward a proposal to the Parish Council to gift the ownership to the Parish Council and also cover all legal costs in doing so including those associated with the process for the declassification as a layby area. Whilst much research and indeed public consultation would be required it was unanimously agreed by all councillors at our November meeting that this was certainly something that warranted further investigation. Likewise, the proposal to possibly purchase from Highways the parcel of land on Old School Lane and the creation of a proper designated resident car parking area possibly with the addition of a public EV charging provision, was also at the November meeting given a positive response. But we now have to await feedback from Bucks Highways as to whether they would sell the land and the practicalities of creating such a feature at this location.

The selling of land, or more along the lines of purchasing land, was also something on the November meeting agenda, in that it was agreed that the Parish Council would approach the land owner for the fenced off area at the entrance to Mount Pleasant with a view to creating a further Village Green. This would certainly enhance the look in this part of the village, and given there is a very low likelihood that this small parcel of land could ever be developed, with two previous planning applications having been refused, hopefully the owner may consider selling and at a non-unreasonable price. Our clerk has sent a letter to the land owner expressing our interest in a possible purchase and we now have to await to see what develops.

In case you haven't seen it on social media, the Buckinghamshire Household Recycling Centre is to be closed for maintenance works from the 1<sup>st</sup> Dec for a period of up to 14 weeks, but thankfully the also similarly planned maintenance closure of the Aylesbury Centre for the 12<sup>th</sup> Jan has now been rescheduled for some time in Sept 2026. In order to assist households, Bucks Council will be making available for collection from some of their public buildings, additional branded waste sacks which can be placed alongside your normal waste collection bins. But now some good news in that we have learnt that Bucks Council have reached an agreement whereby for the duration of the closure, Bucks Residents will be able to use the MK waste recycling centres at both Bleak Hall and New Bradwell. The standard MKCC advance booking procedure will still apply. It had previously been agreed by your Parish Council that we would over a period of time both revamp and possibly replace our bus shelters. The shelters near the Dolphin PH and that on the corner of Bragenham Side have recently been repaired and re-

stained by 'The Men in Sheds' team, so should be good for a further few years, but we

still have the rather tired and not very attractive or in keeping shelter on the Fenny Road. At our November PC meeting it was agreed that our Clerk would investigate the costs and design options for the supply and installation of a new timber based shelter. The shelter would have to be Highways compliant as regards the design and its construction, but hopefully we will have some options to consider early in the New Year.

For October PC Meeting held on the evening of the 7<sup>th</sup> we were joined by 7 Members of the public (MoP) with an apology for absence by Cllr David Venn, and yet again no attendance by one of our two Unitary Councillors, and as for other than normal monthly items, the main points of interest were:

- The Council had to consider what comments if any they wanted to make in regard to the Bucks Draft Local Plan, with a deadline to make these by the 29<sup>th</sup> October. After some lengthy discussions and noting that the draft document does not detail any specific sites for possible future development, It was decided that Councillors would each review and that a combined response would be agreed and submitted by the deadline date.
- The matter of S106 Sports & Leisure funds accumulated from new home developments in our Parish and how these could be best used in our community were debated. It was felt that improvements and modernisation of facilities offered by the likes of the Sports Club and the Community Centre were certainly areas worthy of further investigation. It was agreed the Parish Council would arrange meetings with both organisations to discuss what may be feasible and of most benefit.
- The Community Funding application from the Sports Club for the sum of £350 towards the purchase of fireworks for their public display in November was unanimously supported (and what a fabulous display it was).
- PCSO Tina Hobson presented the latest crime figures for Newton Leys and Stoke Hammond for the period 1<sup>st</sup> September through to the 7<sup>th</sup> October, which were as follows:

Suspicious vehicle x1 Theft x2 Road related incident x3 (including bypass) Drug offences x1 Anti-social behaviour x3

Tina also mentioned about the loud motorbike that travels repeatedly through the village. The police know who owns the bike, but unless it has actually been modified, there isn't much that can be done, but the owner will be visited by the police in Bedfordshire.

For the Parish Council meeting in November on the 4<sup>th</sup> held at the Newton Leys Pavilion we were at last joined by one of our unitary ward councillors, namely Caroline Cornell plus 2 MoP. We were down to 5 councillors due to illness and holidays. Details of the single planning application that was before the council and their decision and comments can be found in the Planning Applications section, and as for other items of interest discussed, these were:

- Despite the PC increasing the number of times the waste bin outside the shop
  was emptied on a weekly basis, it could still be found to be overflowing with
  litter laying on the surrounding grassed area. It was agreed that the PC would
  purchase and install a second matching waste bin in this location.
- It has been reported that the streetlight at the entrance to Church Rd is malfunctioning, and this matter has now been passed to our contractor.

- Due to legislation requirements a new IT policy had to be implemented, and the newly produced document was approved.
- The Council were asked to consider a quotation from Ethos Consultant to carry out a road safety assessment in Stoke Hammond, but the majority felt this was a lot of money to spend when the chances of Bucks Highways agreeing to or covering the costs of any such recommendations would be extremely unlikely.
- A proposal to sow wildflowers along the grass verges to the Fenny Road was well received, and it was agreed that our clerk would make contact with the Head of Highways to establish the next steps.

As the Council do not normally hold a meeting in December, the next PC Meeting is due to be held on the evening of Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> January, starting at 7.30pm with the venue being the Newton Leys Pavilion. One might notice that this is the second rather than the normal first Tuesday of the month, but because of the festive season and the associated bank holidays, it makes it impractical and not possible to produce and publish the meeting agenda within the prescribed statuary time frame. The February PC Meeting will be back to the first Tuesday evening of the month.

In closing may the Parish Council wish all our parishioners a fabulous and Merry Christmas and all the very best for the New Year.



## Stoke Hammond and Newton Leys South Neighbourhood Plan Update

I'm pleased to report the examiner has completed his review of our Neighbourhood Plan. The purpose was to ensure it is an acceptable fit with the Basic Conditions covered by the National Planning Process Framework (NPPF) and suitable to be put to a Local Referendum. He has sent the following recommendation to Bucks Council:-

#### Summary

- 5.1 The Stoke Hammond Neighbourhood Plan has been duly prepared in compliance with the procedural requirements. My examination has investigated whether the Plan meets the Basic Conditions and other legal requirements for neighbourhood plans. I have had regard for all the responses made following consultation on the Neighbourhood Plan and the evidence documents submitted with it.
- 5.2 I have made recommendations to modify a number of policies and text to ensure the Plan meets the Basic Conditions and other legal requirements. I recommend that the Plan, once modified, proceeds to referendum.

#### The Referendum and its Area

5.3 I have considered whether or not the referendum area should be extended beyond the designated area to which the Plan relates. The Stoke Hammond Neighbourhood Plan as modified has no policy or proposals which I consider significant enough to have an impact beyond the designated Neighbourhood Plan boundary, requiring the referendum to extend to areas beyond the Plan boundary. I recommend that the boundary for the purposes of any future referendum on the Plan should be the boundary of the designated Neighbourhood Plan Area.

## Stoke Hammond and Newton Leys South Neighbourhood Plan Update Cont/d

#### Overview

5.4 It is evident that a considerable amount of time and effort has been devoted to the development and production of this Plan and I congratulate those who have been involved. The Plan should prove to be a useful tool for future planning and change in Stoke Hammond over the coming years.

The amendments recommended have been accepted by the Parish Council as none are deemed detrimental to the key policy areas within the plan.

Whilst we are still waiting for Bucks Councils confirmation that we can move to the final referendum stage, I think it appropriate to congratulate and thank all the steering group members whose contributions over the last 3 years have resulted in this positive outcome.

The process moving forward is that Bucks Council should publish the final plan and arrange a referendum of all Stoke Hammond Parishioners. If the referendum respondents return greater than 50% in favour of adopting the plan then it will become a formal part of the Bucks planning policies, specifically for the Stoke Hammond Parish which all developers must take into account when making development proposals. It's very important that parishioners take the opportunity to partake in the referendum when it occurs. The Parish Council will ensure that it is advertised widely once a date is known.





#### Hi there,

This month, I had the privilege of representing Buckingham and Bletchley at Westminster's Garden of Remembrance, where I placed a poppy stake on behalf of our community. It was a humbling moment to reflect on the sacrifices of those who served. Back home, I joined commemorations in Bletchley and laid wreaths across the towns, villages, and city that make up our area.

And yesterday I spoke in the Chamber regarding Bletchley Station's eastern entrance and will follow up in a meeting with Ministers. You can read more on my website why I think it is vital to link the station directly to the heart of town.

You may have also seen in the news that there are delays to East West Rail opening. I know this is frustrating. Like you, I want a train line that works in the interests of local people. I promise I will share an update when I have one.

Elsewhere, there have been some important developments you may have missed:

- Women can now access the morning-after pill free at high-street pharmacies.
- New DVSA rules will ban bots and third-party resellers.
- The UK will phase out key animal tests by 2026 and reduce dog and primate studies by 2030.

Sometimes these stories get lost in the 24-hour news cycle (which in reality now feels closer to two hours), so I wanted to highlight small but significant changes - for both people and animals.

Finally, huge congratulations to Mowgli's at The Bell Inn in Beachampton for its awardwinning Indian cuisine, and to The Pilgrim in North Marston for its Good Food Guide recognition and outstanding community spirit. Both venues showcase the very best of Buckinghamshire hospitality - well worth a visit!

and central government are responsible for. This will include government departments (e.g. Department for Work and Pensions, or the Home Office). I can also write to senior officials or Ministers in government departments and agencies.

My team and I will try to help in any way that we can, but some issues fall outside of the remit of a Member of Parliament. If your case relates to matters which either Milton Keynes City Council or Buckinghamshire Council are responsible for. I encourage you to seek support from your elected ward councillors in the first instance – this will include housing, parking, waste collection and planning.

I'm afraid that I cannot help you fill an application form for benefits or housing, or with legal problems. I also cannot write to private individuals (for example, your neighbours) on your behalf.

**Strict parliamentary protocol dictates that MPs can only assist their own constituents.** Please check that your postcode falls within the Buckingham and Bletchley constituency before coming along.








#### STOKE HAMMOND BOOK CLUB


18<sup>th</sup> January 9.30am Café church: This is our simplest introduction to church: great

## PLANNING APPLICATION NEWS & UPDATES OCT – NOV 2025



In this section you will find details of planning applications received, comments made by your Parish Council, and any updates on previous planning applications.

## **NEW PLANNING APPLICATIONS:**

PL/25/3492/FA – Burnell Farm Cottage, Drayton Road, Stoke Hammond MK17 0ED Proposed additional storey and single storey side extension.

Clrs resolved to OBJECT to this application, as they felt the proposed additional storey would be overbearing in nature and not in keeping with other properties in the area.

## **PLANNING UPDATES:**

Apologies, this is one we missed as the application was originally made in May 2022 and was approved without any notification to the Parish Council on the 19<sup>th</sup> June of this year.

**22/01744/APP** The Mellows (to the rear of Harrup Close), Stoke Hammond MK17 9DH Erection of two dwellings, parking and proposed new vehicular access.

Your Parish Council originally objected to this application back in August 2022, citing for reasons such as:

The plans show that the two houses are proposed to be built where the attenuation pond and overflow was going in for drainage to service the already approved 16 new homes. Being 2½ story houses, the design is not in keeping with the rest of the development in this conservation area.

In association with the 16 homes that are already agreed (16/03698/AOP), these two further houses would effectively mean 18 new homes (or 17 if you take into consideration that Latrigg will be knocked down), and provision should therefore be made for affordable housing.

Environmental concerns over the 43 trees the applicant wants to take down. The roof windows will likely overlook into the frontage and gardens of the houses in Harrup Close.

In their decision, Bucks Planning/Council stated that because they cannot demonstrate a 5-year land supply for new homes they are operating in what is known as a tilted Balance which effectively allows then to override normal planning parameters and constraints including the provision of affordable homes and they also felt the design of the homes was not out of keeping with those surrounding and would not adversely overlook nearby homes. The tree officer felt there would not be an adverse impact on the existing trees. As regards the attenuation pond this has since be relocated to another area on the development site.

Just a reminder that Buckinghamshire Council have recently updated their planning website, so that the previous 4 separate planning regions have now been combined into one single system. However, this only applies to applications submitted after the 8<sup>th</sup> August 2025. For applications before this date, you will have to select 'View applications we received before 8 August 2025 on our existing Aylesbury Vale System'.
