PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

Hopefully, you will be reading this edition of the SH & NLS news before the Village Show taking place on the afternoon of Saturday 7th August from 1pm-6pm. It's going to be a great way of celebrating and getting together now that we're out of lockdown. One must say a big thankyou to the Village Show Committee and their band of volunteers for putting on such a great event, which takes a massive amount of organisation and work to put together. But the other reason for mentioning the show is that your Parish Council will be hosting a stall to allow you the Parishioners to meet with your Councillors in an informal setting and get an insight into past, current and future projects, plus ask questions that have been nagging with you but you've not had an opportunity to put to your council.

We are all very much aware that Gigaclear are in our village, and will be for some weeks yet, but please be assured that we have very much been in constant communication with Gigaclear, to try and ensure the least possible disruption and inconvenience to our parishioners. This may not always be evident by things such as non-working traffic lights and grass verges unable to be cut because of signage and barriers, but as soon as an issue is brought to our attention, our hard working and brilliant clerk, is straight on the case.

We are a very new council, so over the last month or so many of us have been attending various training courses and will continue to do so, to ensure that we can be proficient and more fully understanding of what we can and cannot do as a Parish Council and the correct and most effective methodology to achieve the results that will benefit our parish.

Whilst Planning matters can be found in the separate 'Planning Applications' section elsewhere in this edition of the SH & NLS News and although not actually within our parish, the Landfill Site in Newton Leys does very much affect us all. Councillor Stephen McNally in his Newton Leys South News, provides greater detail, but basically the Public Inquiry into the application to extend the operation for the use of the site till 2037 was quickly adjourned as the Inspector deemed further up to date assessments were required.

For those of you who are Facebook users, you will of course have seen the posts concerning The Dolphin PH and the Fenny Road layby, both of which are very much being led by our new Unitary Ward Councillor, Phil Gomm. We as a council have for a very long time being campaigning to try and get the dismal mess that is the layby addressed, but whilst it is within our parish, the land is owned by Buckinghamshire Highways, who are at last recognising that something needs to be done. We have also been putting pressure on the Canals River Trust to exercise more control over the moorings of the boating community, who should in fact moor on the opposing side of the canal which is a legitimate canal path mooring area. If as Councillor Gomm is suggesting, this layby area could be turned into a more pleasant setting with no moored boats or caravans, but something to use as an attractive canal side recreation area, then we suspect the majority of the parish would be in favour of that. We will keep you advised of progress.

With regard to the Dolphin and whilst we are extremely supportive of seeing our village having their pub back, this is not a Parish Council project, and if successful would be a Community Project very similar to The Stag in nearby Mentmore. We have of yet not been consulted on the project, but would certainly let our opinion and voices be known if the need arises.

It was all quite surreal returning to the Community Centre for our July PC Meeting held on Tuesday 6th July, as we had not been there for some 16 months. We were joined by 5 members of the public and Unitary Ward Councillor, Phil Gomm.

Councillor Gomm did run through the current status on the aforementioned Fenny Road layby along with other Buckingham Council matters.

Other items of interest from the meeting were as follows:

- A member of the public asked what was happening about the planting of a new tree to replace that felled on the Green. This had been the subject of a poll, which determined the residents were in favour of such a replacement and indeed this had previously been agreed by the PC. We had however been advised by our tree specialist that the best time to plant a semi mature tree would be the latter end of the year and so we will program for that to be done.
- Another member of the public wanted the badly overgrown state and poor surface of
 the bridleway that runs down to Bletchley from opposite Dorcas Lane brought to our
 attention. The responsibility for keeping the undergrowth clear but not the
 maintenance of the surface or fencing does lie with the PC under their Devolved
 Services agreement. It was agreed the PC would ask their contractor to carry out an
 assessment and report back to the PC with their recommendations.
- The matter of the land adjacent to the Community Centre on Bragenham Side is an ongoing project subject to new consultation with Parishioners, but on the advice of Councillor Gomm that we are allowed to create a new field gate entrance with a public side gate, the PC agreed to instigate this asap. It would seem however, from quotations received, that the current shortage of building materials will govern the timescale for getting these works done. It was also agreed to increase for the summer months the cutting of the grass to this land from every four weeks to fortnightly.
- Councillor Franzine Sharkey was elected as the Parish Council's representative to the Stoke Hammond Community Association (SHCA), and it was at this point that Councillor Greg Noble also chair of the SHCA advised, that the approach road and pavement to the Community Centre that leads off Bragenham Side was going to be resurfaced from Monday 16th August with the works expected to last for two days. For the duration of the works both the Centre and the adjoining playground would need be closed to the public.

The next PC meeting is scheduled for 7.30pm on Tuesday 7th September to allow our councillors to have a bit of a break for August, but we are still around and available should any important matters arise. This September meeting will be held at the Community Centre, Bragenham Side.

Update on fighting coronavirus in Buckinghamshire



16 July 2021

Dear Resident,

By now I think that we are all aware that on Monday (19 July), England will move to the final stage of the roadmap for unlocking and all current laws and restrictions around Covid will be lifted.

I am certain that when this was being planned the Government had not fully anticipated the rapid increase in infection rates. This has been due predominantly to the ease of transmission of the so-called 'Delta variant'. The infection rate in Buckinghamshire has increased significantly to 248 per 100,000. However, for those over 60 years the rate is far lower at 38.1 (51 cases). It would appear that the vaccination programme has been a major factor in the lower infection rate and the potential for serious illness amongst the older and most vulnerable groups. Hospitalisation rates also remain low with Buckinghamshire Hospital trust having 10 patients with Covid in the latest data.

You can get the latest data on Buckinghamshire at the <u>Covid dashboard</u> on our website.

On balance the Government's view is that this is the best time, during the summer months, to allow some return to a more normal life. This involves a shift away from laws and rules towards us all making personal choices about how to manage the risk both for yourselves and, importantly, for others.

Next Monday will not feel like a big release for everyone and some people will find this next step worrying, particularly after such a long period of legal restrictions. We are expecting the Government to update the guidance for people who are Clinically Extremely Vulnerable in the coming days. So please keep thinking of others and how we all still need to work together to keep everyone safe.

For that reason, I will personally be continuing to respect requests to wear a face covering in busy indoor spaces like shops and on public transport. I would also ask that we do not seek to challenge or stigmatise anyone who continues to wear a mask where this is not specifically required as this can be very upsetting for those who remain apprehensive.

I also want to thank everyone for all the effort and sacrifice that's been made since the start of the pandemic, as we move into this new phase of adapting to the virus. None

of us could have imagined what we have collectively been through and I'm incredibly proud of everything the people of Bucks have done, and continue to do, to help their communities and to help stop the spread of the virus.

Guidance from Monday

As we know, the Government is moving from imposing rules and restrictions to issuing guidance on what people should continue to do to stay safe and protect others.

From Monday, some key protections will still remain in place:

- Get a PCR test if you develop Covid symptoms and isolate your household while you wait for the results.
- Isolate if you test positive for Covid or if contacted by NHS Test and Trace.
- Government expects and recommends that people continue to wear face coverings in crowded areas such as on public transport.
- While the work from home instruction is being lifted, a gradual return to the workplace over summer is expected and recommended.
- Government is encouraging more use of the NHS Covid Pass in high risk settings (you can get this via the <u>NHS App</u>, which is different to the <u>NHS Covid-19 app</u>).

Overall, the Government is still strongly advising people to really think carefully about minimising the number, proximity and duration of social contacts and to try to meet outside or where you can let plenty of fresh air in.

Vaccinations

It was very reassuring to hear again this week from the Government scientists about the overwhelming evidence that the vaccines are continuing to weaken the link between infection and serious illness and death. We know having two doses of the Covid vaccine is the best way to protect yourself and others from the risks of Covid-19 and with restrictions lifting on Monday and the current rise in cases, it's more important than ever to get your vaccine. If you haven't had your first jab yet, or are due your second, please arrange it as soon as possible. Currently, the NHS advises an eightweek gap between doses.

673,777 vaccine doses have now been administered in Buckinghamshire. Anyone aged 18 or over is eligible for a Covid-19 vaccine and, as ever, you can book both doses through the NHS national booking system. Please call 119 if you can't book online.

Drop-in Pfizer clinics this weekend

Please be aware of our drop-in vaccine clinics – which make it really quick and easy to get your first or second dose with no need for an appointment. There's a Pfizer clinic today (Friday) and tomorrow (Saturday) at Wycombe Library, 8:30am – 5:30pm both

days. So anyone aged 18 or over can get a first dose here, or second dose if their first dose was already Pfizer.

And there's more 'drop-in' vaccine clinics at Stoke Mandeville Stadium (9.30am – 7.30pm, every day until at least Sunday (18 July), again offering the Pfizer vaccine. Finally, the 'Health on the Move' vaccine van is back in Bucks visiting Aylesbury, Wycombe, Gerrards Cross and Chesham. You can get first or second jabs here without an appointment (please leave an 8-week gap between doses).

Timings and venues for drop-in clinics may be subject to last minute changes to the schedule, so please check the <u>CCG (Clinical Commissioning Group) website</u> for the latest updates, and for other local vaccine information.

Testing

Covid testing will continue to be an important part of keeping us all safe. I know there's a lot of different information and messages out there about testing so I just wanted to underline the basics of which test to get, when, and how to access Covid testing in Buckinghamshire:

- If you have Covid symptoms, <u>book a PCR test via the national site</u>. PCR tests
 can be ordered by phone or online and can be delivered direct to you, or you
 can visit a local testing site.
- If you've been asked to isolate by NHS Test and Trace as a contact, you can book a PCR test – but a negative test result does not remove the need to selfisolate.
- If you don't have Covid symptoms you can use rapid tests, known as Lateral Flow Tests (LFTs), to regularly check whether you might have Covid. The easiest way to do a rapid test is with a home-testing kit which can be picked up from pharmacies or <u>ordered online</u>.
- You can find out more about <u>accessing rapid tests on our website</u>.

Please remember that if you are on a low income and have been asked to isolate, you may be able to claim a £500 support payment – go to the Government's website to find out more.

Silverstone - British Grand Prix

The British Grand Prix is on at Silverstone this weekend (15-18 July) with a capacity crowd expected. This is because the event is part of the Government's Event Research Programme so stringent measures are being followed and information and advice is available for local people on the Silverstone website.

Even though it's not in entirely Buckinghamshire, we know large events at Silverstone do have an impact on our local communities and of course, it's an event many of our residents are likely to be attending – obviously you should only go to Silverstone if you have a ticket and please be mindful that the event takes place before the final easing of

STOKE HAMMOND BOOK CLUB







At last, we were able to hold our monthly meeting and it was good to see everyone. As a bonus we were delighted to welcome two new members to the Group.

The book we read during June was The Heart of the Matter by Graham Greene. The Novel won much acclaim but our opinions were mixed.

The story is set in a small British Colonial outpost in Sierra Leone during World War 11. The main character is Major Henry Scobie, a pious and righteous man who, when passed over for promotion feels he has let himself down and more particularly failed his unhappy wife. He eventually has money worries leading to a single indiscretion which

gradually escalates in to a list of moral dilemmas for him culminating in tragedy.

Everyone agreed that it was, of course, well written and one of our group made the interesting point that the main character - Scobie - was Greene describing himself. He wrote the book following his wartime service with MI6 so was well connected with his subject. Greene was apparently a rather cold character who had gone through tough times in his life resulting in a lack of interest in people or their wellbeing, possibly a loveless marriage to a devout Catholic and his own struggle with Catholicism all of which added to his general character and consequently, it is felt, that of Scobie.

The comment was made by one of the group that they liked Scobie to start with but went off him as the book progressed. it was also described as 'hard going' and it was thought that several other characters were more deserving of sympathy than Scobie. Descriptions of West African countryside were appreciated and praise came from one of our members who said that she found this book different from many Graham Greene novels with the politics and catholic church information interesting. Summing up - worth the effort of 'staying with it'.

Our new book for the coming month is something completely different - 'The Go-Between' by L.P. Hartley.

NEWS FROM NEWTON LEYS SOUTH (NLS)



Hello Again,

Big news this month is that the Public Inquiry into the planning application to extend the life of the landfill to 2037 was adjourned shortly after the meeting started on the 6th July, the inspector stated that there

was no up to date Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA), there was only the original EIA from when the original planning application was made. There was also a question on section 73 of the Town and Country planning Act 1990, whether the application should be a new planning application or an extension to the old planning application. This is still being debated.

The inspector will be visiting Newton Leys on the 20th July to view the landfill site, Jersey drive and the issues on the amenities and the local area. The EIA will be completed by 24th July and the hearing will be moved to 19th October 2021. Hopefully we will get the result that we are hoping for.

It was good to see football flags during the euros and you could hear the screams across the development during the final, same old result I am afraid.

The Stoke Hammond Village show will be taking place on the 7th August from 1pm to 6pm, there will be lots of information in this newsletter, but I hope you will be able to attend, there will be a stall at the show where you can meet the Parish Council and discuss any issues you may have.



PAGEY'S SOW & GROW "PATCH"



Well summer has really arrived at last. The sun is beating down and I am cremating anything I can get my hands on onto the BBQ. The factor 50 cream is on, the beer is in my hand and Greg has reminded me to please do my "tips". First tip....hide when Greg comes round — only kidding Greg.

Well August and September are really high points as you see your veg grow and consume those delicious home grown fruits, roots and leaves. Sure, some of your early plants have finished blooming (my sweet Williams this year have been spectacular) but we have dahlias, lavetera, clary blue, lilies, poppies, rudbeckia, asters etc delivering colour for ages yet.

Whether it is plants or fruit and veg we have to keep watering and feeding. For veg the tubas or fruits are all water and so need to be looked after - every

day in the hot period. Cucumbers, melons, squash, peppers, chillies, tomatoes etc love and need water and feeding with a tomato liquid feed (every 10 days). But a word of warning in that irregular watering can cause fruits to split - even potatoes can split. If it hasn't rained for a couple of weeks the ground will be hard and the water will run off



and not get to the tender roots, so little and often is key. Also tomatoes will develop blossom end rot if they are not watered every day, which is a hard black bottom (that's right!) to the fruit - ugly and inedible. Pick the fruits as they ripen and don't be afraid to cut back long trailing cucumber or squash vines. With tomatoes, cut off the lower leaves as they start to wrinkle up and sow a few basil seeds or lettuce seeds in the pot or ground underneath the foliage. Nothing goes better with a Tom than basil.

There is still time to sow salad crops of radish and lettuce as well as herbs, dill, coriander and parsley. Kept moist you will have an abundance of fresh herbs through to late autumn. If you had strawberries make sure you peg down the runners for new plants next year AND start to collect seeds for next year. I have great fun keeping seeds from peppers, chillies, tomatoes, squash, melons, cucumbers etc for next year's crop. I am asked what variety they are but it was so long ago I can't remember so I respond with a

yellow one (pepper) or large one (tomato) or outdoor one (melon). You get



the gist. Same with flowers - collect the sweet Williams, poppies, Malva, clary blue, dahlia seeds. sweet peas etc. Do they always come back exactly the same as the parent? No, they don't, but hey who cares.

So, water, dead head, eat produce and collect seeds ...oh and enjoy the sun!

By way of the fact they had constructed the entrance road and the foundations to one of the new homes. The PC deemed that this was a correct statement of facts so had no reason to object to this application.

21/02508/APP Orchard End, Hillersdon Chase, Stoke Hammond MK17 9DH

Demolition of existing garage and erection of new dwelling and garage.

The PC felt that this was an over development of the site and that the parking area did not provide sufficient space for the turning of vehicles, which would lead to reversing onto Hillesden Chase. The PC resolved to oppose this application.

21/02398/APP Orchard End, Hillersdon Chase, Stoke Hammond MK17 9DH

Proposed swimming pool and pool building.

The PC had no objection to this planning application

First floor extension over double garage.

The application has been refused, as it was considered to be of an unacceptable scale, bulk and massing which would have a detrimental impact upon the neighbouring dwelling.

21/00718/COUAR Barn at Bragenham Side, Stoke Hammond MK17 9DB

Determination as to whether prior approval is required in respect of transport & highway impact, noise, contamination risk, flooding and locational considerations for the conversion of agricultural barn into one dwelling house (Class Q(a)) and in relation to design and external appearance of the buildings (Class Q(b))

The application has been refused, as it was deemed that amount and scale of the proposed work and change of materials was more akin to the construction of a new residential dwelling in open countryside rather than the conversion of an agricultural building.

21/00045/APP Orchard End, Hillersdon Chase, Stoke Hammond MK17 9DH

Demolition of existing garage and the erection of a new garage building. *The application has been approved.*

20/01633/APP Stoke Hose Farm, Stoke Road, Stoke Hammond MK17 9DB

Erection of ancillary residential annex and separate car port.

Originally refused in August 2020 on the grounds this would be the construction of a new dwelling in open countryside, the applicant appealed against the decision, but the inspectorate on the 22 June 21 upheld the original refusal and dismissed the appeal.


